
LOOKING FOR AMAZING ARTS INSTRUCTORS


PAINTING AT LARGE I Watch a local artist demonstrate large scale painting and lend a hand in the art making process.

JOIN AN ART REVIEW PANEL

The Thornton Arts Sciences and **Humanities Council (TASHCO)** Public Art Subcommittee invites city residents to participate on Public Art Review Panels to consider submissions for artwork that will be installed at new city facilities in the coming year. These panels will make public art recommendations to TASHCO who officially presents recommendations to Thornton City Council for approval.

Each panel includes up to five TASHCO members plus additional community members from city wards where the new public art will be located. Volunteers are appointed to a Review Panel based on needs identified by the TASHCO Public Art Subcommittee. If all panel seats have been filled. resident information will be kept on file for future city projects. Each panel will be unique and disbanded upon completion of its public art project. PUBLIC ART COLLECTION AND CALLS

Thornton has a robust public art program including opportunities to install art at new city facilities and transit stations as well as preservation of existing collections reflecting the city's evolving tastes. Examples include traffic box art, vertical and the underpass murals, sculptures and People's Choice Permanent Art Collection.

All artist calls are paid unless specified otherwise and are posted throughout the year on ArtsThornton.com and CallforEntry.org (CAFE). All submitted work will be reviewed and juried by the TASCHO Public Art Subcommittee with final approval from Thornton City Council. Artists will be contacted via email about all final decisions. TWIST AND SHOUT SUMMER CONCERTS

DIA DE LOS MUERTOS (DAY OF THE DEAD) CULTURAL CELEBRATION

Thornton's annual event celebrates a traditional Mexican holiday when the living remember their deceased loved ones. This free cultural event honors family, community and diversity, and has become one of Thornton's most popular celebrations.

Held annually in the fall at Community Park, "Dia" has grown from a small local art show and reception to a multicultural experience complete with an entertainment stage, "ofrenda" (altar), ethnic foods, artisan's market, Katrina fashion show, and much more. Plan to attend with family and friends in your most festive attire!

If you are an artist or vendor interested in participating in Dia de los Muertos, visit ArtsThornton. com to complete a booth application closer to the date of the event. All applicants pay a fee upon approval to secure space at this event and collect sales tax to be paid to the city. Art, merchandise, and food for sale must reflect the event theme and be affordably priced.
