November Newsletter



Minutes of the Star Quilters Guild Monthly Meeting on October 7, 2019

President Judy McWhorter called our meeting to order at 7:02. She began our meeting by welcoming us, and then made a few announcements, followed by our program, business meeting and Show and Tell.

Announcements

Convergence Quilt Class: Susan Kraterfield will teach another Convergence Quilt Class on Saturday October 26. A signup sheet is available. The fee for the class is \$5.00. November Meeting Program: We will have a Members Yard Sale in November. The table fee is \$15; individual members keep the proceeds from the sale of their items. December Challenges: Those who wish to participate will bring their Virginia Challenge quilts showing what they love about Virginia for display (no size limitations) and their Trading Cards $(2.5 \times 3.5 \text{ inches})$ for exchange.

Member Updates: Congratulations to Gisela O'Connor for her recent Naturalization. Nell Townley's spouse passed away recently. Martha Akers' spouse has been admitted to VA Hospice.

Program

Program Chair Dawn Schaben introduced our speaker, Augusta Cole, a Virginia quilter and past President of the Virginia Consortium of Quilters. Augusta's presentation style is high energy and witty, which must have served her well in her prior occupation as a Health and PE teacher. Augusta likes scrappy quilts; her motto is "Variety is the Spice of Life". Her scrappy quilts are not totally random, however, as she auditions fabrics to be placed side-by-side. She suggested storing our fabrics to suit ourselves. For her, this means cutting squares of 4.5, 2.5, 2 and 1.5 inches to keep on hand. She offered some advice for cutting strips of several fabrics at once: stack fabrics with the selvages offset; measure with the cutting ruler, not the mat; use the side of your non-cutting hand to anchor the ruler on the fabrics; and walk your hand along the ruler as you cut. Augusta is able to rotary cut with both hands, and she uses a small-blade rotary because it fits her hand better. To set up her machine for sewing scant quarter-inch seams, Augusta uses the Perfect Piecing Seam Guide to determine where to place a post-it note

or tape where the edge of the fabric needs to be as she sews. Her favorite thread is Presensia 60-weight, which she uses as both top and bottom thread. She presses seams using a wool mat and a dry iron. Augusta brought some of her quilts to share with us. She also shared some great advice: Plan your work and work your plan. Perfect practice makes perfect quality. Slow down and enjoy your project.

Business Meeting

- One soldier quilts and 22 comfort quilts were turned in. More kits are available, including snowball kits.
- Hospitality Chair Gisela O'Connor announced the October birthdays.
- Membership Chair Jennifer Adams reported that 68 members, four guests, and one new member were in attendance.
- Ways and Means reported an income of \$171 from the Ways and Means table sales. Free books are available on the table. We will not have a Ways and Means table at the November and December meetings.
- Program Chair Dawn Schaben announced that our November program will be our Member Yard Sale. December is our annual Holiday Social.
- Special Events chair Cathy Russell announced that she is planning another retreat for September 2020.


