

Symbols for Headstones and their Meanings

Anchor - Steadfast hope Arch - Rejoined with partner in Heaven Birds - The soul Cherub - Divine wisdom or justice Column - Noble life Broken column - Early death Conch shell - Wisdom Cross, anchor and Bible - Trials, victory and reward Crown - Reward and glory Dolphin - Salvation, bearer of souls to Heaven Dove - Purity, love and Holy Spirit Evergreen - Eternal life Garland - Victory over death Gourds - Deliverance from grief Hands - A relation or partnership Heart - Devotion Horseshoe - Protection against evil Hourglass - Time and its swift flight

Linwood Cemetery History From Council Records

Aug. 31, 1863 - Resolved that the Commission on the Cemetery be instructed to have the streets in the new cemetery opened and cleared - the trees to be grabbed up by the roots, so as to present no obstacle to the passage of the hearse and carriages.

Oct. 26, 1863 - The Commission on Cemetery would recommend that the fencing around the Cemetery be white washed, with two good coats of white wash...instructed to have work done forthwith.

Feb. 7, 1876 - Ordinance adopted in relation to the Cemetery: "No dog shall be allowed to enter the Cemetery enclosure and any person or persons allowing their dog to enter the Cemetery shall be fined in a sum not less than \$5.00 or more than \$20.00, or suffer such other punishment as the Mayor in his discretion may inflict; and it shall be the duty of the Sexton to inform persons visiting the grounds of this ordinance and also to report all violations of the same."

April 2, 1877- Resolved that no trash or lot cleanings be allowed to be thrown into the streets of the Cemetery from the 21^{st} to the 27^{th} of the month.

April 6, 1881 - "Whereas the enlargement of our cemetery is a matter of desperate importance to our citizens and the present seems to present a favorable opportunity for the same, therefore: Resolve that the Cemetery Committee be authorized to purchase the house and lands of S. S. Cowdrey adjoining the cemetery upon the best terms they can for the city- the price in no case to exceed seven thousand dollars." Adopted

Please Note:

As of April 1st, 2010; any real or artificial flowers will be removed on a regular basis. This effort will insure that Linwood Cemetery is well kept, in remembrance and respect of our loved ones.
