

Conditional offers for **Open Intake** programs for Fall 2020 have been mailed and students have been notified of their next steps. If your students have any questions, they can email <u>study@kpu.ca</u> and KPU's team will be happy to assist them.

For Fall 2020 **Limited Intake** programs, conditional offers will be mailed in late February or early March. All Limited Intake applications and supporting documentation must be received by KPU by the application deadline of March 1, 2020.

**Entrance Scholarships and Awards**: The application deadline for Major Entrance Scholarships and Awards for Fall 2020 is April 6, 2020, with interim transcripts due by February 20, 2020. KPU offers two types of entrance scholarships and awards:

- KPU Major Entrance Scholarships, including The President's Scholarship (\$20,000), The Merit Scholarship (\$5,000), and The Indigenous Entrance Scholarship (\$5,000)
- Donor-funded Entrance Awards, ranging in value from \$1,000 to \$3,000
