

On **February 1st**, First Church will **welcome Bishop Gary Rivas** as our visiting Bishop as he awaits his appointment from the SC UMC Conference in June of this year.





Gary Rivas (*R-eye-vas*) was born in Johannesburg, South Africa. Early in his life, he felt a calling into ministry and led youth and young adult ministries in the church where he grew up. Gary met his wife, Jacqui in 1987, and they were married in 1992. Gary was stationed in the Germiston Mission Circuit in 1996 and then in East London from 1997-99. Jacqui was ordained into the ministry in 2003.

In 2000, Gary, Jacqui and their two children moved to the Fourways Circuit and in 2004, they planted Gracepoint Church together and

have led it from strength to strength. Gary served as the superintendent of the Fourways Circuit for eight years and was elected Bishop of the Central District in 2015.

Gary holds a Master's Degree in Theology from the University of Pretoria and is currently taking up his doctoral studies through the Wesley House at Cambridge University. He is also on the boards of Alpha South Africa and the Willow Creek Association South Africa.

Gary is the devoted father of two young adults: Rebekah who is married to Chris, and they live in Oxford, United Kingdom; and Daniel, who lives and works in Cape Town, South Africa. Both children are following in their parents' footsteps in pursuing the vocation of ministry. Gary is a biking, motor-biking, and golf enthusiast. He is a bold and dynamic speaker and preacher, a visionary leader, and a truly dedicated servant of God.

THE BAPTISM

Mark states that 'John was clothed with camel's hair, and with a girdle of a skin about his loins; and he did eat locusts and wild honey.' He was the immediate forerunner of Jesus; the son of the aged priest Zechariah and his wife Elizabeth, who was Mary's cousin. John was about three months older than Jesus. He was an ascetic; his was a wilderness ministry. The Jordan River was the main scene of his actions. The baptism of Jesus is recorded in all the Synoptic Gospels and is corroborated in John's

Gospel. John the Baptist was preaching in the wilderness of Judea, prophesying the coming of the Savior. Many came out to him from Jerusalem and other places in Judea and were baptized by him on the River Jordan. (See Matt. 3:13) John was cast into prison by Herod and ultimately beheaded to please Salome.

SHELL—In Christian symbolism, the shell denotes pilgrimage.
