### The Story of Milk: From the Cow to the Cup Lesson Plan

Curriculum: English, History and Social Science, Mathematics

Grade: K-2

**Virginia Standards of Learning:** E/W.K.8, E/W.1.1, E/W.1.7, E/W.2.7, E/W.2.8, HSS.K.6, HSS.1.7, HSS.2.7, MAT.K.3, MAT.1.5

**Objectives:** Students will understand:

- milk is the state beverage of Virginia
- how milk gets from the cow to our kitchen table
- how to practice retelling different events in the correct sequence

Time Required: 60 minutes

**Materials and Resources:** emblem picture of milk; computer with Internet access; website http://www.moomilk.com; *What Dairy Foods Did I Eat Yesterday?* worksheet; *Drink Milk Everyday* handout; and *The Story of Milk: From the Cow to the Cup* assessment flow chart (two different assessments depending on age/grade level); and answer sheet; crayons, colored pencils, and/or markers; drawing paper.

#### Procedure:

- 1. Hold up the emblem picture of milk. Explain that milk is the state beverage of Virginia.
- 2. Ask students if they had milk today with their breakfast. Do they know where that milk came from? Do any of them have cows at home? How do we get the milk we drink every day?
- 3. Have students take the online tour to find out the answers to the above questions. On the Internet, go to the website http://www.moomilk.com/virtual-tour.
- 4. Read about the different steps that are required so milk can get from the cow to them.
- 5. Have students listen to and look carefully at the steps so they can remember what happens in the correct sequence.
- 6. Have students draw the steps on separate cards. Select several students to stand in front of the class (remember to stand them out of order) and have the class put the pictures in the correct order. Students can also be placed in groups, be assigned a step, and create and practice the order with other groups.
- 7. Students can also use body motions to recreate the steps.

#### Assessment:

1. Use the flow chart provided with this lesson for assessment. It shows the events from the online tour, but the key words for each event are left blank. Students can fill in the blanks with the words and place the pictures in the correct order.

#### **Extension:**

- 1. Students can review the frequently asked questions on the website and take the online quiz.
- 2. Explain the food groups. Use the handouts provided to test student knowledge on diary products.










### **Drink Milk Everyday**


