I just saw an email expressing surprise and disbelief over the imminent arrival of August. Perhaps it's been all the rain and the relative absence of hot and sunny days which has made it seem as if this summer has flown by. Who knows? But September is just around the corner. Soon, the Grange Fair will come and go. Then, it will back to school for the kids. Then, it will be time for Sunday school and the resumption of all of our other church programming. Given all of this, it just might be a good time for each of us to review our spiritual health.

On Friday, I'll see one of my all-time favorite bands in concert. I last saw U2 in the fall of 1992. If you don't know, three of the band's four members are committed Christians. Because of their influence, I suspect, the band has a knack for writing lyrics that speak and sing on more than one level. As a case in point, U2's latest album features these lyrics: *You let me into a conversation; a conversation only we could make. You're breaking into my imagination; whatever's in there is yours to take.* What are we to make of these words?

Certainly, they can describe romantic love. Having now been married to Julia for thirteen years, I'm no longer the same person I once was. In a number of ways, I feel, see, and think differently than I did before Julia entered my life. She's most definitely *broken into my imagination and taken a lot of what was in there to take*. She's still doing it! As I hope we all know or discover, it's what love can do. But are U2's lyrics only about the transformative love two people can share with one another?

Definitely not! Later on in the song I've been writing about, come these lyrics: I'm a long way from your hill on Calvary. And I'm a long way from where I was, where I need to be. Could it be that the imagination burglar of which U2 sings is Jesus—is God—is the Holy Trinity? Most definitely so!

Through the sending of Jesus and the Spirit, through the gift of the Bible and the sacraments of Holy Baptism and Holy Communion, through the witness of congregations and individual Christians, God is forever *letting us into a deeply personal conversation; a conversation that only God and each of us can make.* Over time, this conversation can have a profound impact on who or what we imagine ourselves, others, and our world to be; eventually leading us to give more and more of ourselves over to God and God's call upon our lives. Has this happened yet? Are we to the point where God has broken into our imagination and taken everything that's there's to take?

If we're honest, we'll probably have to answer provisionally. Like the singer of U2's song, we can hopefully speak of being *a long way from where we once were*, as we also acknowledge we're *a long way from where we need to be*. It is how things are and will remain for us until God's plan in Jesus Christ comes to full and final completion. Until then, we're going to be sinners as often as we are saints and saints as often as we are sinners. But as our church prepares to return to full gear, it is nonetheless a good time to ask: *How far have I come and how far do I have yet to go?*

It is my most earnest hope and prayer that each of us will be asking and thinking and praying about the state of our spiritual journey this August. I also hope we'll commit ourselves to a course of action that will keep moving our spiritual journey ahead. Church can do an awful, awful lot for each and every one of us. Church can take us a long way from where we've been, as it also pushes us even further forward. I hope each of us discovers this anew as the year of our Lord 2015 continues to move along; sometimes more swiftly than we can believe.

Worship Services are held at 8:00 am and 10:30 am every Sunday morning. Special Services are held at Thanksgiving, Advent, Lent and Holy Week.

The 10:30 am service is a more traditional worship service with additional liturgy and hymns. - -money for shipping may also be given (It costs \$1.40 to ship each bag)






On Wednesday, October 28th, the Community Relations Committee will be holding a Stop Hunger Now Meal Packing Event. More information will be forthcoming soon.

Chocolate Chip Zucchini Muffins

1/2 cup softened butter 1/2 cup canola oil 1 3/4 cup sugar

2 eggs 1/2 cup milk 1 teaspoon vanilla

2 1/2 cups flour1/2 cup cocoa powder1 teaspoon baking soda1/2 teaspoon salt1/2 teaspoon cinnamon

2 cups shredded zucchini 1/4 cup mini chocolate chips (semi-sweet)

1/4 cup chopped pecans (optional)

Directions:

- 1) In a large bowl, cream the butter, oil and sugar until fluffy.
- 2) Beat in the eggs, milk and vanilla.
- 3) Combine the flour, cocoa, baking soda, salt and cinnamon. Gradually mix into the creamed mixture.
- 4) Fold in the zucchini and chocolate chips.
- 5) Fill greased or paper lined muffin cups two-thirds full and top with pecans.
- 6) Bake at 375 degrees for 20-25 minutes until toothpick comes out clean.

Yields approximately 2 dozen regular size muffins. They also work nicely as mini-muffins. Make multiple batches to use up that zucchini - they freeze well.
