

Grand Knight's Message

Brothers, Families, and Friends of Council 367,

Although it may sometimes feel comforting to immerse and relax in a bath of lukewarm water, it is neither therapeutic nor healthy. Lukewarm water is not hot enough to generate steam and thus be mechanically useful. Nor is it cold enough to become ice and be palatable. Until water is boiling or freezing, it is not very beneficial. Lukewarm water is just about useless and not liked by many people.

Similarly, lukewarmness in our Catholicism is useless too. In fact, it may be dangerous to be lukewarm in both our faith and our Knighthood. There are numerous accepted signs of being lukewarm in one's religiosity: selfsatisfaction, mediocrity, spiritual laziness, complacency, and unfaithfulness, Being self-satisfied in one's position in life, mediocre in your religious zeal, spiritually lax about sacramental adherence, complacent in actions, and unfaithful to the tenants of the Catholic religion are all signs of being dangerously lukewarm. All of them combined can be devastating. God detested lukewarm. In Revelation 3:17, He saw the signs of lukewarmness in the citizens of Laodicea and said to them: "For you say, 'I am rich and affluent and have no need of anything,' and yet do not realize that you are wretched, pitiable, poor, blind, and naked." And He admonished them by saying, "So, because you are lukewarm, neither hot nor cold, I will spit you out of my mouth." (Revelation 3:16). As good Catholic gentlemen and as Knights, we can NOT be lukewarm

Grand Knight's Message cont,

In the first one hundred years after the resurrection of Jesus, members of the early Church could not afford to be lukewarm about their Christianity or the Church would not have survived nor would it have thrived as it did. The first Christians had to be fervent, evangelical, and religiously zealous in their faith. However, recall that it was against Roman law to be a Christian during the years after the crucifixion of Jesus. As such, it was not possible for early Church members to advertise and market for new members. The only way that the first converts to The Catholic Church were made was through observing the way the Christians lived. Those Roman pagans who converted to Christianity had to have a reason to do so. They saw that the Christians lived a life of charity, modesty, selflessness, humility, and caring for one another. The pagans were drawn to the Christian way of life. That's exactly what we still need to make happen two thousand years later.

In seven very famous and consequential letters written in the first century to Christians before he was martyred, Saint Ignatius of Antioch established the doctrine for The Catholic Church. Most importantly, he codified the relationship of the Christians to God. As part of that, he established the rules of conduct for the people. One of the most important tenants was that of charity. As a people devoted to acts of charity, Saint Ignatius believed that the Church would thrive. Once all the original Apostles were dead and there was no longer anyone to tell the first-hand accounts of the life of Jesus, there could be no other way to attract converts other than the living example of present-day Christians. Charity was the key to the Church's success during those early years. Until Constantine the Great became a Christian in 312 and legalized the religion, pagans only converted because of the charitable lives and works they saw in Christians. That can still be true today.

As Knights, we are called to witness for Jesus. One way to do that is by our acts of charity. It's no mistake that Blessed Fr. McGivney made charity the first principle of the Order. Only then can we bring more Catholic gentlemen into the Order and show them the way to the Lord. We have to be like the Good Shepherd who was ready to lay down his life for his sheep. We have to be like Jesus. As Knights we are uniquely commissioned to do just that. We must do all that we can to demonstrate our true faith through our selfless acts of charity. We have the programs, the manpower, and the mandate. But, do we have the willpower? Or, are we lukewarm?

Brothers, we don't want to be and can't dare to be lukewarm. Being so is antithetical to what we stand for as Knights. Let's be all in for God and be boiling hot in our passion.






Chapel
