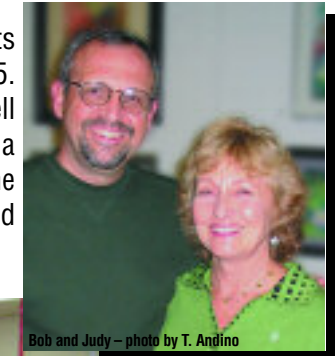

Charlie's Legacy

Among the neglected keys to appreciating the essential beauty and mystery of our game are the people who encourage others: not just the big names and major tournament winners, but also those accomplished players who help us discover the allure of bridge, opening our eyes to the wonders we can appreciate and enjoy at every level of skill. The late Charlie Wilson was one such mentor.

Charlie expected much of his partners, though never more than he expected of himself. His requirements included civility at the table, the highest ethical standards, and good play – which meant doing as well as one could and always aiming to improve. In particular, he always forgave mistakes that were acknowledged and analyzed, and he regularly asked for help in improving his own game. Charlie's emphasis on always reaching higher is illustrated by this anecdote (well-known in and around Tallahassee, Florida), told by one of his frequent partners, Curtis Ruder. Declaring at a seemingly routine game, Charlie took several lengthy pauses, a puzzled look escaping his usual poker face. Afterwards, he apologized to Curtis for not playing as well as he might have even though he had won all 13 tricks. He was the ultimate non-results player.

My first team win, in a sectional Swiss, was very exciting. As my partner, Charlie did not merely perform well; he also made me feel like I was taking an important role. This was one of the deals:

Charlie's opening bid was constrained by system (11-14 notrumps, five-card majors). At the time, I thought that our opponents were stronger players than I, but West's natural overcall seems questionable. Charlie added some points for having aces over the missing strength and some more for the value of displaying confidence in my performance as declarer.

A trump from West hit the table. I saw (and can still see) only nine legitimate tricks. From the opening lead, East must hold at least one spade honor, so West was fairly well marked with the ace of diamonds. Maybe it was my desire to provide best effort for Charlie that inspired me to see the glimmer of a chance if I could keep East off lead. But how could I do that if East, as expected, held a spade honor? In a "Eureka!" moment, I realized the need to make a critical play immediately.

I won the first trick in dummy and led a low spade. East ducked – one would need to guess essentially the entire deal to play the queen – and I brought in 10 tricks by later stripping West of the majors and playing three rounds of clubs. Two further new experiences awaited me: West ducked the third club trick, saying "Nobody endplays me!" And I had a thrill in the comparison when I learned that our counterparts had scored only 140 on this deal.

A champion performer might routinely find this pressure line of play – Charlie insisted that both his aggressive raise and my line of play should be expected of any decent club player – but a major part of Charlie's legacy is the realization that anyone who rises to a new personal level experiences the same satisfaction. Charlie opened my eyes to much that the game has to offer, and I hope, in an unknowable future, to sit at his table again.

All color elements must be CMYK (process colors). No custom or spot colors are supported. A positive color laser or inkjet proof must accompany all digital files. Files may be submitted on CD, DVD, or by e-mail. Files submitted by e-mail must be under 20 MB in size.

The Orlando Regional – By the Numbers

Statistics of a Successful Regional at a Luxury Hotel

Now that the tents have been folded up and the 2006 Orlando Regional is history, I think a look at the numbers is instructive.

The table count was 2587.5, which means that during the week, four people sat down to play in a bridge event 2587 times. There were physically 320 tables in the three ballrooms used as playing rooms at the Peabody. Tables were rented for one dollar per day each. The Peabody provide the chairs without charge.

Of the 1636 players participating, 1517 won masterpoints. The winners got a total of 16,158 masterpoints—an average of 10.65 and a median of 6.24 points. The players averaged 6.3 sessions and paid \$76.

Knockouts continue to attract the most players, accounting for 41 percent of all tables at the tournament. The pie chart "Tables Played" shows the percentages for all types of events. Team games (KO's, Swiss, and BAM) made up 56 percent of all tables.

The Unit's business arrangements with the Peabody are somewhat convoluted. The Peabody does not charge directly for the huge ballrooms. Unit 240 negotiated a 5-year contract to hold regionals at the hotel. The Unit got free rooms for workers, a much-reduced room rate for the players (\$129 vs. \$230), and the ballroom space with chairs. The Peabody got a full hotel at a time of year when they would otherwise be idle, and they charge hefty fees for things like bev-

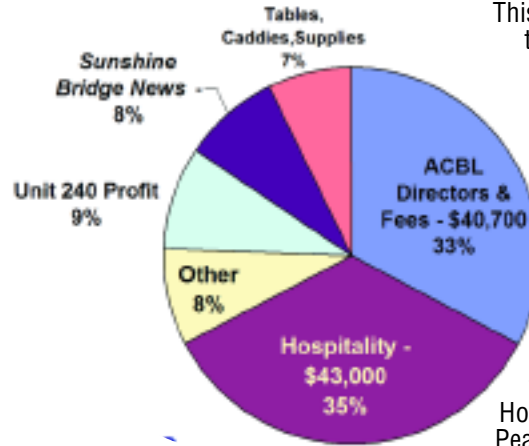
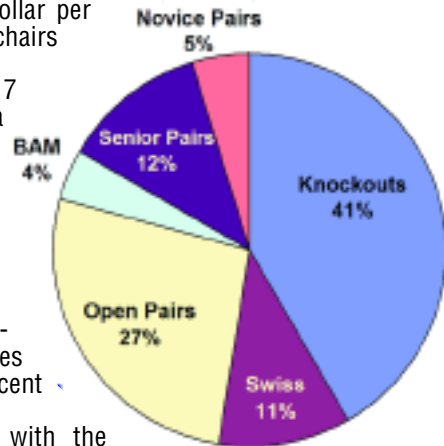
erage service and catering. It's an interesting deal and a classy, beautiful hotel. This is the last year of the current contract, and the Peabody has chosen not to renew it.

The players bought 10,350 entries at \$11-\$13 each—the take was roughly \$124,400.

This is the sole source of funds for the tournament. If you bought anything besides an entry while you were there, the Peabody or a vender sold it to you.

The expenses of running the tournament have not been finalized as I write this. Nonetheless, the "Tournament Expenses" pie chart presents a fairly accurate picture. Note that the ACBL charges (for directors' salaries and expenses, sanction fees, and other costs) and the Hospitality charges (mostly from the Peabody for beverages and snacks) account for two-thirds of the expenses. The remaining third is split into proceeds (17%) and smaller costs (15%). The Sunshine Bridge News

receives \$1 per entry at all regionals played in Florida, consuming about half the proceeds from this tournament. Unit 240 will take home about \$11,000, which is its primary source of operating capital for the year.

Oh, how it has changed our lives. For the purpose of bridge discussions, it is surely one of the greatest of technological innovations.

Let me illustrate just three benefits that have accrued through the advent of this form of communication.

- 1- Each participant can now state his viewpoint completely, without fear of interruption or derision.
- 2- The rise of decibel levels will not be a factor in the discussion unless one of the participants is disturbed enough to capitalize.
- 3- Threatening body language will no longer be visible.

Let me give you an example of the tranquility, the politeness, and the rational tone of a bridge discussion now possible by virtue of our modern technology.

That looks like a double to me. With the hand you held, I would have bid four hearts. Yes I would have.

And, if they continued to four spades you could double and we would only be minus 990. Ha! I meant that humorously. O.K.?

O.K.? Not really. To expect me to hold a major trump stack on this auction is ludicrous, I mean rare.

I suppose that I could have held KQx or even KQJ, but on frequency, with the opponents boasting spades up to the three level, I was much more likely to hold the cards I held.

Now with your permission, let us go around to your side of the table.

When you hold Jxx AJxx K10xx Ax, certainly a hand you could have held, pass three spades doubled.

When you hold x AJxx K10xx AJ98 pull to four hearts. Oh I know, sometimes you will miss a juicy penalty, but most of the time you will avoid minus 1130. Ha!

Maybe you will make four hearts. Sometimes you will have a good save. But here's the real bonus—only rarely will the opponents, after being smacked at the three level, go on to four spades for the "humorous" minus 990 number.

In the United States he doubled at the Lancaster Nationals winning both the Reisinger Board-a-Match and the Blue Ribbon Pairs. He most recently competed on the world stage at Estoril this past summer, but this time for his adopted home USA in the senior trials.

Memorial services were held in both Miami, Florida and Montreal, Canada and attended by several members of the Molson family of Canada including brothers and their wives, William - Bill and Christopher - Chris who spoke at the services.
