GENERAL MEETING

MARCH 9, 2021/Board Meeting/6:53-:58 PM Attendees

19 in person and 11 virtual attendance

The meeting was called to order at 6:53 pm by President Jennifer Massey at Better To Gather and via Zoom. Business:

The first order of business was to approve the February 1 General Membership Meeting Minutes. Amber confirmed with Dina that a change was needed in the minutes. The PSI Program didn't end in 2006 as was written in the minutes. It was moved and seconded to approve the minutes with the correction. Motion was approved ...

Helen gave a positive update on the Leadership Conference. There were 124 attendees and 10 speakers in attendance. We made a \$14,000 profit. Many post conference surveys were filled out. 100% said they would recommend our conference. A total of 93% thought that the event was extremely organized or very organized. The speakers were the most liked part of the conference. Our app was user friendly and worked well with Zoom. The speakers were engaging, had a cohesive message of leadership, and 100% of attendees believed that this conference will have a positive impact on our community. We also had 3 women interested in joining the JLB.

3. Dana, the Nominating Chair, gave a very encouraging speech to garner interest in self nominations for the board of directors. Dana shared that she has grown personally as well as professionally by serving on the board. There are currently 10 open board positions and the applications are open until March 16th.

4. Jen introduced our guests for the evening. Vickie Eagle, Colleen Chlapowski, Paige Spalding, and Lynn Mullowney Cabrera are current sustaining members and are all past presidents of the JLB, having served in the early 2000s. Vicki spoke first about Project Youth. It was an umbrella project that included Tumbleweed, First Step House, the Youth Service Initiative with United Way, and Impact Billings. She recommended that each member take advantage of all training opportunities. She was able to serve on other community boards and made connections with other women. Lynn spoke of the relationships she made while in service to the community and with other sustaining members. Lynn told of being a patron of the Wise Penny in her youth and then working shifts there as a JLB member. She was hired for a couple jobs because she had listed being a Junior League member on her resume. Because Lynn often brought her nieces and nephews along with her during various volunteer activities, they had a full work history to put on their resumes. Lynn encouraged our continued work on the Laundry Project as being very impactful to our community. Colleen spoke to us about the Venture into Schools program that the JLB developed in conjunction with Venture Theater. League members volunteered to help bring theater to local students who wouldn't have otherwise had the opportunity to be involved. They even bought a van to carry costumes and volunteers from school to school. The major fundraiser of the time was The Toast of Billings. They even partnered with the Venture Theater one year for entertainment at the event. Colleen said consistency of the Board Members is important. It was also great to be able to see a project thru development and then put into action. While being on the board, you can learn about all of the other positions and

continue to learn new skills in a variety of positions. Lastly, Paige spoke about how joining the JLB about 25 years ago made a lasting impact on her. She learned much through committee work including leadership skills and making lasting friendships. In a brief question and answer session, it was learned that sustaining members think the Laundry Project is a vital need and it is so positive, being and working on the board of directors is teamwork and so much happens in one year, you can learn and grow with all experiences, a nonresponse from sustaining members doesn't mean there is a lack of interest, and please always invite advice from those members who previously served. - Community: Beth told about the Statewide Laundry Day on a. March 27th in partnership with the Junior Leagues of Great Falls and Helena and that the Laundry Angels will go out in April and provide free laundry at random times and places.
- Membership: Jessica reported that we have three new b. members for the Spring 2021 class and training will be happening. There will be a low key happy hour social on March 30th with a virtual option as well. The Placement Matching Tool will be emailed in a couple of weeks. Members will share their strengths and list opportunities they'd like to take advantage of and be placed on the appropriate council for the upcoming year. Members from the Fall of 2020 are eligible to use the Placement Tool. There will also be an in person social in April with a virtual option.

Fund Development: Elizabeth shared that while we are 6. transitioning from MarketPlace Magic to the Leadership Conference, we still have extra funds to raise. There will be a Bingo event in October, run much like the Bingo event at MarketPlace Magic. There will be sponsored games, raffle baskets, ring toss, a catered meal and a cash bar. We hope to incorporate the sustainer luncheon at the Leadership Conference

Communications: Our current social media analytics 7. continue to show growth as well as bringing in new members to the League. We have shared all the Nominating Forms in various ways, thus making it easier to self nominate or to nominate a capable member for a board position. Please contact our council members if you need any support in fillings out the applications. Watch for our new social media campaign and continue to share and spread the good works our League is doing.

President Jennifer Massey adjourned the meeting at 7:58 pm. The next meeting will be held at Better To Gather on April 13th from 6:45-8:00pm.
