

# The Pastor's Report

To the Church at Canton, blessings & peace upon you,

Holy Cow! WOW! Gee Willikers!?!, Sweet Lord! OMGosh! Sakes Alive! No Way!

Way! I find myself in an astounded state of mind sitting here this morning writing these words to you. THERE IS SO MUCH HAPPENING AT THIS CHURCH! I'm having a bit of a hard time wrapping my mind, not to mention arms, around it.

I mean, let's be honest. In this day and age, in a town this size, we should be a sleepy little church content to rouse ourselves from slumber once a week on Sunday morning, then promptly nod back off. Conventional wisdom says we should be engaged in a slow, steady decline, trending toward increasing insignificance. After 20 years of ministry, my job should be getting easier, not harder; certainly not busier. And yet, the evidence is clear. The pace is definitely picking up, there seems to be more that matters most, the ripples in the pond greater, there is less time in the day to get it all done and the tasks at hand are larger, deeper, juicier.

Where to begin? At the beginning, I suppose. From day one, the motif I've most employed and felt comfortable with here in my ministry is that of the journey. So much of that imagery has to do with the start of the journey and the process of the journey. In my mind I once imagined a noble, solitary traveler, but now I look around and I see more of a long traveling circus, a caravan stretching beyond the horizon, an irrepressible Chautauqua (Google it), a pilgrimage being made *en masse*. The garden that is our church once consisted of a few glorious and well tended blooms, now we are a riot of color consisting of a wide diversity of blossoms oozing of verdant life, flowering at different moments all of the time.

"Whew!" You say. "Take a moment Rev. Mike, get it together." I say, here is what crossed my desk/office/computer this week; i.e., what's happening/in the works: floors stripped and waxed (Fellowship Hall and Foyer, looks terrific), new Elders and Deacons (with several first time Elders), new Members (4 and counting), new Hymnals being dedicated (the third such time since I've been in Canton), monthly newsletter, Spaghetti Dinner Fundraiser, Cocktails and Canvas Fundraiser, new baptisms, C&CP, All Church Read, community service worker at the church, Bunny Making Workshop for the Church School kids, Women's Worship, New Member Class, One Great Hour of Sharing, Canton Clergy discussions, Holy Week Planning, Presbytery Trustees Meeting prep (investments, Chapel Island Insurance) Patridge Knoll Service prep, Elder and Deacon Ordination/Installation, pastoral visits, counseling, Session Docket, Deacons meeting and, of course, the most important thing we do as a church...care for one another. This weekend we will hold memorial services for Wes Stitt and Betty Peckham, and endeavor to support the Stitt and Peckham families in both in this time of grief and loss, and as they remember and celebrate their beloved.

I'm not sure, exactly, how one measures "success" in a church. Busyness is not a virtue, but vitality certainly is; particularly as it relates to lives engaged, sustain, and changed.

#### **Session Report**

Session met on **Monday**, **January 29th**. A replacement will be needed for **Janet Still** who is stepping down as a representative to the **Church & Community Board**. **Rev**. **David Bennett** will fill in when Rev. Mike is away on February 11th. A **New Member Class** will be held soon. **Four** people have expressed interest in joining the church. A **confirmation class** also will be held soon.

It was reported that **\$104,000** has been raised for the restoration of the **park fountain** and, if funds allow, work on the **trees**. Elders **JJ Jockel** and **Lyles Trombly** will be working together on the improvements at the church funded by the **Greener Church** initiative. Church Treasurer **Diane Ladison** has scheduled a meeting with **Phil Elvy** to begin transfer of her responsibilities over to him.

**120 new hymnals** have arrived. Aimee is adding the **dedicatory plates**. It was agreed to use **\$1,000** from the memorial fund to buy **60** more, including spiral bound ones for the piano and organ if funds have not been donated already.

The **Stewardship Drive** has good results with **eight** new pledges which puts us ahead of last year. New folks coming to the church were noted along with those is need of prayer.

Elder **Bill Parker** said that, according to the computer, we own over 6,000 books in the **Church Library**. It was agreed that Bill will cull the collection, put unwanted books in the rummage sale, and put the rest in the church library.

Elder **Bill Parker** asked whether our church **Food Pantry** is still running. Rev. Mike said that with the C&CP doing so well, we have not needed the food pantry

as much, but agreed that it was important to have some **basic supplies** on hand for the needy. There is money available. Bill said he would take care of restocking and organizing.

**Barry Walch** and the personnel committee will do the **yearly evaluation** of staff. **Pastor Donna's** terms of call were approved for another year. The Sexual Harassment Policy was endorsed. **Sarah Melville** was appointed as Clerk of the

Session with **Wanda Renick** as Assistant Clerk. Rev. Mike was authorized to give **communion** to the homebound every month with the aid of a Deacon.



The **floors** in Fellowship Hall, the kitchen, upstairs hallway, bathroom, and foyer will be **stripped**, **cleaned** and **waxed** at the cost of \$1,500. **Rich Grayson** replaced two of the floodlights in the sanctuary with **LED bulbs**, and would like to replace the rest. It was agreed that some of the "Greener Church" money would be used to buy the bulbs, which cost \$35 each. The **mission budget** was approved with minor adjustments. It was noted that Barry Walch is still owed for his work for the **manse kitchen**. Motion approved to pay him.

Copies of the **All-Church Read**, *The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane*, will be purchased by the church and distributed to families with young children. Along with that, the church is covering the cost for **Ellen MacMaster** to make stuffed rabbits for the Sunday School children.

Session will next meet on February 26th.


