## Marching On

It is difficult for me to believe it, but we have lived here in Greenville for almost two years now. Greenville seems so much like home that it feels like we've lived here forever. I still marvel at how bumpy the rest of the state is, and when I am gone from here, I can't wait to get back to the flatlands. I hope that it is not too presumptuous, but I consider myself a real deltan. The warmth and acceptance we have experienced here has been the reason for that. Thank you.

In much the same way that the past two years have flown by, our Lenten observance has been passing quickly, and Holy Week will soon be here. Our schedule will be very similar to last year's. It begins with Palm Sunday. We will have one service that day at 10:30, gathering in the courtyard chapel, weather permitting. We will then process into the nave together. During the service, we will have the reading of the Passion Gospel. I am always struck by the contrast between the crowd shouting "Hosannah" one moment and "Crucify him" the next.

On Thursday in Holy Week, we will have our Maundy Thursday service at 5:30. We will have the ceremony of washing feet as part of this service. Our Good Friday observance will take place at noon the next day. Good Friday is a continuation of Maundy Thursday. Events culminate with the Great Vigil of Easter on Saturday at 7:30 (we have to wait for sundown to start). Bring your bells - cow, dinner, or otherwise - to ring at the proclamation of Easter during the service. On Sunday morning we will have one service at 10:30 to celebrate the First Sunday of Easter.

I hope that you will make every effort to attend all of the Holy Week services. We work very hard to make them meaningful and appropriate. It is easy to talk oneself out of attending one or more of them, but I encourage you to make the effort. The Great Vigil has not lasted more than sixty-five minutes since I have been here, so you can't use that as an excuse:). I believe that you will find that your efforts to attend will be rewarded.

There is a lot going on during March here at St. James', and I find that a busy church is a happy church. I love that there is always something going around here. I also really appreciate your care and concern during my illness last week. I really hated to miss church and having to cancel out on our Wednesday activities, but I am feeling much better now and am raring to go. We have a lot to do.

#### WORLD DAY OF PRAYER 2016

World Day of Prayer is a worldwide ecumenical movement of Christian women of many traditions who come together to observe a common day of prayer each year on the first Friday in March. World Day of Prayer was founded on the idea that prayer and action are inseparable. Services begin at sunrise in the Pacific and

follow the sun across the globe on the day of celebration. Each year a different country's committee serves as the writers of the World Day of Prayer worship service.

Happening #83 & Happening #83 Reunion Fri., Mar. 4 – Sun., Mar. 6


St. James Episcopal Church, Jackson, MS
