Behaviour support

Behaviour support is about creating individualised strategies for people with disability that are responsive to the person's needs, in a way that reduces the occurrence and impact of behaviours of concern and minimises the use of restrictive practices.

Under the NDIS Commission, behaviour support focuses on person-centred interventions to address the underlying causes of behaviours of concern or challenging behaviours, while safeguarding the dignity and quality of life of people with disability who require specialist behaviour support.

Both behaviour support practitioners, and providers who use regulated restrictive practices (implementing providers), are required to meet the requirements outlined in the Matienal Disability Insurance Scheme (Restrictive Practices and Behaviour Support) Rules 2018.

Legislative Framework



Section 181H of the NDIS Act 2013 (Cth)

- (a) building capability in the development of behaviour support through:
 - i. developing and implementing a competency framework for registered NDIS providers whose registration includes the provision of behaviour support assessments and developing behaviour support plans; and
 - ii. **assessing the skills and experience** of such providers against the competency framework.

Background

- Draft Behaviour Support Competency Framework (Version 1 May 2018)
- Draft Assessment Methodology (May-June 2018)
- Literature Review (July 2018)

Revised to reflect:

- The intent of the legislation on the rights of persons with disabilities.
- → A contemporary evidenced-based practice on positive behaviour support
- → The wide range and variation of sector capacity, capability and experience in disability service delivery






- It aims to establish expectations of best practice behaviour support for participants
- It defines the principles and values base of positive behaviour support
- It is reflects evidence based practice and the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD, 2006)
- It is the basis for considering the suitability of NDIS providers and practitioners to provide specialist behaviour support services as outlined in the NDIS Act (2013)
- Pathway for progression of practitioner capabilities in PBS and professionalisation of services

STEP 2: Practitioner and Supervisor or NDIS Provider to provide evidence:

- Supervision Agreement
- Continuing Professional Development Plan (CPDP)
- A brief Curriculum Vitae (CV)
- A de-identified Behaviour Support Plan (BSP)

NDIS Commission: Step 3 Review evidence

Practitioner: Re-assessment

3 year cycle

NDIS Commission: Random Audits

Review evidence, BIP QEII
