FOCUS ON WORSHIP



St. Luke, Evangelist: October 18 is the festival of St. Luke, Evangelist. St. Luke was a gentile physician, follower of Christ and companion of St. Paul. Identified as the author of both Luke and Acts, Luke was careful to place the events of Jesus' life in their social and religious contexts. His gospel gives us some of the most beloved parables, as well as the songs of Zechariah, Mary, the angels, and Simeon. We observe this lesser festival when it falls on a Sunday.

Reformation Day: Reformation Day is not part of the Liturgical Calendar, but is important as part of our Lutheran heritage. It is a day for giving thanks for Martin Luther and the other reformers, but much more, it calls attention to the ongoing need for ecumenical growth and renewal of the church. It falls on October 31st every year, but is observed on the Sunday on or before October 31. On October 31, 1517, Martin Luther wrote to Albrecht, Archbishop of Mainz and Magdeburg, protesting against the sale of indulgences. He enclosed in his letter a copy of his "Disputation of Martin Luther on the Power and Efficacy of Indulgences," which came to be known as The 95 Theses. Luther wrote the 95 Theses and posted them on the church of All Saints, an event now seen as sparking the Protestant Reformation. The liturgical color of the day is red, which represents the Holy Spirit and the Martyrs of the Christian Church. Luther's hymn, "A Mighty Fortress is our God" is often sung on this Sunday.



A Note from Pastor Fred RE-FORM-A-TION

At the end of this month we will start a year long celebration of the five hundredth anniversary of the Reformation. Each month will have a special bulletin insert that will tell of some interesting historical event or thought that came out of the Reformation era. ON October 30 there hill be a joint worship of Lutherans and Roman Catholics at Epiphany Lutheran Church – more information will be on the way.

What was that you said? A celebration of the Reformation that includes Roman Catholics? If you have been on this earth for more than a couple of generations, this is not something you would have dreamed about. Yet it is true. Very few Lutherans know about the concordat that was signed between Lutherans and Roman Catholics seventeen years ago which was quite historic in its agreement about justification by faith through grace apart from works of the law.

If you are a died in the wool Lutheran you might say Hurrah, we won! Not so fast. This is just the beginning of a long journey of bilateral ecumenical talks continue. On the other hand some of you might yawn and say so what. Isn't this just a lot of theological jargon between the super educated in both denominations? What difference does it make in our every day lives?

The truth is, it really does not matter what opinion anyone has. Why? Because anything that brings Christians into closer unity HAS to be the work of the Holy Spirit. Recall Jesus' great prayer at the last supper in the Gospel of John: 'That they all may be one'. I for one am not about not challenge the work of that Spirit. The real question is how willing anyone whether Lutheran or Catholic wants to keep arguing the polemics of the past. Perhaps this year is a time to realize that Re-form-a-tion is always an ongoing process that starts with ourselves and whatever thoughts or actions on our part that resists the Holy Spirit's work.

The musical chronicles the lives and work of four modern day followers of Jesus--Chief Seattle, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., Archbishop Oscar Romero and Dorothy Day--who worked for justice for all people.

Agape includes adult and children's choirs, soloists, instrumentalists and audience participation. And in order to make this truly a community event we will be inviting other churches to participate thereby bringing people of different faiths together here at St. Luke.





thank everyone that participated in the food packing project on September 10. We packaged 15,000 meals in less than two hours! And the meals went to Haiti.


Our gifts will make a difference for families and communities in need.

this Fall.




