NATIONAL RECONCILIATION WEEK

This week is National Reconciliation Week

National Reconciliation Week (NRW) is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia. This term the students will be attending a one hour Indigenous Cultural workshop which aims to develop a sense of acknowledgement and respect for the traditional custodians of our country through cultural awareness.

At its heart, reconciliation is about strengthening relationships between Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and non-Indigenous peoples, for the benefit of all Australians.

The dates for NRW remain the same each year; 27 May to 3 June. These dates commemorate two significant milestones in the reconciliation journey— the successful 1967 referendum and the High Court Mabo decision respectively.

Monday 3 June - Stage 3 - Author Visit "Oliver Phommavanh"

Next Monday the author, Oliver Phommavanh, will be talking to the Stage 3 students about his books and the writing process.

Oliver Phommavanh is a young Thai-Australian writer of novels for children. He is a fresh, positive voice for cultural diversity in children's literature and has featured on panels at the Sydney Writers' Festival among many other appearances at festivals and writing events. He has worked as a primary school teacher and now spends his time writing, and sharing his writing passion with children and engaging them with humour.

His first book, "Thai-riffic!", was published to critical acclaim, followed by "Con-nerd", "Punchlines", "Thai-no-mite", "Ethan" in the *Stuff Happens* series, "Super Con-nerd", "The other Christy" and "Natural born loser". Oliver is currently

promoting his new novel "Don't follow Vee."

Meeting an author makes the writing process, books and the authors themselves accessible and real to the students. Students learn the "inside stories" behind their books and the struggles and joys of the writing process because they hear about it directly from the author. Author visits are a fabulous way to promote reading and writing.

Oliver will also do book signings at the end of each presentation so students are more than welcome to bring their own books along on the day to be signed.


As stated in the incursion note the cost for this visit has been included in the Term 2 activities payment. Permission notes will need to be returned to the class teachers by this Friday 31 May.


