Dear Fellow Parishioners,

As Jesus said "A house divided against itself will fall." Please God that we can and will view differences of opinion as an opportunity for civil discussion and for a growth in tolerance and comity. 

At Holy Name of Mary, we participated in our first "run" in 2008. We bring box lunches, hot coffee, soup and clothing to the homeless on the streets of NYC about eight times per year. We spend time with the people and talk to them. They, in turn, share their stories with us. We have monthly runs scheduled. To do this, we need volunteers. Teenagers are welcome. A typical run needs three or four vans/SUV's, 5-6 adults, 8-10 teenagers. The teenagers who attend are very moved by their experiences.
