## Note #1

Most who study the Battle of Kings Mountain are certainly aware that the Patriot leaders made a smart choice in leaving the “infantry” behind, and for only “able horsemen” to ride on.

What they intuitively “know” – but seem to fail to thoroughly “embrace” is:

**Almost all “officers” had good horses.**

Therefore....

Many Patriot “Captains” had few men, sometimes no men, under their command during the actual battle at Kings Mountain. Most historians refuse to accept that at this important event, there were almost more Patriot officers engaged than militiamen, and that this is significant.

Majors led as few as two (2) Captains, and many who had no men, or only one to five. It was rare, but some Captains did have more than ten men. Few had their original companies at full strength. It will soon be shown that the companies averaged only 5 men.

## Note #2

Although the British seized Charlestown and many officers, and they once again devastated both the SC and NC militia at the Battle of Camden, the Patriots constantly kept rebuilding their militia in both states, and they retained their “semblance of order” by continuing the well-known “regiments” and recognized the leaders of all established militia units.

**Leaders of these well-established and well-known militia regiments agreed to “work with each other” for the common good of all.**

Ever since the start of the war, Captains attached themselves to other regiments when it was convenient. This does not mean they were now in this new regiment and no longer part of their original regiment.

And, since the beginning of the war, whenever a regiment was mustered in “times of stress,” the entire regiment could not be assembled in time to meet the exigency. So, leaders hastily pulled together what men they could, and proceeded with incomplete regiments. In military parlance, these are called “detachments.”

### Note #3

We may never know – for certain – the names of each and every Patriot who truly participated in the Battle of Kings Mountain.

And, we may never know – for certain – the exact “order of battle,” that is, which officers led specific men at a specific location, at the Battle of Kings Mountain.

**But...**

We CAN do better... and we should.

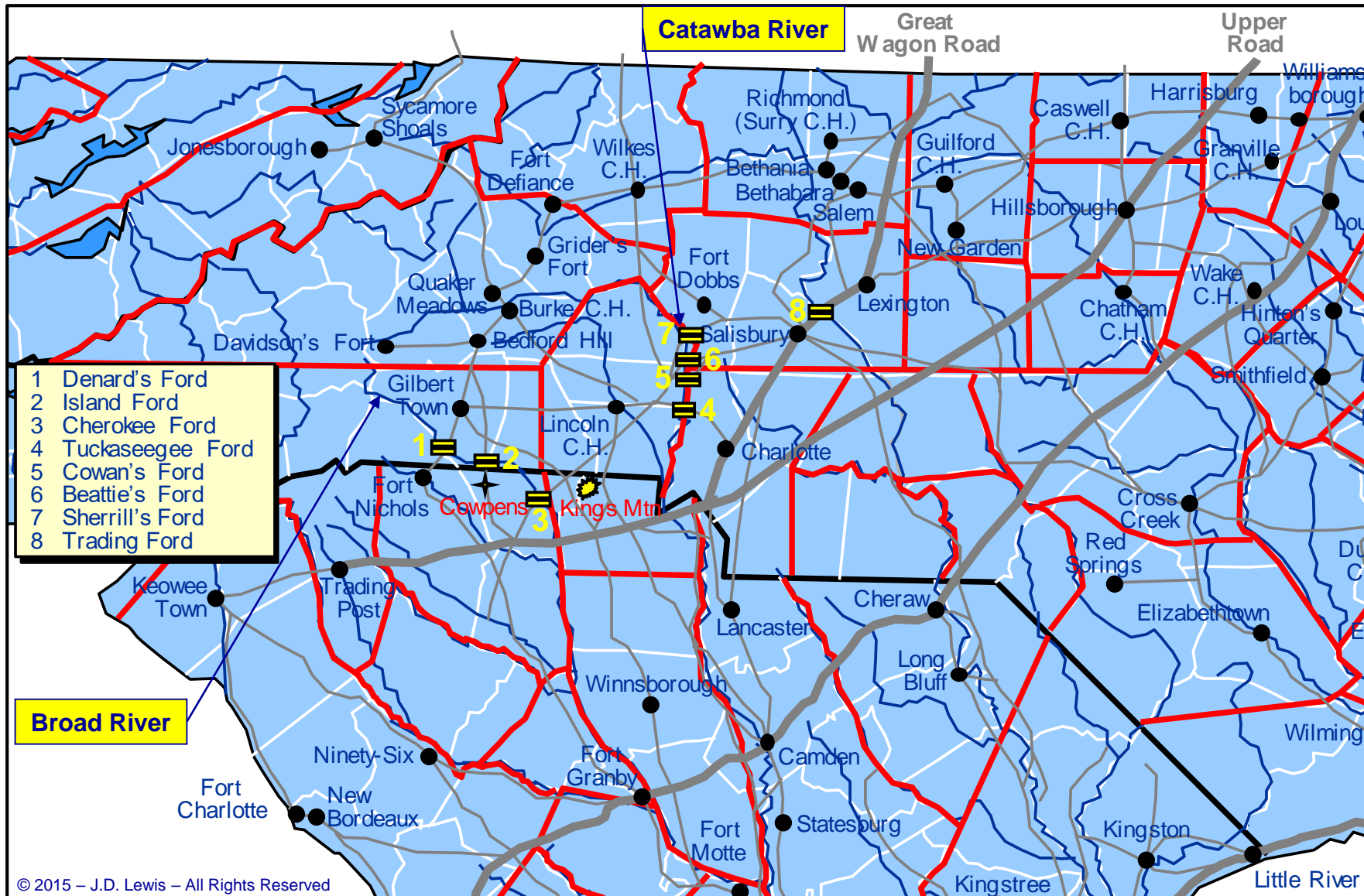

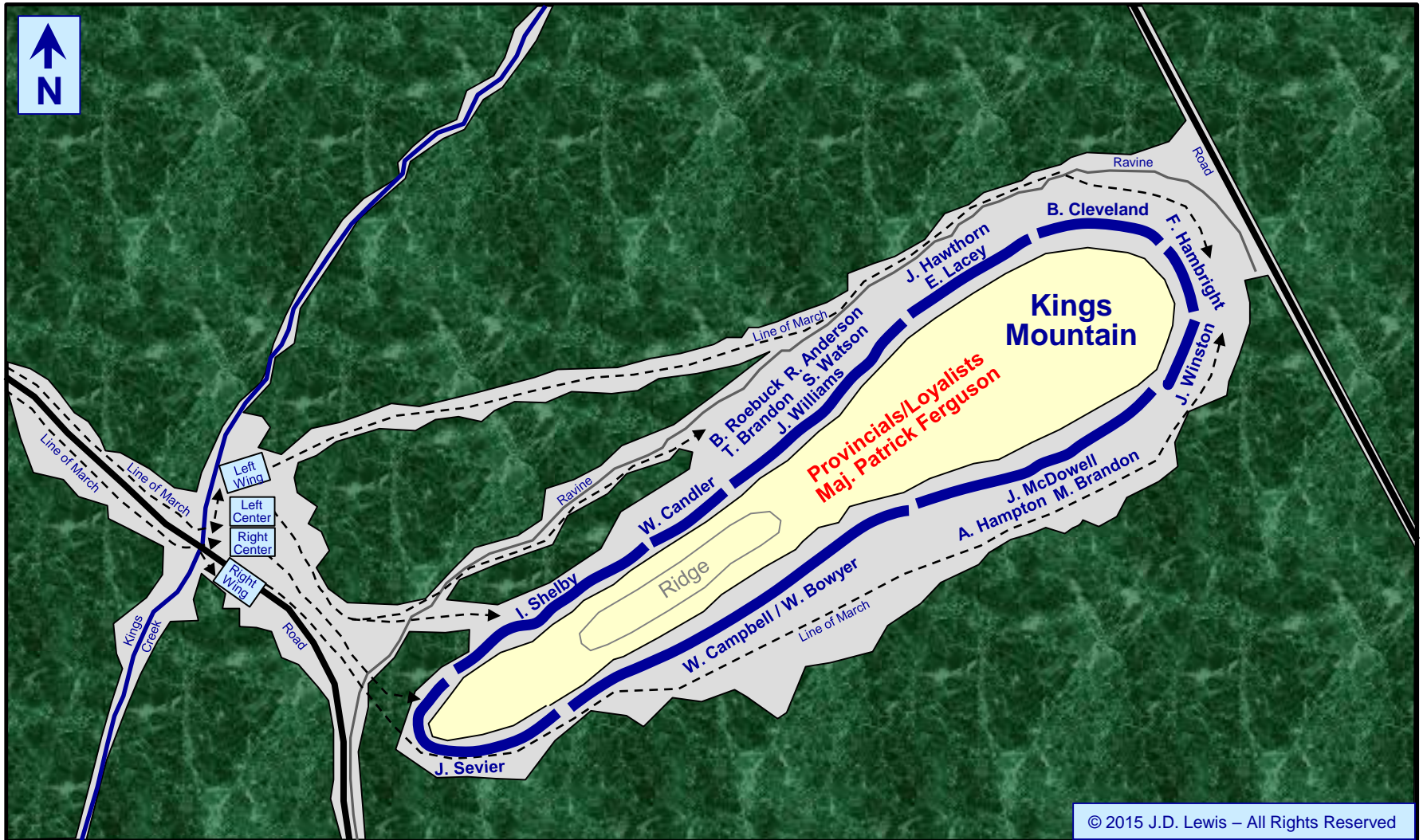


# “Most Likely” Patriot Troop Deployment (1 of 2)

- √ Watkins, George – A freed POW, gave info about the Loyalist camp on top of KM (Moss).
- √ Whelchel, Francis Sr (Dr.) – From what became Union District, SC. A Surgeon at the battle of KM (Moss).

- √ Carroll, Joseph – Widow and others said he was at the battle of KM, no officers named (W9778).
- √ Clinton, James (Lt.) – Moss said he was at the battle of KM, his pension application did not mention the battle of KM (S2437).
- √ Davis, William (Lt.) – Son said he was a Lieutenant at the battle of KM, named no officers (W8653).
- √ Duff, David (killed) – From New Acquisition District, SC. Killed at the battle of KM – per Moss, 1880 Monument, and 1909 Monument.
- √ Elliot, James – Enlisted in New Acquisition District, SC, from what became Chester District. At the battle of Kings Mountain, Captain not named (Moss).
- √ Kanseiar, John – From the New Acquisition District, SC. At the battle of KM, no officers named (Moss).
- √ McCorkle, Abraham – From the New Acquisition District, SC. At the battle of KM, no officers named (Moss).
- √ Moore, Samuel – From what became York District, SC. At the battle of KM, no officers named (Moss).
- √ Ratchford, Joseph (Lt.) – From the New Acquisition District, SC. A Lieutenant at the battle of KM, no officers named by his widow. Probably under Capt. John Henderson (W3866).
- √ Renick, James – From the New Acquisition District. At the battle of KM (probably as a Lieutenant), no officers named (S14262).
- √ Rowan, Benjamin – From the New Acquisition District. At the battle of KM, no officers named (Moss).
- √ Wallace, John – From the New Acquisition District. At the battle of KM, no officers named (S17178).
- √ Watson, Samuel (Lt.) – From the New Acquisition District. A Lieutenant at the battle of KM, no officers named (Moss).

Upper Ninety-Six District Regiment, SC (6)

- √ Carson, Samuel – From the Upper Ninety-Six District. At the battle of KM, no officers named. Possibly a Lieutenant (Moss).

- √ Black, Joseph – From SC, county not named; did not name his Captain (Moss)
- √ Curren, John – Says he was under Lt. Andrew Faris and Col. William Hill at the battle of KM (Moss). Col. Hill was not at KM, he was sick.
- √ Faris, Alexander (Lt.) – From New Acquisition District, SC. Lost a gun at the battle of KM (Moss). He does not mention in his pension application (S3344).
- √ Gebie, John – Said he was under Lt. Alexander Faris (directly above) at the battle of KM, Captain not named (Moss).
- √ Patrick, Robert – From what became York District. At the battle of KM under Lt. Col. James Hawthorn, Captain not named by his son (W21925).
- √ Stephenson, David – From the New Acquisition District. At the battle of KM, no officers named by his widow (R10141).
- √ Watson, William (killed) – Killed while serving under Lacey and Hawthorn at the battle of KM, no officers named (Moss, both Monuments).

Maj. William Candler  
Clarke's Regiment, GA (5)

- √ Bean, Robert – From Washington County, NC, a Rifleman in Clarke's Regiment at the battle of KM, no Captain named (Moss).
- √ Black, John – From Elbert County, GA; did not name his Captain (R890 – not found / Moss)
- √ Duick, Timothy – From GA, at the battle of KM. Nothing more provided (Moss).
- √ Smith, Benjamin – From VA, but joined Clarke's Regiment and was at the battle of KM, Captain not named (S38387).
- √ Trammel, Peter – From NC, but joined a GA unit. A wagoner at the battle of KM, no officers named (R10674).

- ✓ Ferguson, Andrew – From VA, says he was under Col. Daniel Morgan at the battle of KM (Morgan not there) (S32243).
- ✓ Fisher, John – From Rutherford County, NC, but in a SC unit, was captured by Maj. Patrick Ferguson in NC. He escaped during the battle of KM (W25580).
- ✓ Harold, Jeremiah – From Orangeburgh District, SC. At the battle of KM, no officers named (S17467).
- ✓ Hunter, Dempsey – From SC. Widow said he was at the battle of KM, no officers named (R5399).
- ✓ Johnson, Arthur (Lt.) – From SC, Widow said he also served in Rutherford County, NC. At the battle of KM, no officers named (W10152).
- ✓ Johnston, Martin – From Culpeper County, VA. Widow said he was at the battle of KM, no officers named (W436).
