Vintage QCCC

With the Vintage Gang: Bill Cruthis 1974, Bill Ingram 1973, Darrell Kirkley 1973, and Travis Meredith 1970



Only limited knowledge that this Vintage QCCC gang tries to meet every 3 months for dinner at one of our homes, or before Covid we would venture out to a local eatery. Judging from the laughter, volume, and some of the details, it may be best that we remain out of the public domain.

This last Saturday was our Christmas celebration held at Trav and Sharon Meredith's home. As usual the men headed down to Trav's man cave, while the women gathered on the closed in porch. Only once during the pre-meal wine and beer sampling, did Darrell have to go out to the porch and quiet the ladies down.

Trav's man cave is a walk back in time. There must be 200 model cars on display, posters, pictures, Corvette literature in every nook and cranny, plus the walls are covered. You could spend a day in there and not see it all. Beside the group listed at the top of the page add Larry Miller, and Steve James 1978, to our group. I would be safe in telling you that if you have Trav, Darrell, Bill Ingram, Larry Miller, and Steve James in a room, then you have almost all of the knowledge about Corvettes and other Drag Racers in the Charlotte area going back to the 60's. It is really incredible! I can't take notes so this is just from what I recall of the conversation and I probably won't get it all right.

Things I learned during this dinner...

Trav's favorite Nascar driver was Billy Meyers. Trav, Darrell, Larry and Steve knew of him and somehow Chocolate Meyers figured in. They raced on a track long since gone, in the North area of town, but not Metrolina.

Bill, Darrell, Trav, and Steve knew of a car lot owned by Larry Pace who all considered a reputable fellow. Turns out Steve in about 1975, was looking at a silver 67 coupe with black guts, side exhaust and aluminum wheels with a big block 390 hp. Bill then informs us that was the car he bought from Larry and it was also the car that I was present when a guy from North Wilkesboro came to Charlotte to view the car. Bill had a \$5000 price on it. The car looked brand new, and this fellow said it was too much and he left. He stopped at a pay phone ½ way home and called to tell Bill that he thought he would take the car. Bill told him the car was still for sale to anyone but you. That was a good lesson for me. Pick your battles, especially when you have a weak argument. Then Steve told us about buying his 67 coupe at Auto Fair. He and Darrell had restored a Chevelle and how he traded with the guy for the Corvette. Of course half the room knew of his car's history.

The old story of Jeff Tater usually comes up. The club had a social on Lake Wylie. Tater had married into the Van Every family, (can we all say Lance crackers) therefore he had unlimited funds to buy toys with. He had acquired a speed boat. Darrell explained how these are driven in that under acceleration you need to go straight. Now after immense alcoholic intake, Tater was on the boat with Bill Ingram and young son Marty, when Tater's alcoholic state took over. He was headed for the bank when he finally got it right but the boat front end raised up and it glided right onto the bank and settled down between two pine trees. (oops Joni Ingram had not heard this story about her young son before.) Several QCCC guys decided to carry it over and put it on the trailer. It was parked for the night. I am always in awe that as we talk about the old times, someone's name comes up and sure enough they all have a tale to tell about them. This time there was discussion about Rick the body and paint guy that does a lot of work for Darrell. There were so many stories told that night that I believe that I will take notes next time.

Next they dove into Dale Earnhardt Jr's Podcast. Jr. is a big fan of Nascar History, that is like throwing a pitch to these guy's sweet spot. Seems like they knew more about the history than the podcast.

Before we went upstairs to eat Trav said he had something for us to do. Trav is the resident artist for OCCC. He has the patience and the talent to do this. He explained how he had arranged the man cave, with Corvette models of cars he had in his lifetime, then an area of Nascar cars with the one of Billy Myers. Then he had eight models sitting on the left side of the man cave. He started by playing a game of do you know whose car this is? One was Buzz Cagle's 67 big block. Ingram always wanted to buy this one but never got it. Then he had Robert Scognamillo's 66 convertible complete with the American flag on the trunk lid. Next he had a Silver 67 big block, black stinger, side exhaust and this was the one I mentioned earlier(Bill Ingram's car.) Then he had a model of Darrell's newest red C3. Then he had my 63 coupe. I told Trav he had now painted that car twice as he painted the real deal after I stripped it. Next was Larry Miller's 1964 red convertible and finally Steve James's 67 coupe. Trav said he needed something to do during covid. These were so detailed that you knew how long this had taken. My early modeling days were in Jr and Sr high school. In my type A progress I would start on the suspension gluing parts together. I know the glue said to let it set for 4 hours but I knew better, 10 to 15 minutes tops. Then pretty quickly I had glue all over everything and parts that were not to be glued had excess glue on them. I told the group that you could tell I did not assemble this 1963 because this one's wheels turned where my excess glue stuck my wheels. Too much glue and it ends up on your fingers then when you pick up a piece of chrome the glue will take that shiny silver off leaving white plastic.

We all ended up with our cars of the 70's with exact detail. He also had a Tupperware box the exact size for us to get them home and he had tissue paper to wrap them in. These will be such a great keep sake for each of us. He had gone on E-bay or Amazon to find the exact correct car for each of us. There are a lot of ways to define friendship, but I would put Trav's name in there somewhere. We have had too much tragedy this year, but nights like last Saturday are what makes QCCC such a special group. We will muster forward knowing each tragedy is a speed bump and only serves to tighten us. We are looking forward to getting back to meeting's and events where we can drive our cars.

We will make our own history as QCCC carries on.
