We Have These Treasures... (2 Corinthians 4:7)



We are at a critically important moment in the long and distinguished history of the Church of the Good Shepherd. As we prepare to "turn the corner" on the global pandemic, which has had such a disruptive impact on every aspect of our life together and return to something resembling "normalcy" and the way things were BC (Before Covid), we are embracing the challenge of raising \$60,000.00 to fund the restoration of our magnificent stained glass windows.

There is no question that our "spiritual ancestors" provided us with a priceless treasure in these windows. Folks just like us "Remembered the Future" by giving generously and sac-

rificially (often in loving memory of deceased loved ones) so that we might have the blessing of these beautiful windows which enhance our worship every time we enter the sanctuary. Though our gifts to the We Have These Treasures Capital Campaign, we have an opportunity to do what the family of Amelia B. Tryon did when they donated the beautiful Adam & Eve window in the chancel nearly one hundred years ago. We have an opportunity to do what the beloved children of Charles and Martha Oliver did in 1912 when they gave the remarkable Good Shepherd window in the narthex of the sanctuary. It is now our turn (and our privilege) to remember those who will come after us. Through our gifts, we have a unique opportunity to insure that these spiritual treasures which have enriched our lives and our worship for so many years will be preserved and protected. Thanks to the creative work of the people at Epiphany Studios, Inc. in Front Royal, Virginia, the restoration of the windows is nearly complete. It is now our turn to provide the financial resources to cover the loan we received from the Diocese of New Jersey and pay the \$60,000.00 restoration cost. The Vestry, at the April 11th meeting, approved a proposal to launch a capital campaign to do precisely that: to provide the financial resources to fund the total cost of the stained glass window restoration project! The campaign will be brief (it will be launched the weekend of September 4th/5th and will conclude the weekend of September 24th/25th). Prior to the launch, every member of the parish will receive a letter and a pledge card inviting a generous response. We invite you to prayerfully consider making either a one-time gift or a multi-year pledge of financial support for this urgently important project.

Highlights of the June 13th Vestry Meeting:

Your Vestry held it's regular monthly meeting on Sunday, June 13th @ 11:30AM. Here are some of the "highlights" of the meeting:

- Accepted, with regret, the resignation from the Vestry of Mel Caron, effective immediately. A nominating committee consisting of the Sr. Warden; the Interim Rector; Brad Davies and Diane Wall will meet to consider filling the two vacancies which currently exist on the Vestry.
- Approved a proposal to modify our "in-person worship protocols" to include the Following: #1. All limits to attendance and registration requirements will be eliminated. #2. Communion will be distributed (host only) Cathedral style and at the steps of the Chancel. #3. We will maintain the "every other pew" open until the end of August. #4. Unvaccinated worshippers will be asked to wear Masks and to maintain social distance in the sanctuary. #5. Coffee hour may resume. #6. Fully vaccinated choir members will be able to occupy the choir loft and sing without masks or social distance, #7. The ushers will collect the offering and bring the gifts to the Altar. All of these changes will be in effect beginning the weekend of June 19th and 20th.
- ~ The Treasurer reported a balance in all accounts (as of 5/31) of \$337,740.91 (this includes \$42,661.00 in the Good Shepherd endowment.
- Fr. Dave announced that the \$10K Phalunas Memorial Gift will be distributed as follows: \$2,500.00 to the Women at the Well to be used where most need and \$7,500.00 to the Stained Glass Window Restoration fund. Fr. Dave also announced that, as of June 9th a total of \$3,180.00 has been given and received as memorial gifts honoring the memory of Lee Braidwood.

- Jeff Bathurst gave a progress report on the Discernment Committee (the committee is making "great progress" and is meeting weekly) and the Audio Visual Upgrade (the new system is now operational and will begin to be used before the end of the month is project will be completed by the end of the June "at the latest").
- ~ Fr. Dave reported that Epiphany Studios will begin the final work on the Stained Glass Window Restoration project on June 21st and the project will be completed by early July.
- Approved a proposal to give 5% of the net proceeds of the WE HAVE THESE TREASURES CAPITAL CAM-PAIGN to Episcopal Community Services-DNJ.
- The Vestry discussed what to do about the 10 Clerestory windows that will be replaced when the stained glass window project is completed. It was decided that a note would be sent to the congregation to determine the level of interest in securing one of these windows. The Vestry will make a final decision re. the disposition of the Clerestory windows once the results of the survey are available.

Confirmation Ministry To Begin After Labor Day

Parents and confirmation-aged young people interested in participating in the Confirmation Ministry program, met, on Sunday, May 23rd, with Fr. Dave and Lori Bathurst for an orientation meeting. The purpose of the Confirmation ministry program will be to prepare our young people to participate in the Rite of Confirmation, which will be held on Sunday, December 12th when Bishop Stokes will be with us and will preach and preside at the Rite of Confirmation. The confirmation ministry program will consist of a series of six learning sessions, which will focus on the Baptismal covenant (BCP, pg.#304). Participants will also participate in a "hand-on" social ministry experience, a stewardship project and (we hope) a road trip to either the National Cathedral in Washington, DC or the Cathedral of Saint John the Divine in New York City. The plan will be to schedule a Town Hall meeting sometime in September to discuss the books and to begin a dialog about what we can do, as individual Christians and as a Christian community to raise awareness of the lingering problem of systemic racism and promote social justice where we live, work and

June 2021 Discernment Committee update - Jeff Bathurst

The Good Shepherd Discernment Committee continues to make great progress toward calling our next rector. Our amazing group has continued to meet weekly, fueled by the Holy Spirit. **Big news:** We have completed our answers to the OTM 12-question portfolio, which essentially serves as our job posting. The committee could not have done it without all the parish contributions in our April Town Hall. THANK YOU!

Along with members of the vestry and other parishioners, we participated in an Anti-Racism Workshop on Thursday, June 10, with Canon Noreen Duncan. We learned a lot and had some great discussions. It was heartening to see the level of attendance, which the presenters noted was one of their largest audiences. They hosted about 30 parishioners in total.

Next steps:

- We are in the process of completing two more "job postings," one that will appear to a broad audience through the Episcopal News Service, and one for the Transition Ministry Conference website. Once those are complete and submitted to the diocese, we will be ready to receive applicants over about a one-month period.

Since many of you have only visited the church in person recently, I would like to bring everyone up to date on many of the improvements and items that need improving. (Photos below)

- 1. In the kitchen the old wooden island was removed and a new island was installed.
- 2. The lower classrooms had the windows replaced and a concrete pathway was installed to help with water removal.
- 3. Many of you have seen the beautiful transformation of the Altar window. Notice the amount of detail that was never seen before. Many of the other windows were in need of repair and should be completed soon.
- 4. A new AV system was installed that will allow us the ability to have a virtual experience that brings church to our homes that will be like being there. Think about the days when the weather prohibits us from attending or when we are out of town on business or vacation. Weddings and funerals can now be viewed from anywhere allowing friends and family to attend without traveling. Volunteers are needed to run the system.

Although there have been many improvements, there is still a need for many more. These include repainting the classrooms, main church doors need repair and paint, roofing needs repair to prevent leaks coming into the chapel and near the organ. A new fire alarm is needed to prevent false alarms and protect God's Church.

The property committee can't do these repairs on their own, they need the help of all parishioners. The costs of these repairs and improvements are high and while we realize we have all have a difficult year and a half, without being in church, we don't see what's needed. I would invite you to speak to anyone on the property committee if you have any questions or recommendations.


