Resistencia, Argentina

Justin visited the north of Argentina (Chaco and Misiones) to visit IELU projects that mostly focus on women and children in various aspects of their lives.



He learned more about the serious reality of human trafficking, violence against women, and programs that feed school-age children daily with the help of four volunteer mothers from the neighborhood. Justin also led various worships and bible studies.

Colonia (Summer Camp)!

Since school ends in December here in Argentina, but we continue to work, we needed to find something productive and fun for Everette to do. (Most families here take two weeks to even an entire month and go to the beach!!) Fortunately, we discovered that we are not the only parents in this situation and that a fabulous summer camp exists specifically for this reason. Both January and



February, Everette went to summer camp with other 3 and 4 year olds in our neighborhood! They had a blast swimming and playing soccer and basketball. He also participated in special workshops for theater, music, art and of course dancing! He came home everyday singing a new song. Our favorite was "El Auto Feo de Papá" (Dad's Ugly Car)!!

Las Cañas Community Center

Justin traveled quite a lot in March, visiting many projects, one of which gave him an opportunity to meet with youth leaders accompanied by EPES working in the Las Cañas Community Center; the only remaining structure that turned into a food distribution and shelter for many people left homeless by the mega fire in Valparaíso earlier in the year. Justin said, "I saw in the young adult leaders a fighting spirit always in favor of a dignified life, which is liberating."
