What Is the Ticket Program?

Social Security's Ticket to Work (Ticket) program:

- Is Social Security's national employment program
- Supports career development for people with disabilities who want to work
- Is for Social Security disability beneficiaries ages 18 through 64
- Is free and voluntary



What Services Does Ticket to Work Offer?

Services offered may include:

- Job coaching
- Job counseling
- Training
- Benefits counseling
- Job placement









How Can the Ticket to Work Program and Work Incentives Help?

The Ticket program and Work Incentives may be able to help you meet your self-employment goals!

 Social Security Work Incentives make it easier for people with disabilities to work and still receive medical benefits and, in some cases, cash payments from Social Security.





Example: Unincurred Business Expenses

An **Unincurred Business Expense** is any non-monetary contribution that someone else makes to your self-employment efforts.

Example: Plan to Achieve Self-Support (PASS)

A PASS is a written plan, approved by Social Security, for pursuing and getting a particular type of job. A PASS describes the steps you will take and the items and services you will need to reach your work goal.

Is Self-Employment the Right Choice for You?

Take some time to think about these questions:

- Do you need flexible hours due to your disability?
- Is finding **reliable** and **affordable transportation** to and from a job difficult?
- Do you need the freedom to work at your own pace?
- Do you enjoy working on your own?
- Do you have a passion you can build a business around?
- Are you self-motivated?



Why Choose Self-Employment?

Self-employment may be right for you if you want to:

- Meet your work goals
- Create your own accommodations
- Transition from benefits to financial independence
- Seek opportunities in different fields of work







What Is New England Business Associates (NEBA)?

- NEBA is one of more than 500 authorized Employment
 Networks (ENs) in Social Security's Ticket program
- NEBA's mission is to enable individuals with disabilities to be fully included in community life, primarily through employment
- NEBA serves individuals with a wide range of skills, abilities, and interests, ages 18 through 64







What Is New England Business Associates (NEBA)? (Continued)

NEBA:

- Provides an individualized approach to helping beneficiaries start their own business
- Offers training in developing a business concept and writing a business plan
- Provides support to implement a business plan







What Is a Business Plan?

A "bankable" business plan includes:

- A statement of business goals
- The plan for reaching the goals
- A marketing strategy to promote business
- 3-year look at anticipated costs
- 3 years of projected net income







How Does NEBA Help with a Business Plan?

NEBA will help:

- **Develop** beneficiary's business idea
- Guide beneficiary in writing the business plan
- Assist in implementing business plan
- Navigate the transition off of Social Security benefits







How Does NEBA Help with a Business Plan? (Continued)

The **three parts** of a business plan include:

- 1. Business concept and goals
- 3-year projection of business costs and how much profit business will make
- 3. Marketing plan for target market







What Are the Requirements for NEBA Participation?

To work with NEBA and access their self-employment supports available, you must:

- Be eligible for the Ticket program
- Work with a NEBA instructor
- Have a business idea that's been evaluated and is likely to succeed, according to NEBA's standards
- Exhibit commitment to NEBA's program requirements
- Have access to a computer and Microsoft Office






How Many People Has NEBA Served?

Since 2009:

- 492 beneficiaries have participated in the program
- 144 plans have been completed
- Beneficiaries served in 40 states and Puerto Rico
- 28 former beneficiaries no longer receive Social Security benefits



Working from home may be right for you if you want to:

- Meet your work goals
- Have a less stressful work environment
- Avoid having to make special transportation arrangements if you need them due to your disability
- Seek opportunities in different fields of work
- Need to work from home as an accommodation

What Types of Jobs Are Available?

There are job opportunities in fields like:

- Customer service
- Technology support
- Healthcare
- Sales
- And more!





What Types of Skills Do You Need to Work from Home?

Skills you may need include:

- Computer skills
 - Internet
 - Typing
- Professional phone presence
- Customer service experience
 - Retail
 - Hospitality
 - Call center







Things to Keep in Mind

Be cautious

Not all work from home opportunities are legitimate. Look for red flags as some work from home opportunities may be too good to be true. Some red flags may include:

- Charging fees
- Being in business for a short amount of time

Understand your taxes

Some opportunities may not withhold taxes like traditional employment:

- W2 Taxes withheld
- 1099 Taxes not withheld and your responsibility to pay taxes





Getting Ready: Update Your Resume

Update your resume:

- Include dates of previous employment, school, or community service
- Prepare to talk about gaps in employment
- Tell your references that you are applying for jobs

Getting Ready: What's Your Experience?

Make sure you have the right experience

- Are you comfortable dealing with questions, complaints, and other requests by phone or online?
- Review the job listing and prepare to talk about how your skills and experience fit the requirements.







Getting Ready: Working On Site

Consider on-site work to gain experience

- Depending on the type of work you're interested in, it may be important to work on site before requesting to telework
- Once you've developed valuable skills, you may be able to transition to working from home







Getting Ready: The Hiring Process

Some employers may:

- Conduct testing to see if you're a good fit for working from home
- Perform background checks
- Perform credit checks
- Require testing for illegal drugs
- Have new hire paperwork









You Got the Job: Setting Yourself up for Success

- Set up a separate workspace
- Stick to a schedule. Don't make appointments or plan to take care of children or pets during this time.
- Set aside time to get out of the house and interact with others





You Got the Job: What Next?

Your work environment should:

- Be quiet and private
- Have a comfortable chair
- Have good lighting
- Eliminate as many outside noises as possible
