Hello Everyone,

I wanted to give you a quick update on things going on around Trinity.

Pr. Solveig has submitted her resignation as our Interim Pastor effective June 27th. The Council will be working closely with the Synod to get us another Interim Pastor as soon as we can. Until that happens, we may have to rely on members of our congregation to share their gifts with us on Sundays as we get through another time of transition.

The Call Committee is still patiently waiting for a Lead Pastor candidate from the Synod. Currently there are many vacancies within the Synod and surrounding areas, and with everything going on in the world, many Pastors are finding it a hard time to make a major change. We will continue to wait patiently for the right person to come along. We are committed to finding the best person for Trinity, not just someone to fill the seat.

As of the June Council meeting, the Council has decided the time has come to loosen some of our Covid restrictions. Beginning immediately, masks will no longer be required in the building or during church services. The hymnals will be placed back in the pews and congregational singing will resume. Other restrictions will remain in place for a little while longer. We are still looking at the data and CDC guidelines, and will continue to work toward loosening all restrictions sooner than later. We all want our Trinity to be back to "normal" as soon as possible, and we are working hard to do this in a fashion that is safe for all of us. If you would like to discuss this further, please feel free to reach out to any of your Council members and have a polite discussion with them.

From the Pastor's Pen

Dear friends in Christ at Trinity Lutheran, Madison, SD,

The Intentional Interim begins with termination. It concerns the stage marked by the departure of the incumbent pastor. It concerns the closure of a chapter in the congregation's life that began when the person who has left was called. It is a time of farewell, with all the accompanying emotions of separation and uncertainty.

The end of the pastorate impels the congregation to the second stage of the journey, direction finding. This is a time of learning about the steps to be taken before a new pastor will be called. You are in this stage as you seek help from the Intentional Interim Pastor and help from the synod. This is the time of learning about the synod's guidance in finding a new Senior lead pastor. Now we also enter into self-study. This should be an unhurried process of the congregation looking at itself, gathering data, and preparing the call committee to seek a pastor. It is a careful and deliberate process of evaluation.

The fourth stage in the journey is the actual search, which Trinity has begun. The search stage requires

intensive work by the council and other leaders in the congregation.

Stage five in the journey is called decision. This is the exciting time of the search when a candidate is presented and the congregation decides whether or not to extend a call.

Trinity Lutheran Church Council Meeting April 13, 2021 7:00 P.M.

Council members recited Trinity's mission statement "Sharing God's Word, Doing God's Work."

President Rob Thuringer called the April council meeting to order. Rob introduced our Interim Pastor Solveig and he asked each council member to introduce themselves and tell what position they held on the council. Members absent and excused were: Sid Gulbranson, Josh Van Dyke, Tim Walburg, Susan Farrell-Poncelet, and Jennifer Briggs.

Vice President, Danny Brown led the council in devotions.

The Agenda was presented by President Thuringer and with no new additions. Ryan Townsend made a motion to approve and Brianna Routier seconded the motion. Motion approved.

The March 9th council minutes were presented and with no new additions, President Thuringer asked for a motion to approve and Danny Brown made the motion and Ryan Townsend seconded. Motion approved.

The Treasurer's report was discussed and we are \$9,600.00 behind and Bridget Van Liere made a motion to accept the report and Corey Strom seconded. Motion accepted.

Staff Reports were presented by:

Pastor Solveig reported:

- She is happy to be an Interim with Trinity Lutheran Church, she has been at the church 3 weeks and has had 3 funerals and Holy Week.
- 6th graders did their 1st communion on Maundy Thursday, and they received their Bibles, as it was delayed because of Covid 19.
- Confirmation will be at 2:00 pm on Sunday, April 18th also this was delayed because of Covid 19.
- Seniors will be honored on May 2, 2021 at Worship services.
- She has had a few private communions President Rob Thuringer reported:
- He reported the Call Committee paperwork has all been completed and submitted and we are patiently waiting for names of candidates.

Vice President Danny Brown reported:

 A gift card was purchased from Crossroads and presented to Pastor Dirk on his resignation effective April 16th, 2021.

Board of Deacon Chairman Jim Iverson reported:

He informed the council that the South Dakota

Synod Assembly will be held on June 4th & 5th and will be Virtual (the first time in history for the South Dakota Synod). Trinity Lutheran Church is allowed to have 5 delegates and they must be registered by May 10th. The 600 Lutheran delegates will be on Zoom.

- Jim Iverson will send an e-mail to ask for South Dakota Synod delegates.
- Rotating our serving groups for council has worked very well for providing ushers, greeters, and scripture readers. Thank you, Jim Iverson, for this idea!
- WORSHIP & MUSIC: The committee discussed outdoor services this summer, possibly on the 2nd Sunday in June, July, & August. The Celebration Team does not want to move all their equipment elsewhere. The board agreed. No decision on other locations.
- Question on who placed the hymnals back in the sanctuary?
- Reviewed the updated guidelines from the SD Synod ELCA on Covid-19 noting that until we reach increased number of vaccinations in the county and the state, the current practices are continuing. Nancy Sabbe found an excellent online resource dealing with the question of resuming safe congregational singing. The website address is: www.thehymnsociety.org/covid-19/. On that site, it shows the number of vaccinated people in the US. As of this meeting, the total number of vaccinated people were 21.9%. The website has a graph which shows that once the scale reaches 50%, churches can "prepare for singing." At 80%, singing can fully resume once again. We looked up the Lake County numbers as of this meeting, and 18.1% of the residents in the county were fully vaccinated. We all agreed that we must continue to look at the data and the science surrounding COVID-19, and continue to "stay the course" until more people in Lake County are fully vaccinated.

Board of Trustee Chairman Dana Hoff reported:

- Approved paying the bills
- Dana will check with Janitor Scotty on our snow blower which he reported is not in good shape.
- Corey will check on our insurance and get information about work comp and who is covered on our health insurance.
- Corey and Josh reported the new equipment has

- 8th graders have been ushering, and greeting at Lenten services.
- Preschool has a Facebook page.
- Multiple applicants have been received for the preschool teacher and they will be working through those and they reported they were happy to receive a United Way grant to allow for monthly benefit stipend for the teacher.
- 5th graders will be preparing for their 1st communion and to hold their First Communion class before Memorial Day.

Dear South Dakota Synod,

Grace and peace to you in the name of the triune God. – I hope these words find you soaking up the warmth of summer. While last year we postponed family and class reunions and avoided gatherings altogether due to the pandemic, I hope you are back to do what you enjoy, being together in community.

While you read these lines I will be visiting my family in Germany. I have not seen my parents or my son, who works and lives there, in two years. My Mom was diagnosed with dementia a few years ago, and my dad and our son are the sole caretakers. I will use my time to check in with doctors, see how my family is holding up and enjoy my afternoon pastries while visiting those I love.

I give thanks for regaining the freedom to travel again. Are there restrictions? Absolutely! But because vaccinations in the US moved along fast we are able to enjoy traveling much safer again. Did you get your vaccine yet? I did. But I have to admit I am among those who reluctantly went to be vaccinated. Yes, I had fears, I had questions, I wanted to wait, but faithful conversations with medical personnel and scientists assured me that I will be okay. Did it take care of all of my reluctance? Honestly, no, it hasn't, but I trust that those who work with and on vaccines know and answer truthfully. And has a person of faith I trust that in the midst of science and my fears God holds me and cares for my doubts and all. If you have fears about the vaccine talk to your doctor or a medical provider you trust to help you ease your fears, and maybe with more conversations you one day will also be ready to reluctantly get vaccinated. But no matter what, know that regardless you are a beloved child of God.

Missionary Update Excerpt-May 2021

Costa Rica is in the middle of its 3rd wave since the COVID pandemic began in March 2020. This wave has been worse than the previous two. The likely causes of this 3rd wave were the arrival of new, more contagious variants from other parts of the world; at the same time, a significant percentage of the population prematurely abandoned tried-and-true prevention measures (hand washing, the use of masks and physical distancing), despite repeated warnings to the contrary.

Much like the daily counts of COVID cases, there has been extensive media coverage of the number of migrant children trying to enter the US from Mexico, as well as the treatment they receive while in the custody of Customs & Border Patrol (CBP) agents.

Five years ago, the AMMPARO strategy adopted overwhelmingly by the ELCA Churchwide Assembly in 2016 identified the principal causes as "...extreme violence, poverty, lack of access to educational and employment opportunities, and environmental displacement..." In truth, not much has changed.

The driving forces behind Central American migration will not weaken anytime soon. Slowing this migration exodus will be just as challenging as ending the COVID pandemic, maybe more so. It will take years of sustained effort with a focus on the root causes.
