Since the start of the pandemic, we have been working with the Segerstrom Center for the Arts and UCI Health to create a comprehensive, responsible reopening plan. We have used recommendations from the CDC and guidelines provided by the industrial hygiene firm, TRC. High-traffic areas and frequently touched surfaces—like doorknobs, railings, elevator buttons and restrooms—are sanitized frequently. 150 hand-sanitizing stations have been installed throughout the Segerstrom campus. MERV-14 air filters are used to optimize air quality inside the concert hall, as well as state-of-the-art air handling systems that maximize fresh air intake.
