Lenny Leibowitz (Artistic Director) is entering his fourth year as a member of the Otterbein Theatre faculty. Since his arrival in Westerville, Lenny has directed *My Fair Lady, Into the Woods, Clybourne Park, Brighton Beach Memoirs, Top Girls,* and *Fiddler on the Roof.* As founding artistic director of Marvell Rep, OffBroadway, Lenny directed 11 productions, including *The Threepenny Opera,* which received a Drama Desk nomination for Best Revival of a Musical. Other New York directing credits include the world premiere of Brian Yorkey's *Making Tracks,* which ran Off-Broadway at Rockefeller Center's Taipei Theater. Lenny has directed at some of the nation's leading regional theatres, including the Olney Theatre, the National Players, the Huntington Theatre's Breaking Ground Festival, and the New Harmony Theatre, where he was artistic director for four years, staging *Amadeus, The School for Scandal, Guys and Dolls, A Streetcar Named Desire, The Crucible,* and *Much Ado About Nothing,* among others. A Philadelphia native, he made his professional debut as a piano soloist with the Philadelphia Orchestra. He received his B.A. from Columbia University and his M.F.A. from Boston University. Member, SDC and AEA.

Melissa Lusher (Director) is thrilled to return to OST, having previously directed *Invention of Theater* and *The Nerd* in past seasons. She teaches acting, speech, and dialects in the Department of Theatre and Dance at Otterbein University, where she also serves as the Director of the Acting Area and the resident speech/dialects coach for all productions. She holds an M.F.A. in Acting from the combined program of Carnegie Mellon University and the Moscow Art Theatre in Russia, and a B.F.A. in Acting from Carnegie Mellon. Her directorial debut production of *Spring Awakening* at Otterbein was named one of the Best 10 Shows of 2012 by The Columbus Dispatch. Other Otterbein directing credits include *The Crucible, RENT, The Greeks: The Murders,* and *No Exit.* This fall, Melissa has the double honor of directing *Rumors* and playing her dream role of Martha in *Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf*? (both at Otterbein). She extends her deepest gratitude to the entire company of *They're Playing Our Song* for their creativity and commitment. Much love to the two who play her favorite song... her husband, Joe, and her son, Lucas.

Dennis Davenport (Musical Director) is Chairperson of the Department of Music at Otterbein University. In addition to administrative work, he teaches theory and musical theatre history, directs the Otterbein Singers, and, with colleague Jim Bates, leads the Otterbein Vienna travel course in May. Recent production work includes *A Grand Night for Singing* and *The All Night Strut* for Otterbein Summer Theatre. Davenport has collaborated with his spouse, Sarah Davenport, in the creation of two one-act operas, the second of which, *First Encounters: Berthe Morisot Meets Edouard Manet* (An Opera? A Musical?) was produced by Otterbein Opera Theatre in April 2016. Other original work includes scores for Brecht's *Galileo* at the University of Michigan, and for Brecht's *Caucasian Chalk Circle* at Otterbein. Davenport's degrees include an A.B. in Music from Princeton University, a M.Mus. in Choral Conducting from Austin Peay State University in Tennessee, and a D.M.A. in Composition from the University of Oregon.

Stella Hiatt Kane (Choreographer) is the Director of Musical Theatre and Director of Dance at Otterbein University and the founding Artistic Director of JazzMet. Ms. Kane has been a member of the national companies of Sugar and Bob Fosse's *Dancin'* and a member of the national and international companies of *The American Dance Machine*. She has made television appearances in productions such as PBS' "Dance

In America" and "The Ann Reinking Special" with Ann Reinking, Chita Rivera and Ben Vereen. Ms. Kane has taught for New York's American Dance Machine/Harkness House and the Actors' and Directors' Lab. She has been a visiting guest artist/teacher at several universities including The Ohio State University and New York University and has been a master teacher in residence at the Northern Ballet Theatre in Leeds, England. Ms. Kane has also been a guest choreographer for Columbus Dance Theatre and BalletMet.

Rob Johnson (Scenic Designer) is a full professor and the Director of Design/ Technology in the Department of Theatre & Dance at Otterbein University. He has been a designer and professor at Otterbein for 29 years, joining the faculty in1987. His undergraduate degree is from Bowling Green State University. He also holds two master's degrees, one from West Virginia University where he studied scenic design, and the other from the Ohio State University where he earned his M.F.A. in lighting design. He has free-lanced professionally as a scenic and lighting designer for many years working with other universities and professional companies. He has designed lighting and scenery for much of his career, most recently designing the set for Otterbein's musical hits, My Fair Lady and Damn Yankees. Lighting designs include work for Ballet Met, Denison University, Ohio State University and Ohio Weslevan University. He was also a pioneer in the use of 3D computer modeling and animation for scenic design and authored an interactive CD-ROM on "Basic Lighting Technology for the Theatre," published worldwide through First Light Video, out of Venice, CA. He gives thanks to his Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ for all of his many opportunities and blessings.

Tatjana Longerot (Costume Designer) is an Assistant Professor of Drama at Kenyon College. She received an M.F.A. degree in Design for the Stage from The Ohio State University. There she was awarded two of six USITT Peggy Ezekiel Awards for excellent and outstanding achievement in the theatre arts. Andy Baker (Lighting Designer) is celebrating his tenth season with Otterbein Summer Theatre and he is humbled and excited to be back. 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ABOUT THE WRITERS

Neil Simon (Playwright) American playwright and screenwriter Neil Simon is widely regarded as one of the most successful, prolific and performed playwrights in the world. In addition to Lost In Yonkers, which won a Tony Award and Pulitzer Prize, his plays and musicals include Come Blow Your Horn, Little Me, Barefoot in the Park, The Odd Couple, Sweet Charity, The Star-Spangled Girl, Plaza Suite, Promises, Promises, Last of the Red Hot Lovers, The Gingerbread Lady, The Prisoner of Second Avenue, The Sunshine Boys, The Good Doctor, God's Favorite, California Suite, Chapter Two, They're Playing Our Song, I Ought to be in Pictures, Fools, Brighton Beach Memoirs, Biloxi Blues, The Odd Couple (female version), Broadway Bound, Rumors, Jake's Women, The Goodbye Girl, Laughter on the 23rd Floor, London Suite, Proposals, Hotel Suite, The Dinner Party, 45 Seconds from Broadway, Oscar and Felix, and Rose's Dilemma. Mr. Simon has received more Academy and Tony nominations than any other writer. Awards he has received include the Pulitzer Prize for Lost In Yonkers, Emmy Awards for The Sid Caesar Show and The Phil Silvers Show, Tony Awards for and a special Tony Award For Overall Contribution To The Theatre. His nominations include Tony Award Nominations for Little Me, Barefoot in the Park, Plaza Suite, Promises, Promises, The Last of the Red Hot Lovers, Brighton Beach Memoirs, Broadway Bound, Lost in Yonkers and The Goodbye Girl (musical).

Marvin Hamlisch (Composer) As composer, Hamlisch won virtually every major award that exists: three Oscars, four Grammys, four Emmys, a Tony and three Golden Globe awards. For Broadway, he wrote the music for his groundbreaking show, A Chorus Line, which received the Pulitzer Prize as well as They're Playing Our Song, The Goodbye Girl and Sweet Smell of Success. (He also wrote the musical scores for: Jean Seberg (1983 National Theatre, London) and Nutty Professor Musical (2012 TPAC, Nashville, TN) - These two musicals have never been produced on Broadway. He was the composer of more than forty motion picture scores including his Oscar-winning score and song for The Way We Were and his adaptation of Scott Joplin's music for The Sting, for which he received a third Oscar. His prolific output of scores for films include original compositions and/or musical adaptations for Sophie's Choice, Ordinary People, The Swimmer, Three Men and a Baby, Ice Castles, Take the Money and Run, Bananas, Save the Tiger and The Informant!, starring Matt Damon and directed by Steven Soderbergh. At the time of his passing, he had just finished his last musical score for film. The film, Liberace - Behind The Candelabra, was shown at the 2013 Cannes Festival and aired on HBO in May 2013 to great reviews. Hamlisch was a graduate of the Juilliard School of Music and Queens College, where he earned a Bachelor of Arts degree. He believed in the power of music to bring people together.

Carole Bayer Sager (Lyricist) Composer Carole Bayer Sager enjoyed one of the longest hit streaks in contemporary pop, with her chart success spanning across several decades. Born March 8, 1947, in New York City, she wrote her first songs while attending New York's High School of Music and Art during the early '60s; discovered by producer Don Kirshner, she signed to his Screen Gems publishing company and in 1966 authored her first hit, the Mindbenders' oft-covered "A Groovy Kind of Love." After penning a number of songs for the Monkees, Sager wrote the lyrics for the 1970 off-Broadway hit *Georgy*; in 1975, she co-wrote "Midnight Blue" with singer Melissa Manchester, who took the song into the Top Ten. They later reunited on the smash "Don't Cry Out Loud." Sager's own recording career was launched two years later, when she issued her self-titled debut LP on Elektra; the album scored a

British hit with the single "You're Moving Out Today." After writing Leo Sayer's chart-topping "When I Need You," Sager teamed with her husband, the celebrated composer Marvin Hamlisch, to write the popular Broadway musical They're Playing Our Song, an autobiographical work exploring the romantic entanglements of a hit songwriting team. The couple later scored an Oscar nomination for "Nobody Does It Better," the theme to the James Bond thriller The Spy Who Loved Me and a number two hit for singer Carly Simon. In 1981, Sager notched her biggest American solo hit with the single "Stronger Than Before," from her third LP, Sometimes Late at Night. She remained far better known as a writer, however, and after her marriage to Hamlisch ended, she began working with the brilliant Burt Bacharach, earning an Academy Award for 1981's "Arthur's Theme (Best That You Can Do)," a number one smash for Christopher Cross. A year later, Sager and Bacharach were married. Sager's partnership with Bacharach was among the most fruitful of her lengthy career. Perhaps their most notable collaboration was the song "That's What Friends Are For;" originally written in 1982 for the comedy Night Shift, the couple revived the song in 1986 to raise money for AIDS research. Recorded by "Dionne Warwick and Friends" (including Elton John), "That's What Friends Are For" quickly hit number one, earning well over a million dollars for charity. With Neil Diamond, Sager and Bacharach also composed the hit "Heartlight," and later penned the Patti Labelle/Michael McDonald duet "On My Own." In 1988 they collaborated on the soundtrack for the sequel Arthur 2: On the Rocks, and that same year they also authored a number of tracks on the Barbra Streisand LP Till I Loved You. In 1991, however, Sager and Bacharach divorced. She was relatively quiet in the years to follow, most notably writing songs for films including Beethoven's 2nd and Junior. ~ Jason Ankeny, Rovi, www. billboard.com

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
