The Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, on Mon. Dec. 12, is one of those feast days that has been growing in popularity during our lifetime. It recalls the time when Our Blessed Mother appeared to (now Saint) Juan Diego in Mexico in 1531, and called upon him to urge the Bishop of Mexico to build a chapel to her honor at Guadalupe. The Bishop was finally convinced when Juan Diego brought to him a huge bouquet of roses--very unexpected at that time of year. And on Juan's cloak was the image of the Blessed Mother, of which we are familiar today. Since the image appeared as a Mexican woman of the times, the faith she represented, the Catholic faith, began to take hold among the people of Mexico. Today. Our Lady of Guadalupe is the Patroness of the Americas.
