### **Pastor's Page**

Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!

Recently, members of our youth group participated in a Youth Quake event. They had a wonderful time being with other youth who are also growing in their faith. Many thanks to all of you who helped support our youth group efforts through your prayers and "root" support and by purchasing caramel corn for Super Bowl Sunday. Often with youth groups, a practice is to take some time to share what is called "Highs and Lows". In the sharing of both the highs and the lows the group gets to know each other better and can then both be cared for better and care for others better as well. In order for this to work best, it requires the strengthening of relationships, a high degree of trust, and a willingness to be honest and authentic.

Over the next couple of months, as a faith community and as the Christian church, we will be doing exactly that, sharing highs and lows together. We will share lows, along with Peter, of trying to tell Jesus what he should or shouldn't do, and then finding ourselves being rebuked by Jesus. We will share lows that require us to give thought about what we have turned Christ's church into and how he will have to cleanse our temples and churches so that we can make sure we are rightly focused on him and his message. We will once again have to acknowledge that death is involved in our lives and that, like the grain of wheat, there are parts of our lives that need to die in order for new life to sprout and grow.

And, thankfully, as a faith community and as the Christian church, we get to share our highs, such as sharing that the reason God sent Jesus is because God loves the entire world. We will share and celebrate how death does not have

the final word, the tomb is empty, and how the parts of our hearts we may think are dead, can indeed find new life and beat with a new purpose out of love for each other.

As we share together these highs and lows in the season of Lent, during Holy Week and Easter, just as with the youth, we will get to know each other better and we can be better cared for and also care for each other. And just like the youth, our journey through Lent and Easter, the sharing of these highs and lows will work best if we strengthen our relationships with each other and with Jesus through prayer and service. It will require a high degree of trust in each other and ultimately in Christ. And it will require a willingness on our part to be honest and authentic, with each other, with ourselves, and with Jesus.

These next two months promise to be filled with highs and lows. I look forward to sharing them with you and for us to journey together through the Lenten and Easter seasons.

#### Lent 2012: Look to the Cross

The Lenten season begins on Ash Wednesday (Feb. 22 this year) and lasts for 40 days (not counting Sundays). These days recall the 40-day fast of Jesus in the wilderness after his baptism (Matthew 4:2, Luke 4:1-2) and Moses' 40-day fast on Mount Sinai (Exodus 34:28). Our theme for Lent this year, reflected in our Sunday worship, will be "Look to the Cross."

As part of our 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration, we have published a Lenten devotional booklet written by members, friends, and pastors of Good Shepherd. Be sure to pick up your copy at the church, or ask the office to mail you a copy. We encourage you to use this resource throughout the season. Families may wish to use other devotional practices as well, such as using the cross candle holders from Lent 2009, teaching children to make the sign of the cross, or writing prayers on slips of paper and collecting them in a bowl or making them into a paper chain.


# News from Green Pastures Preschool


