


Hargraves is Located between Hill End and Mudgee.

You can get there a number of ways.

- 1. Turn right at Lithgow onto the Castlereagh Highway and drive through Mudgee. Drive Through the town towards Gulgong and Turn Left onto Hill End rd. You will see "Mudgee Honey Haven" In front of you. Hargraves will be approximately 30 odd Kms from here.
- 2. Or drive past Lithgow towards Bathurst and turn right at Kelso for Sofala. If you go to Sofala turn left onto Hill End rd. to Hill End and turn right At Hill End following the Hill End rd. to Hargraves.
- 3. Or turn Right at Kelso for Sofala and turn left onto Eleven Mile Drive and drive through Eglington. Turn Right onto Duramana rd. which turns into Turondale rd. Follow this road all the way to Hill End rd. Turn Left to Hill End and when you come to Hill End turn right onto the Hill End rd. to Mudgee. Hargrayes is approximately 40 km. from Hill End.
