- We should be able to tell that you put a lot of thought into what information you included in your presentation. YOU MUST research:
 - The Beatles
 - Elvis Presley
 - Hank Williams, Sr.
 - Other popular songs, groups or artists
 - Any trends in music during this time (How did music change?)
- A properly formatted works cited page documents at least 3 sources.
- You present both your poster and research findings to the class.
- All members of your group participate in the research, poster design, and presentation.
- Extra Credit: Background music that fits with the time period.

Author. "Title of Page." *Title of Web Site*. Publisher or Sponsor, Date of Publication. Format. Date of Access.

Your group is in charge of researching the movies of the 1960s. Concentrate on popular films of the time period including Oscar winning films and actors and top films for movie-goers. You will be creating a poster and oral presentation of your findings.

Your Success Criteria:

- A neat, attractive poster that informs your teacher and classmates about popular movies during this time.
- We should be able to tell that you put a lot of thought into what information you included in your presentation. YOU MUST research:
 - Paul Newman
 - Other popular actors/actresses
 - Popular films; especially those that were popular with teenagers
 - Popular genres (drama, action, musicals, sci-fi, comedy)
 - Any trends in movies during this time (How did movies change?)
 - Use of technology in movie-making
- A properly formatted works cited page documents at least 3 sources.
- You present both your poster and research findings to the class.
- All members of your group participate in the research, poster design, and presentation.
- Extra Credit: Background theme music from the most popular movies.
