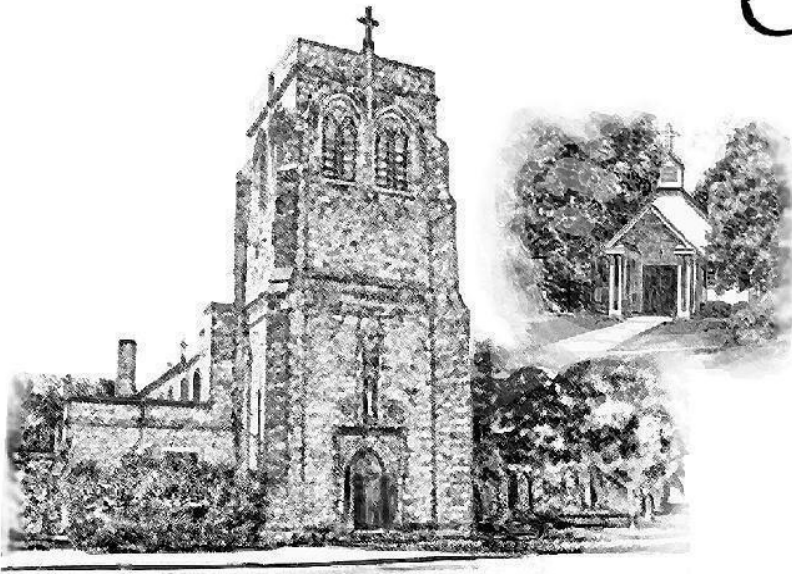

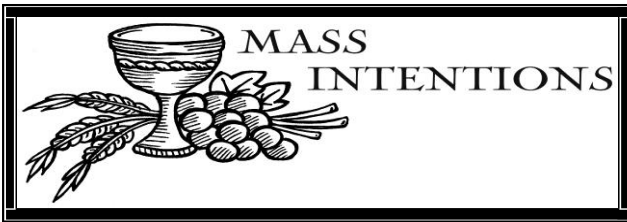

## *From the Parish House*

11 November 2018

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Now that Election Day has passed, it remains to be seen whether the country is even more divided than before, or whether it is ready to put aside division and bitter partisanship and work toward becoming the *United States* of America. As Jesus said “A house divided against itself will fall.” Please God that we can and will view differences of opinion as an opportunity for civil discussion and for a growth in tolerance and comity. We have too much at stake to allow ourselves to view things only through our myopic vision of partisanship, rather than the broader vision of the common good. Differences will always be there, and are an important component of democracy. But differences should never devolve into animosity or hate. Allowing it to do so only tears us apart, rather than helping us to grow in respect for each other. Hate and violence only beget hate and violence, so it is up to each and every one of us to work toward unity and peace.

Today we remember and honor all of our veterans, who have fought in any of our wars. It is so very difficult to leave family and friends to serve our country in the military, and so we must also remember and honor them also. We need especially to be aware of our wounded warrior veterans who now need our support as they cope with a wide variety of injuries, both psychological and physical. The government who sent them into combat now needs to do more to care for them, and it is up to us to contact our elected officials to step up to the plate and do just that. In a ‘throw-away’ society, let’s not throw away those who answered the call and rose to serve our nation. If we can find money to protect endangered fish and fowl, surely we can find the money to protect our veterans.

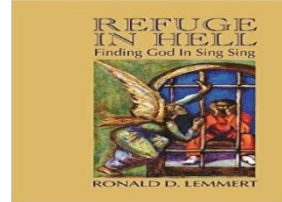

**Midnightrun.org** is a non-profit based in Dobbs Ferry and started in 1984 to help the less fortunate in NYC. They organize visits to NYC on Friday and Saturday nights by charity groups throughout the greater NYC area.

At Holy Name of Mary, we participated in our first "run" in 2008. We bring box lunches, hot coffee, soup and clothing to the homeless on the streets of NYC about eight times per year. We spend time with the people and talk to them. They, in turn, share their stories with us. We have monthly runs scheduled. To do this, we need volunteers. Teenagers are welcome. A typical run needs three or four vans/SUV's, 5-6 adults, 8-10 teenagers. The teenagers who attend are very moved by their experiences.

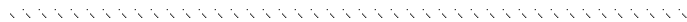
