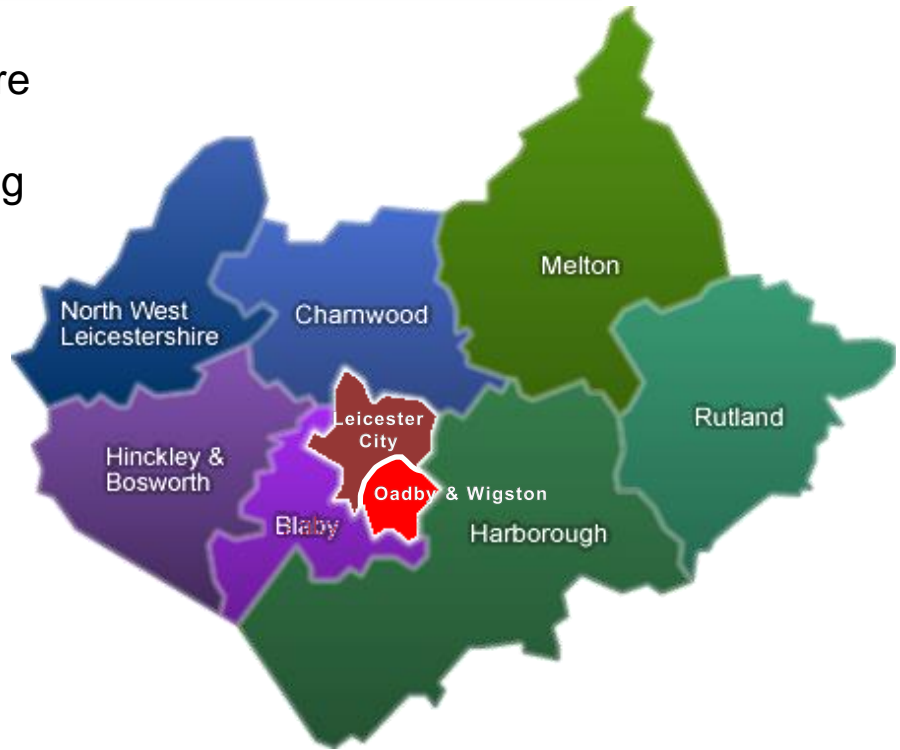

Leicestershire & Rutland Inclusive Football League



With the development of Inclusive Clubs / Teams over the years within Leicestershire and Rutland, a County Inclusive Football League was established and has seen a steady growth in the number of teams taking part in the league and the frequency of fixtures.

The Leicestershire and Rutland Inclusive Football League is a FA Charter Standard and RESPECT League, ensures Fair-Play and mutual respect for all those involved. The teams involved in the league are committed to providing a friendly and safe environment for youngsters, adults, males and female with a disability/special need to take part in Football.

The league has a monthly fixture which is rotated around the county with the main Inclusive Clubs taking it in turn to host the fixtures. During the winter months, we also have fixtures at the Leicester City Training Dome (indoor 3G), which is a fantastic facility, ensuring the fixtures still go ahead and the players are not disappointed.

The Inclusive League, provides opportunities for male and female players in the categories below:

Junior Division (U13's Mixed)

Youth Divisions (U16's Male and Female)

Adults Divisions (over 16's Male and Female)

The league operates a 4 year age banding in the Youth and Junior Divisions.

All matches will be small sided (4v4; 5v5; 6v6; 7v7; 8v8; 9v9) dependant on the number of players and facility available at each league event. The decision regarding the number of players per side will be taken by mutual agreement on the day.

Playing time will be at the discretion of the league but not more than 20 minutes each way.

No official records will be kept of the results and no league tables will be published.

Disability Football Development Fund



The Disability Football Development Fund is specifically targeted at supporting the growth of disability football in England. This area of the game has grown immensely in recent years and The FA is keen for this to continue.

The FA's Disability Football Development Fund (DFDF) is focused on retaining and developing playing and training opportunities for disabled players and attracting new disabled players into football together with supporting a professional workforce to continue the development of the game over the next three years.

The DFDF sees £127,000 worth of investment into Leicestershire and Rutland over the next three years through partners including The FA, Leicester City FC and Leicestershire and Rutland Inclusive sports Association (LARISA).

During the course of the of the three year Project, we aim to work with over 2000 new participants and create 24 new inclusive teams across the county.

Working with Leicester City Community Trust to provide the coaching provision, we will be delivering a number of sub projects to target new participants into the game, they include;

Community Day Centres (Adult Provision)
Extra Curriculum Fundamentals (12-16 years)
Enrichment to Activity (16 plus)
Impairment Specific Sessions (All Ages)
Powerchair football (All Ages)
Disability Organisations (All Ages)

All projects are then linked to local inclusive clubs in Leicestershire and Rutland, to provide the sustainability.

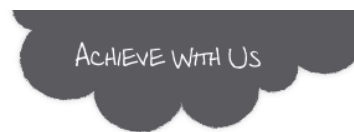

Disability Pathway

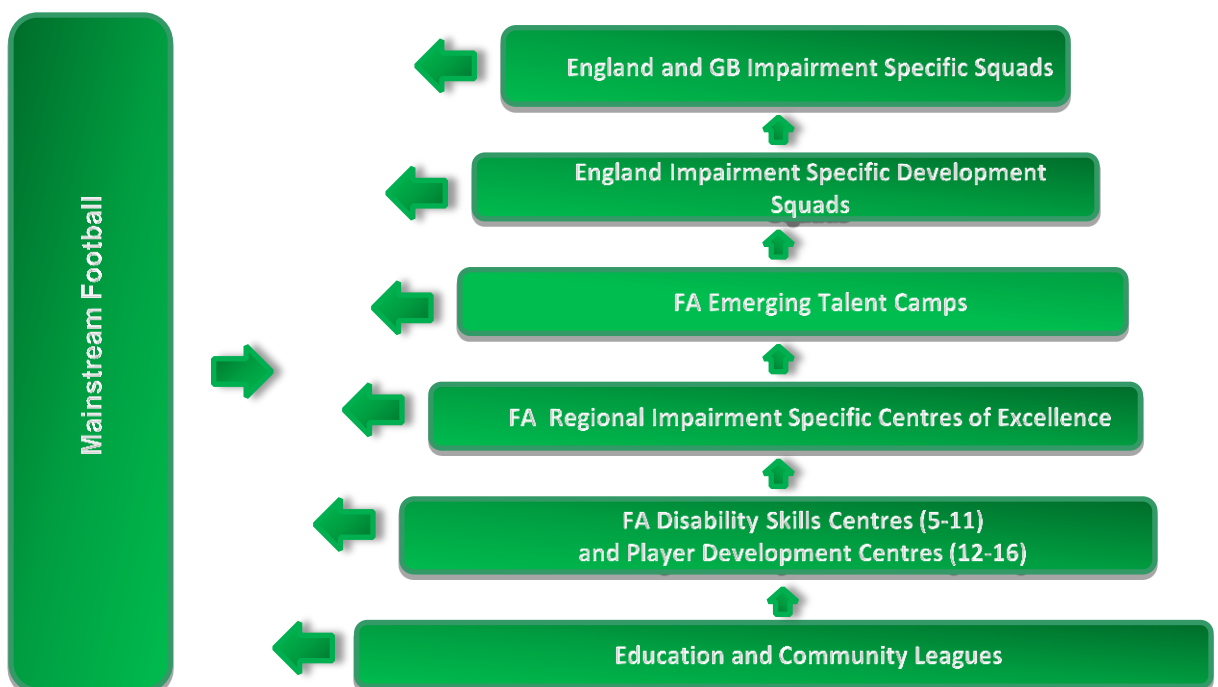


The purpose of The FA's Disability Talent Programme is to identify young players deemed to possess higher levels of ability and to place them in a developmental programme designed to produce football excellence in conjunction with personal development. The Pathway comprises of FA Disability Player Development Centres (PDCs), FA Regional Impairment Specific Centres of Excellence and FA England Impairment Specific Development Squads.

To develop young players, with the ability to succeed at international level and progress to England Senior impairment specific squads.

This is achieved by:

1. To develop a network of community clubs offering football coaching and playing opportunities for disabled young people and enthuse a large number of players to progress within football.
2. Working with local partners to support Player Development Centres which provide quality local coaching opportunities to improve the technical, social, physical and psychological attributes of young players.
3. Working with partners to deliver a regional playing and coaching structure within an impairment specific programme to ensure a smooth transition into relevant training environments, key skill progression and exposure to the right experiences.
4. Exposing emerging talent to the rigours of an elite programme in preparation for England Development involvement.
5. Providing international competition experience at development level in preparation for the senior environment.



Leicestershire & Rutland Player Development Centre



What is the Player Development Centre?

The Disability Leicestershire and Rutland Player Development Centre is ran by the Leicestershire and Rutland County FA and can be attended by invitation only. A Player Development Centre (PDC) should represent an opportunity for players to access higher level coaching and dedicated support; identification for these centres can be through a variety of ways: England Talent Days, club, teacher or coach nomination or Regional Scout visit.

The purpose of The Football Association Disability Player Development Centre Programme is to identify players deemed to possess a higher level of ability from within grassroots youth football and place them in a technical programme designed to promote individual football development and promote progression to and involvement in Regional Impairment Specific Centres of Excellence or mainstream football activity.

Centres must recruit players from the following impairment groups to enable progression to elite levels of performance:

- Amputee;
- Cerebral Palsy;
- Deaf;
- Partially Sighted;
- Learning Disability.

Disability Player Development Centres must only operate at an Under 16 age group (4 year age banding from U13).

Regional Talent Pathway – East Midlands



FA East Midlands Blind Player Development Centre hosted by The Leicestershire and Rutland County FA

As part of its commitment to 'Inclusive' football, the Leicestershire and Rutland County FA has been awarded a license to run a Regional Blind Player Development Centre.

Aim of the Centre -

To identify and recruit Blind and Visually Impaired players (B1 and B2), both locally and across the East Midlands who are interested in playing blind futsal.

The sessions run on a Saturday mornings at Judgemeanow Community College in Leicester and will involve players within 2 age categories, 12 to 16 years of age and adults (over the age of 16) along with sighted Goalkeepers of both age categories.

The centre is there to develop the players that will one day go on to represent England or Great Britain in the European, World championships and Paralympics.
