Dear Friends,

To witness to a person of another race or language used to involve traveling a long way. In recent years millions have come from other countries to America for work and education. Walking through the aisles of Wal-Mart you

can hear many languages spoken. How can we witness to these people?

Mel West, Founder of PET, an organization we help support, recently wrote this article:

I am always interested in what persons in other lands think of us in the USA. A great opportunity came when a friend of mine with university connections brought a Chinese journalism student to tour PET and interview me. He went back to China and wrote a long and published article about us. Here is just a small part of that translation: "When I was in America I lived in a small town of 100,000 people. It was said that there were over 100 churches in town. All the Americans we knew were Christians and loved to help others. When we ran into trouble we always sought help from people we knew in churches. Once I left my wallet in a restroom. Before I knew it was lost, someone had brought it to my classroom and delivered it to me."

"Americans volunteer at home and abroad. Personal Energy Transportation (PET), a charity, specializes in making simplified wheelchairs for people everywhere in the world unable to walk, free of charge. I asked Mr. West why they did it. The old man who used to be a minister brought forward three reasons. 'First, Jesus Christ says in the Bible that we should help those who suffer. Second, as human beings we should help each other. Third, I was once a farmer and we always took very good care of sick cattle—-why can't we lend a helping hand to the handicapped if we can treat our cattle so well?' As a man from China, I came to understand that the cross on a church building in America is more that a symbol. It is a way of life."

I'm glad this man from China went home with such a positive view of America and Christians. May we pray for opportunities to show those from other lands how we live as Christians and why our faith in Christ is so important.



Aahh February! Although short in days, it still has plenty of long evenings just right for settling in with a good book. This month the featured books offer a bit of variety in both subject matter and age appeal.

Hal Haralson, minister-turned-country lawyer, has a wealth of insight to share in <u>Gentle Mercies</u> -<u>Stories of Faith in Faded Blue Jeans</u>. His many and varied experiences with parishioners, clients, family and other fellow travelers along life's way make for entertaining and insightful reading. He truly epitomizes taking life's experiences and seeing them as part of God's master plan, and is an exceptional storyteller.

For the young sports fan, Tim Tebow - Though My Eyes, A Quarterback's Journey tells the story of the fiercely competitive yet committed young Christian who won the Heisman trophy while playing for the University of Florida. Known for the scripture reference he would wear on his eye black, each chapter begins with a Bible verse that specifically applied and provided guidance to Tim during each phase of his life. After playing in the NFL Tebow recently joined the staff at ESPN as an analyst. Here's a quote which addresses the ups and downs of his life: "I don't know what the future holds but I know who holds my future. That's what gives me hope and peace and what I lean on. I know that no matter what happens, there's a plan for it, and even though I don't understand it all and why things happen the way they do, I know that one day it will all make sense as a part of God's plan." (p. 193) Tebow's goal of always finishing strong resounds throughout the book and provides an encouraging message to readers.

Does life sometimes seem a bit confusing and frustrating as you try to figure out your way to grown-up independence? Meet 12-going on 20year old Lily Robbins in the <u>Young Women of</u> <u>Faith - Lily Series</u> by Nancy Rue. The library has <u>Lily the Rebel</u>, <u>Rough and Rugged Lily</u>, and <u>Lily's</u> <u>Passport to Paris</u>. A dedicated journaler, true blue member of the Girlz Club and firm believer in her need to have a personal relationship with God, Lily works her way through the big and little struggles of growing up. Tween readers will find Lily to be an inspiriting friend.
