From the President

Greetings Fellow Airstreamers,

We have definitely had our share of drab, dreary days so far this winter but I know that things will get better and we'll all be planning to break the campers out and hit the road. It is a promising sign that the International and Region 3 rallies will be taking place. With the COVID vaccine becoming more available maybe more of us will be able to travel this year. So don't forget to make your reservations to attend the rallies this year. The sites at all the campgrounds are filling up fast, especially during summer.

I don't know if any of you have done any projects on your trailers this winter, but Rhonda and I are tackling guite a remodel of ours. We had a bad leak 6 years ago and although we dried out the floor as well as we could while on a caravan. it was not as dry as it could be. As a consequence, as the years went by, we could smell mildew and several areas looked as if there was mold growing. We decided to rip up the carpet and linoleum and put down new flooring. The problem was deciding on the color of the flooring we wanted. I wanted to put down luxury vinyl plank but Rhonda could not find a color she thought would go well with the cabinets. After many trips to the flooring stores, we read a comment on Airstream Forum about a product called Supercore. It is very similar to LVP in the manner of installation but it has ground up limestone mixed in that makes it stronger and able to withstand temperatures from -30F up to 150 F, great for trailers that are stored during the summer or winter. We have removed the bed, sofa and smaller cabinets but left the kitchen cabinets in place and I hope to start installing the flooring this week.

Well, as many of you know, when you start remodeling, it leads to other things. The Ozite or mouse fur as it is popularly called, was beyond cleaning. Despite Rhonda trying 5 different cleaners, we were never able to get it clean, so we have torn off

the mouse fur and have ordered vinyl, similar to what is on the ceiling. It should be easier to put up and clean. Of course, this required that the windows and door frames had to be removed in order to glue the vinyl to the wall and since everything was bare, I plan on putting another outlet in the bedroom and replacing the water heater. Our current water heater is 15 years old and gave us some problems last year, so a new heater was ordered and has been delivered. Rhonda has also suggested recovering the sofa so we may have the silver bullet ready for our first rally or it may be missing a few parts! We hope all of you are well and that we will see you somewhere down the road this year.

We had several reasons to try winter camping: I had some quilted items to pick up from the quilter in Boydton, Virginia, we wanted to try out our trailer which was damaged at Virginia Airstream right in their own lot AND I got a speeding ticket with Rhonda Evans on Route 58 in Mechlenburg County during our previous North Bend outing. So, off to southern Virginia we went.

Now, which of those items do you want to learn about first? Ok, the quilting. My wall hangings look beautiful. Just ask me and I will show you them on my phone. Our Airstream was repaired and it worked perfectly. The speeding ticket is a wonderful campground story, again, just ask me about it. I learned a lot in Traffic Court in Mechlenburg County.

But, the most important part of our weekend was the fantastic camping experience, remember it was January, at North Bend State Park. There were about 11 other trailers in Loop B, which is the only Loop open in the winter. There was an electrical hook up which helped with the furnace using only about 1/2 of a tank of propane the entire time. We did not de-winterize the trailer so that made everything pretty simple. Knowing that the dump site was open, we used the toilet with gallons of water. The restrooms were a short walk and very nicely heated and hot water for showers. With a refrigerator, a microwave, a hot pot and a grill, meals can be very good and tasty. So, we had all of the wonderful Airstream conveniences. I am not typically a paper plate person, but found putting the dishes in the fire rather fun.

The incredible part of the weekend was the direct beach and water access, although Richard was not dressed for swimming. We walked miles of sandy beach in the bright sunlight. The sunrises and sunsets were amazing. Looking out from the hatch door gave us a real sense of serenity. Having a roaring campfire most of the afternoon and evening was a real treat, not like summer time in Virginia.

Virginia Airstream Club Rally – Abingdon VA "Abingdon Silver In the Streets" May 13 -16, 2021

Welcome

- The *Virginia Airstream Club #109* is happy to extend an invitation to the Abingdon "Silver in the Street Rally" and we are going to have a great time! The town of Abingdon has given the rally its blessing and has been very supportive for the success of this project. The rally starts on Thursday afternoon May 13 and ends Sunday morning May 16. The registration is initially open to all four Virginia Airstream Clubs with open registration to other Airstreamers on March 15. Maximum number of rigs is 25 we will open a waiting list once our maximum number of rigs is reached. If you register and decide to cancel please let us know as soon as possible.
- <u>Covid</u> The rally is planned with the expectation that participants will have been vaccinated. The weekend schedule has no inside events, no large gatherings, and encourages Airstreamers to gather in small groups wearing masks and respecting social distancing where appropriate. If circumstances necessitate the organizers to cancel the event or if the Town of Abingdon withdraws its approval for the rally, participants will receive a full refund.

Preliminaries

- **Rally Fee** \$75 per rig. Please use these links to register online and pay by credit card or PayPal.

- <u>Charity</u> We will be supporting Meals on Wheels and the Abingdon Farmers' Market. Since there are no camping fees, and a small cost for breakfast, the majority of the rally fee will go to charity.
- <u>Name Badges</u> Wear your WBAC badge. We want to be recognized in the community. There may also be some discounts offered. We are visitors in town, be courteous and professional. We are

Ambassadors for our club and we want the Town to invite us back.

- **WBAC Number** Having your number on the front and rear of your rig would be very helpful when parking. This will help to identify your rig in an emergency and appropriate parking based on size.
- <u>Weather</u> Who knows? The weather is normally moderate this time of year. Weather statistics suggest typically mid 70°'s during the day and cool 50°'s at night. This can change, so bring a variety of clothing to meet changing weather conditions. Of course, always have your rain gear available.
- <u>Pets</u> Since we are parking very close and in town, pets are not recommended for this type of Rally. If you do bring a pet, it must be under your control at all times with a leash no longer than 6 feet. Pets must be well behaved at all times and cannot be left unattended outside your rig. Pets will not be allowed at Rally events and gatherings.
- <u>Communications</u> The rally mobile phone number entered on the registration will be used to communicate with participants before and during the rally. The rally organizer will communicate by SMS text messaging to keep you informed about events and activities, reminders, changes in plan, timing changes. You may add additional numbers for your partners.
- <u>Hook Ups</u> None. This will be dry/boondocking camping rally for 3 days. Please arrive with Charged batteries, Full propane tanks, Full fresh water tank and Empty Gray and Black water tanks.
- Flags Bring your flags to show off your rig.
- <u>Parking</u> This is not an event where you can show up at any time and park. Parking is the most challenging part of this event. The Town of Abingdon has designated where they want us to park. We have developed a parking plan to fit everyone in the designated areas. It will be Rally style parking on a city street. (Meaning close to each other, under street lights, so we will hear traffic, city noises, water heaters, furnaces and generators). Detailed instructions will be sent nearer the rally date.
- <u>Generators</u> Quiet generators (65db or less) will be allowed 8:00AM to 9:00PM. (Please no loud industrial generators). A limited power supply will be available for rigs that need to power medical devices overnight. Please note on the reservation form so that your rig can be placed near a source.
- <u>Dump Station</u>- Arrangements are being made for pump-out service on Sunday 08:30AM-10:30. A fee of \$20 will be charged for this service.

- Info Bags - The Chamber of Commerce will be putting together bags with information and maps. Gary and Lynn Brink will be welcoming each rig on Remsburg Drive with the Abingdon info.

Rally on Remsburg Drive

- **Welcome Evening** We will have a welcome Happy Hour/Social/Information Session at 5:00 PM on Thursday evening at the Farmers' Market Pavilion Bring your chairs and your happy juice in a cup.
- <u>Mayor's Welcome</u> There will be a Mayor's Welcome and announcements, 5:00 PM Friday at the Farmers' Market Pavilion at the east end of Remsburg Drive. Everyone please attend to show our support and to be part of the donation presentation to the Charity.
- <u>Video /Photo</u> We would like to ask for volunteers to take videos of the event or to gather photos so we can publish a gallery after this event. Please indicate your interest on the registration form.
- <u>Alcohol</u> Abingdon has an open container law. Do not walk out of a restaurant or bar with a drink. Do NOT display alcohol containers outside your trailer.
- Local Businesses We encourage you to patronize the local businesses, shops, restaurants, bars, tours, museums, etc. There are many places close to our parking downtown for breakfast, lunch and dinner.

- <u>Historical Tour</u> We have invited a local historian to lead a downtown tour or give a talk on Saturday.
- <u>Bicycling Activities</u> The Abingdon area is renown for its excellent biking trails including the Creeper trail. A complete factsheet will be published to assist you in making decisions on cycling either Friday or Saturday.
