

A NEW TERM, A NEW SCHEDULE: OG INTRODUCES POWER HOUR

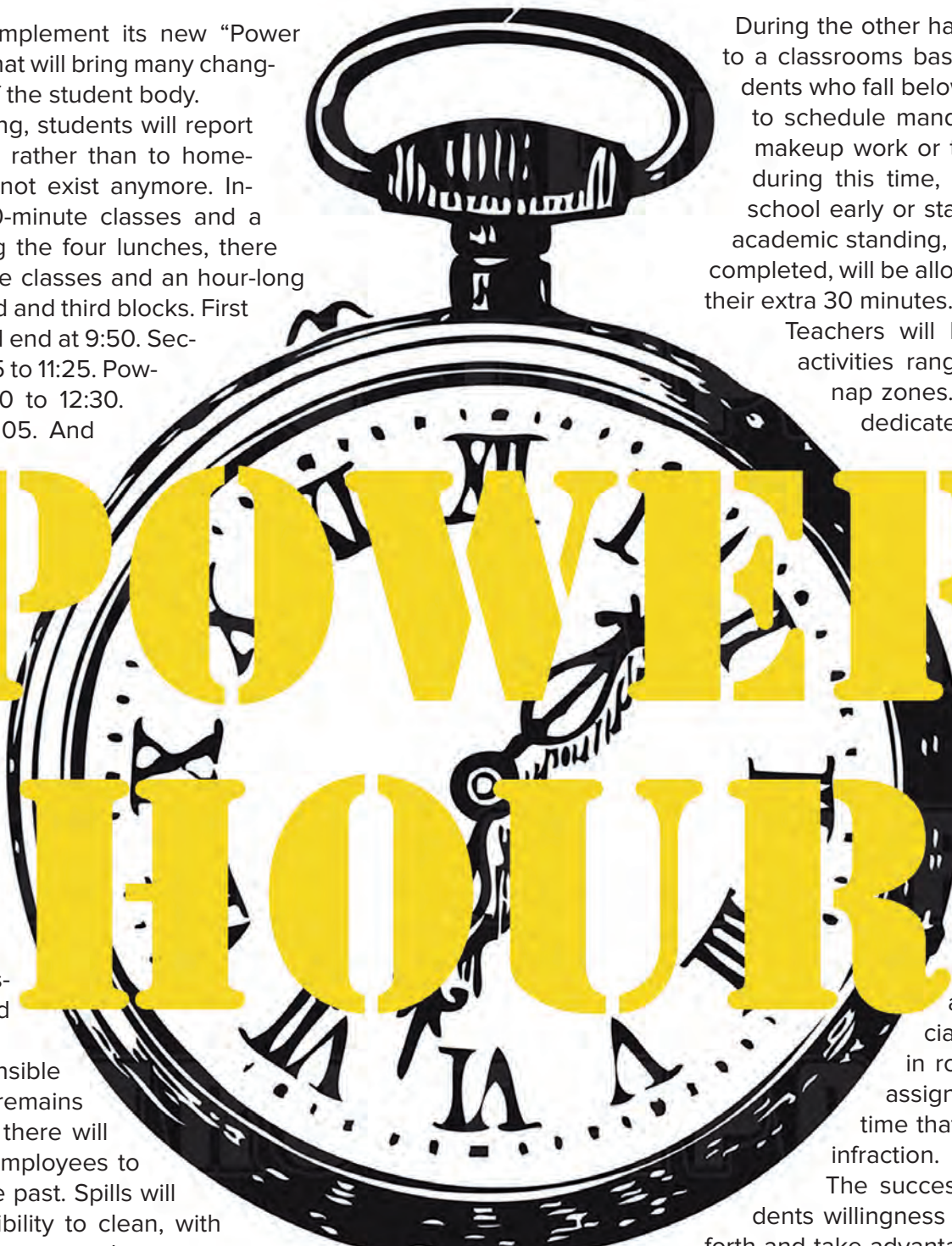
Oak Grove High will implement its new “Power Hour” today. This new format will bring many changes to the daily schedule of the student body.

Beginning in the morning, students will report immediately to first block rather than to homeroom, as homeroom will not exist anymore. Instead of having three 90-minute classes and a 130-minute class including the four lunches, there will now be four 90-minute classes and an hour-long “break” in between second and third blocks. First block will begin at 8:15 and end at 9:50. Second block will be from 9:55 to 11:25. Power Hour will be from 11:30 to 12:30. Third block is 12:35 to 2:05. And Fourth block is 2:10 to 3:40.

One of the most affected aspects due to this change in schedule is the way lunches will work. There will no longer be four separate lunches. Instead students will either go to lunch during the first or last half of the Power Hour. To accommodate for these changes, students may choose to eat in the lunchroom or in designated classrooms called “cafes.”

Students will be responsible for clearing their food remains and trash themselves, as there will be no time for cafeteria employees to do this as they have in the past. Spills will be the students’ responsibility to clean, with any needed assistance from an employee.

POWER HOUR



During the other half of Power Hour students will report to a classrooms based on their academic standing. Students who fall below a certain average will be contacted to schedule mandatory tutoring. If students have any makeup work or tests to complete, it will be done so during this time, eliminating the need for coming to school early or staying late. Students who are in good academic standing, and do not have makeup work to be completed, will be allowed to choose where they will spend their extra 30 minutes.

Teachers will have rooms designated for certain activities ranging from study halls to coloring to nap zones. Eventually, there will be classrooms dedicated to playing old TV shows, Disney movies, or board games. This hour will also eventually be a new meeting time for school clubs. Teachers will now have office hours on certain days during the week and will be posted outside of each teacher’s classroom. Other options that are available are ACT Prep classes, life skills classes, and more will be rolled out as Power Hour progresses.

One thing students have to remember is that Power Hour is a privilege that can be taken away at any moment. Students who misuse Power Hour will lose the privilege and opportunities it provides. A special Power Hour detention will be held in room D115. Infractioning students will be assigned to this detention for an amount of time that will be directly proportionate to the infraction.

The success of Power Hour relies on the students willingness and ability to abide by the rules set forth and take advantage of this opportunity that has been provided to them.

TRUMP’S TRAVEL BAN CASE DISMISSED BY SUPREME COURT

The Trump administration has gained a sizable victory as the Supreme Court recently dismissed the case concerning the President’s temporary travel ban on Muslim-majority countries. Recall earlier this year when President Trump issued a controversial ban on six countries for an interim of time. Many states fought the proclamation in court, and the case was eventually taken to the Supreme Court due to a possible violation of the First Amendment, which guarantees freedom of religion in the United States of America.

Trump issued a second execu-

tive order on September 24 that overrode his temporary ban. This new order created an indefinite ban on eight Muslim-majority countries. On October 10 the Supreme Court dismissed the case concerning the temporary ban in an official statement saying they considered the situation to “no longer present a ‘live case or controversy.’”

Though the initial case has been abandoned, the administration is not in the clear. Many aspects of the indefinite ban from last month are still in question, and many states have already refiled their suits, this time against the indefinite ban. The constitutionality of the ban -whether it violates the freedom of religion

clause of the First Amendment- is again in question. Also in question is whether Trump has the power to issue such an order; does allowing this ban provide Trump with too much power?

This ruling basically puts everyone back at square one. New cases will be heard at the local level but are expected to quickly rise to the national level once again. Hearings concerning the new ban will be held throughout the rest of October and the rest of the year. It is highly likely the controversy concerning Trump’s executive orders is far from over. Only time will tell if his orders will hold up in a court of law.

HURRICANE MARIA DEVASTATES PUERTO RICO

Puerto Rico is struggling to recover from the catastrophic damages caused by Hurricane Maria. The island was slammed for several days by Hurricane Maria, a category five and category four hurricane. Wind speeds of almost 150 mph caused damages throughout Puerto Rico, but it was the flooding and surges were most devastating.

Puerto Rico is receiving an enormous amount of help from the US by transporting families across the Gulf of Mexico and into Florida. The disaster has left nearly 92 percent of the population without power. The massive loss of power throughout Puerto Rico has made rescues and recoveries much harder tasks.

Rescue teams are still looking for missing people. Hurricane Maria's death toll has reached 34 in Puerto Rico alone.

President Trump stated that he wanted to "wipe out" Puerto Rico's debt of \$74 billion to help the territory recover from the disaster. Clearing Puerto Rico's debt is a controversial topic as it financially has both advantages and disadvantages. Puerto Rico's main debt comes from an accumulation of debts from Wall Street.

Many people see this as an unconstitutional method of aiding Puerto Rico. The way the US helps Puerto Rico is publically crucial because people continue to agree that the US is practicing modern colonization by asserting authority over the territory. Not only would it cost the US \$74 billion, but it would also entrust the territory with forming a new and dependable system of recovery mostly on their own.

LAS VEGAS SHOOTING WORST IN US HISTORY

At the annual Route 91 Country Music Festival, 64 year old Stephen Paddock fired into a crowd of 22,000 people from the 32nd floor of the Mandalay Bay Resort and Casino, killing 59 and injuring 530. Las Vegas Police initially tried to breach Paddock's Suite, however, Paddock fired at first responders, forcing them to call SWAT teams for backup. When SWAT teams arrived at the Suite, Paddock was found dead from a self-inflicted gunshot wound.

Authorities recovered 23 firearms

from Paddock's room, including a handgun, assault rifles, and a rifle modified to shoot fully automatic rounds. Ammonium nitrate, a very powerful compound used in explosives, was found in Paddock's vehicle. Upon searching Paddock's home in Mesquite, Nevada, 19 more firearms were discovered.

Although no clear motive for the attack has been found, Clark County Sheriff Joseph Lombardo stated that the attack was "obviously premeditated." Eric Paddock, brother of the gunman, told authorities that his brother had no history of mental illness or violence, although he noted that his

brother was a frequent gambler. An employee at the Mandalay Bay Resort and Casino revealed that Paddock gambled for eight hours straight on the night before the attack. It was also discovered that Paddock was recently prescribed the anti-anxiety medication Diazepam, better known as Valium.

Paddock's girlfriend, 62 year old Marilou Danley, who was in the Philippines on the night of the shooting, arrived to the US on Tuesday to meet with the FBI for questioning. Authorities believe Paddock acted alone in the attack, which is the deadliest mass shooting in modern US history.

Alexander, of Foxworth, died from injuries after a shooting on October 6 that also left the suspect, Handy Anthony Willis Jr., injured. Willis was charged October 10 and is still recovering from injuries at Forrest General Hospital. Once released from the hospital Willis will be arrested immediately.

NFL RATINGS TAKE A KNEE: REACH RECORD LOW

The National Football League (NFL) has recorded its lowest ratings this season. "Sunday Night Football" dropped 3 percent in ratings this week, following a match between undefeated Kansas City Chiefs and the Houston Texans.

ESPN's "Monday Night Football" featured the Minnesota Vikings versus the Chicago Bears, and the highly anticipated trailer for Star Wars: The Last Jedi at halftime. Although the game was expected to draw high numbers, ratings dropped 17 percent, marking a season low.

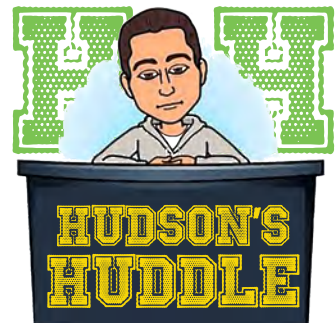
President Trump has bashed the NFL for allowing its players to kneel during The National Anthem and directly attributes the decline in ratings to this controversy.

NFL Commissioner Robert Goodell, who has supported players kneeling during The National Anthem, sent a letter to NFL executives on Tuesday encouraging players to move on from the controversy stating, "Like many of our fans, we believe that everyone should stand for the National Anthem. It is an important moment in our game. We want to honor our flag and our country, and our fans expect that of us."

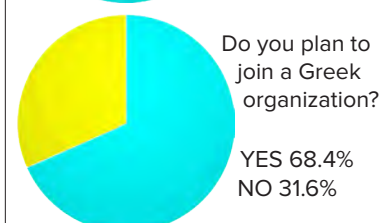
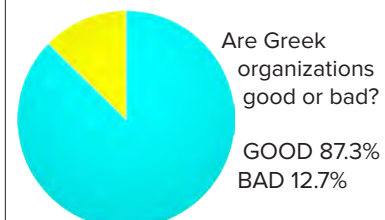

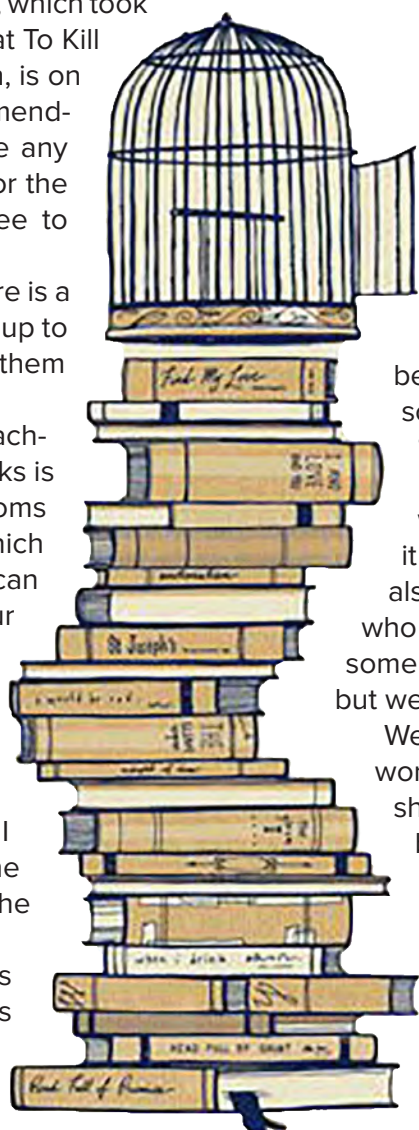

As an avid reader, I realize some books do have questionable content, but it is strictly up to readers whether or not we want to continue reading the book. If my favorite book were to be banned, I

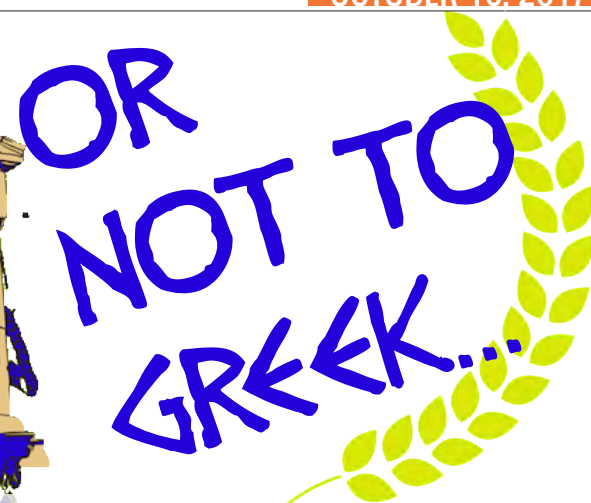


a

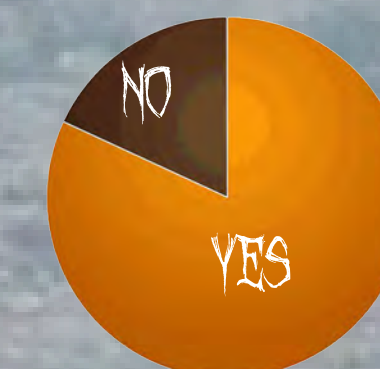

Looking for review time during school hours?

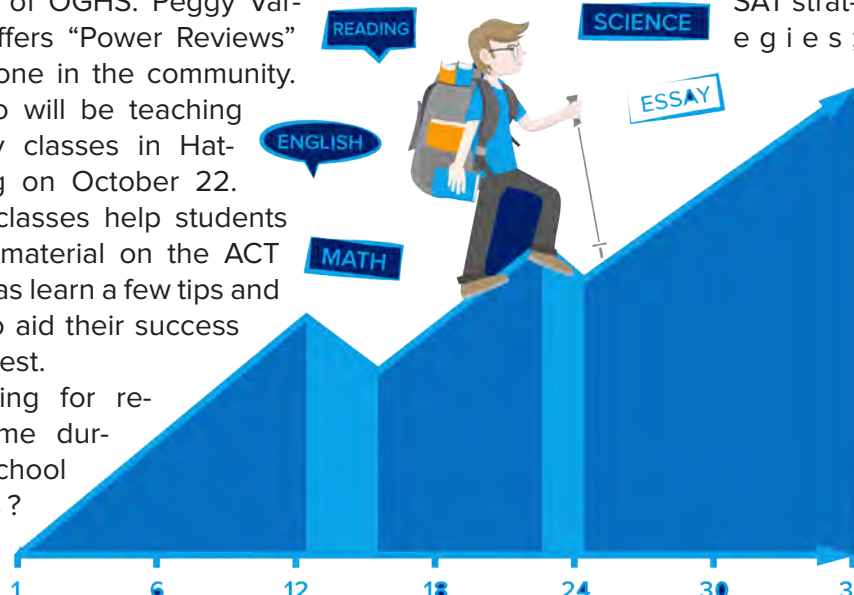
OGHS offers

Bennie freehands the designs, while merely looking at the covers.

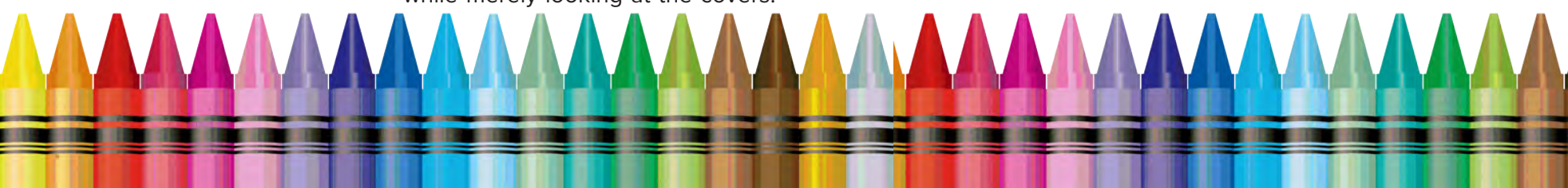

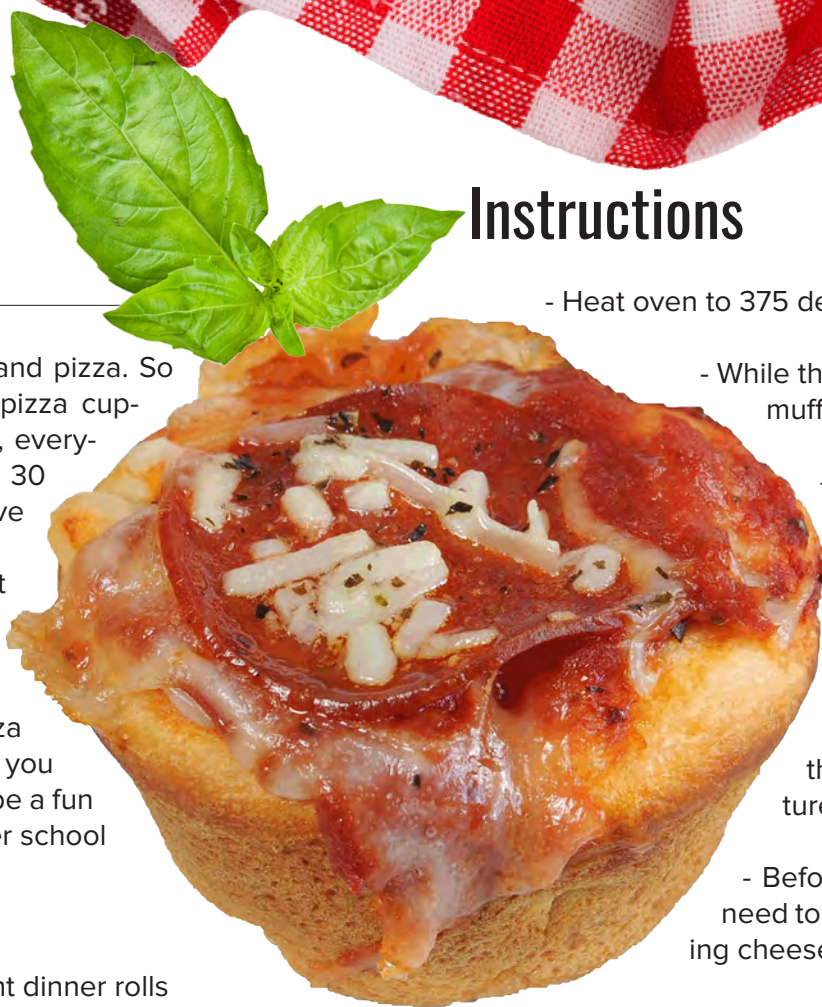

Pretty much everyone loves cupcakes and pizza. So why not put them together and make a pizza cupcake? This recipe is super quick and easy, everyone will love them! It will only take about 30 minutes total to prep and cook, with only five ingredients.

One great thing about this recipe is that if you don't like the "toppings", or in this case stuffing then you can make it into your own. You could just make cheese pizza cupcakes or even a supreme pizza cupcake, this recipe can be altered to how you like your pizza. These pizza cupcakes can be a fun game day appetizers and even a quick after school

Ingredients

- 1 can (8 oz) Pillsbury refrigerated crescent dinner rolls
- ½ cup pizza sauce
- ¼ cup mini pepperoni slices (If you can't find minis then just get larger pepperonis and slice into fourths.)
- ¼ lb. mild Italian sausage, cooked and drained
- ½ cup shredded mozzarella cheese (2 oz)



Instructions

- Heat oven to 375 degrees fahrenheit.
- While the oven is heating, spray eight regular-size muffin cup pan with cooking spray.
- After you spray your pan, unroll dough and separate the eight triangles
- Press each triangle into a muffin cup.
- Then in a small bowl, you'll mix the pizza sauce, pepperoni slices, sausage, and just ¼ cup of the shredded cheese together, then spoon about 2 tablespoon of the mixture into each dough-lined cup.
- Before they're ready to go into the oven, you'll need to sprinkle each with 1 teaspoon of the remaining cheese
- Finally they will need to bake for 16 to 18 minutes, or until they are golden brown and the cheese is melted.
- Immediately remove your pizza cupcakes from the cups and let them cool before serving.

1962: The Cuban Missile Crisis begins as John F. Kennedy learns of missiles in Cuba. Kennedy placed a naval blockade around Cuba to prevent the Soviets from bringing in more military supplies. The Soviets eventually dismantled the weapon sites; in exchange, the United States remained out of Cuba. In a separate deal, the United States also agreed to remove its nuclear missiles from Turkey.



1859: Abolitionist John Brown lead a group on a raid against the federal armory in Harpers Ferry, Virginia. On this night, 157 years ago, Brown took control of the arsenal. Word of the raid spread, and by morning Brown and his men were surrounded by a company of U.S. Marines, led by Colonel Robert E. Lee. On the morning of October 19, Lee's men overran Brown and his followers, killing two of his sons and eight other men.



1998: Former Chilean dictator General Augusto Pinochet is arrested in London on a Spanish warrant for his extradition to stand trial for 'crimes of genocide and terrorism'. JONBENET RAMSEY'S FATHER SUES CBS

The murder of JonBenet has become one of the most perennial murder mystery cases in recent American history.

Court records show John Ramsey, father of JonBenet, filed a lawsuit against CBS Corporation and those involved in the two-part documentary of the six year old's death. The special, aired in September 2016, called "The Case Of: JonBenet Ramsey," furthers supports the notion that the child beauty pageant star was murdered by her older brother Burke. The documentary recreates the Ramsey's home and highlights evidence that caused the public to point fingers at Burke, who was nine years old at the time.

On December 26, 1996 JonBenet Ramsey's body was found assaulted and strangled in the basement of her

family's home in Boulder, Colorado. Patsy Ramsey, mother and also previous child beauty pageant queen, discovered a lengthy ransom note inside the family home. John found JonBenet's beaten body in the home's basement approximately eight hours after the child was proclaimed missing.

The death was ruled as a homicide in 1996, but resulted in no charges being pressed. The autopsy report stated that the six year-old suffered from a broken skull, but her cause of death was "asphyxia by strangulation associated with craniocerebral trauma."

Ramsey's \$750 million suit, filed last December, reopens the case after the 20 year anniversary of the child's death. Burke also filed a \$150 million defamation lawsuit against CBS Corporation when the special was broadcasted.
