

THOMPSON SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS

Thompson Scholarship Programs supports three populations: a Freshmen Cohort (4 year award for incoming first-year students); an Achievement Cohort (3 year award for rising sophomores); and a Transfer Cohort (2 year award for students who transfer to BGSU). Our staff meets with each Thompson Family Scholar throughout the year in one-on-one and group settings to provide holistic support from orientation through graduation. We seek to provide opportunities for Thompson Family Scholars to Connect, Engage, and Serve while at BGSU and beyond! Our Summer Link Program, Tuesday Night Common Time, Student Leadership Team Meetings, and weekly lunches are just a few ways we engage our scholars!






