
Our Vision

Why choose our 6th Form?







An extra-curricular course - designed to improve your chances of employment.

We will strive to work with each student to ensure that they have the skills needed to pursue their life goals, including school leadership opportunities.

Students will have 1 lesson a week for assembly or 'personal development'. Topics covered include:

- Voting
- Learning to drive
- Mortgages
- Saving money
- Interview and CV writing
- Careers education and guidance

Additionally, students will have 2 lessons a week (double period) where they will choose between:

- Sport
- · Community service within the school
- Completing additional courses towards UCAS points

Employability Development











- Each student will sign a 'Learning Agreement' ensuring that they know and understand our expectations. We expect our students to uphold the highest standards in engagement and attitude.
- Students will be expected to attend 5 days a week from 8.50am until 3.20pm:
 - scheduled lessons
 - study periods, assemblies, community service, sport and silent study.
- Student dress code is 'smart casual' with natural hair colour.
- Each student will have computer access.

Expectations





Our sixth Form offers the following pathways:

- 1. A level. Designed for students who have achieved (or expect to achieve) a minimum of 5 grade 5 GCSEs (including English and mathematics).
- 2. Combined A level & vocational. Suitable for students who have achieved (or expect to achieve) a minimum of 5 grade 4 GCSEs (including English and mathematics).
- **3. Vocational only.** Followed by students who have achieved (or expect to achieve) fewer than 5 grade 4 GCSEs.

Each subject has its own entry requirements. These can be found in the 'prospectus' document on the school website.

The 16-19 Bursary Fund is a scheme to help students facing financial hardship to continue in full time education after year 11. To qualify:

- A student must be aged 16 and under 19 on the 31 August at the start of the academic year in which he/she starts a study programme;
- They must also be on a full-time study programme.

You will have an formal meeting with a member of The Wren School staff prior to an offer letter that will be sent to you on the 1st March 2021.
