

TODAY'S GAME

WHYTE & MACKAY SUPER LEAGUE **ROUND 1/22** TAYPORT v ARNISTON RANGERS

The fourth season of the East Super League kicks off with Arniston Rangers as our first visitors to

the Canniepairt. Arnie had a sticky time last season and escaped relega-

tion only by the skin of their teeth.

It was a worrying time for the Gorebridge faithful and opinions on manager Jimmy Crease were mixed. However a decision was forced on the Arniston committee when Jimmy announced after the last day of the season win over Lochee United, that he was moving to take over as assistant manager of Berwick Rangers. Ironically he was moving to join the wee Gers as second man to John Coughlan who had been Jimmy's assistant at Arniston.

A surprise choice to take over the managerial reins at Newbyres Park was ex-Tayport striker Ben Honeyman (pictured right). At 28, Ben will become the youngest manager in the Super League and he has brought in as his assistant 32 years old Lee Bailey, the Bonnyrigg Rose striker.



Both Ben and Lee intend to continue playing and if Ben's end of season form is anything to go by, the Tayport defenders will have to keep a

watchful eye on their former striker. Chances are the new appointments will have revitalised a club

which couldn't wait for the end of last season to come quick enough.

Enigmatic youngster Wayne McIntosh has left for Lothian Thistle but Ben has most of last season's squad in his pool for this afternoon. Player of the Year, the veteran keeper Gavin Kirkwood, will be vying with Fraser Elder for the No.1 jersey while defensive stalwarts Wes Mitchell and Barrie Richardson should be in their usual places. The talented Kevin Donnelly has the ability to cause problems for any side as does the inconsistent Alan McDonagh.

Pre-season matches saw the Tayport management team continually switch their team round and engage their full pool of player during the ninety minutes but it was done very effectively. This was never more evident than in the matches against Dundee United and the two games down south last weekend. Despite putting in a gruelling 90 minutes in the 0-0 draw with Pollok on the Saturday, Monday evening saw a splendid performance against a Dundee United side which included eight of the players who were in the team which defeated Sheffield Wednesday to lift the City of Discovery Cup the previous afternoon. This, despite making continual changes throughout the game.

Against Crook Town, six changes in personnel were made to the starting line-up but again the team performed well. This serves to illustrate that today's starting line-up is anybody's guess. Brian Livie and Grant Paterson both missed the two tour games but are likely to feature today. A midweek training injury looks to have ruled Barry McNaughton out of the big kick-off

Arniston will travel to the Canniepairt in confident mood looking to get points on the board early on and no doubt conscious of the less than auspicious start which Tayport has made in each of the last two seasons. Tayport will reflect ruefully on each of their last two seasons, given that the results in August and September effectively cost them the title.

As well as finding the net regularly, clean sheets have also been the norm, disappointment being the penalty shoot- for both Frazer Fitzpatrick and Duncan Bruce, so long may that continue. Ultimately, the club will reap the relong into the new session, but the shortterm benefits are obviously the main concern.

> It's all about making a good start to the league programme. Even a distinctly average start would be an improvement on the last two years, but Keith Burgess will be gunning for three points, each time his side steps out onto the park.

Arniston, however, will make things difficult, as will Wednesday's visitors, when the Scottish Cup winners and league runners-up clash with the league winners and Scottish Cup runnersup. Both matches represent a big challenge. Hopefully, Tayport will be ready.

Totally outplayed and outthought at Tannadice, Lochee realised more drastic surgery was required and so it was back to the drawing board for Manager Eddie Wolecki.

After eliminating Tayport on penalties in the semi final, Pollok cruised past Lochee Utd in the final at North End Park, the 1-0 scoreline giving being scant reward for a comfortable win. Lochee had thumped North champs Culter by 5-0 in their semi-final.

A short close season but plenty happening

The season finished on 20th June and we were back in action on Saturday 16th July with a friendly against Glentanar. The dry summer meant that the Canniepairt was under repair and this first game took place on the Shanwell Common. It was a rush job for the committee in order to lay out a pitch on the area where, six days before, Billy Smart's Circus had set up its Big Top.

A couple of games were played on the Canniepairt, however, the Super Cup semi-final v Pollok and the friendly v Dundee United. The car boot sales, the hot, dry weather, the absence of someone to look after the ground during the day and the cost of water meant that the normal Canniepairt playing surface resembled a prairie in America's mid west.

Despite the short close season, and the absences from time to time of players and management, the pre-season performances were top drawer, culminating in impressive shows down south v Crook Town and South Shields, both of the Northern League.

There was little turnover in players during the break. To date, only Bryan Duell from Forfar West End has been recruited, although Craig Brown, formerly of Alloa Athletic has been showing his paces preseason. Dave Reilly announced his retirement and John Ward moved on to pastures new, although John's choice of Cowdenbeath raised a few eyebrows. The big man has made a great start, though, with goals in his first two games. We wish him well. Scott Peters has apparently retired, although, like last season, he could be back in harness later in the season. Ralph Hunter has disappeared.

What else? John Ward pretty much cleaned up in the Annual Awards although Robbie Henderson received the Morris Couper award for the goal of the season with his effort in the OVD Cup final. Gary Middleton was the top scorer and the Supporters' Club POY. All received their awards at a presentation evening in the Tayport Arms.

Midway through the close season, the Junior fraternity was stunned by the news that Big Jock Myles had been forced to give up his role as General Secretary of the East Region on his doctor's orders. Assistant secretary Bill McDonald BEM,MBE has been elevated to the top job. Former Tayport FC club treasurer Matt Lawson, now with Rosyth, has been pulled in to assist by doing the fixture allocation for the Tayside District clubs.

At the Canniepairt, we've been bothered with vandalism at the but the not-so-local boys (and girls) in blue have yet to catch the culprits. Such a short close season doesn't give the committee a great opportunity to do as much maintenance as we would wish but we've had some redecoration carried out in the pavilion and Sandy and Jim have carried out roof repairs to the storage cabins. There's still much to be done....but so little time!

The Canniepairt was again used as overspill parking for the Open Golf qualifying at Scotscraig. Some of the committee literally got their hands on the old claret jug when it was on show at the first tee. Interesting to note that two of the oldest sports trophies in world, the Open Golf championship trophy and the Scottish Junior Cup were actually on display in little Tayport at the same time!

The Scottish Junior Cup has moved on temporarily and is currently taking pride of place in the Scottish Junior Football exhibition which is being staged at the Scottish Football Museum at Hampden Park.

Sad to report the sudden death during the close season of former Tayport FC stalwart Jim Mathers, the club's Player of the Year in 1969. During the 50s, 60s and 70s Jim was a resolute centre-half for Tayport FC, then an amateur side. Not only did he serve as a player but had to undertake the role of secretary for a spell during the late 60s when, with very little committee support, he helped carried the club through some dark days before it emerged to ultimately reach the dizzy heights of recent times. There was a large turn-out at Dundee Crematorium to pay their respects to a popular member of the community.
