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

PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

We are already into week 3 and students and teachers are engaged with our core business of learning. We are excited to share with families the intended learning and plan to share this at a Meet and Greet on Wednesday 17 February 4:30-5:30pm, invitations have been emailed home on Monday 8 February, this event will differ from previous years to comply with COVID Safe Guidelines. Adults will no longer gather in the homerooms for a teacher talk, but will view information in static displays designed to share the following information as requested from parent feedback:

- curriculum information and how to help at home
- organisational and procedural details such as PE, library times, Loving Literature expectations and upcoming events
- making a personal connection with the Homeroom teacher to strengthen the Parent Teacher Partnership

The curriculum is part of our core business, and the National Australian Curriculum informs Wynnum State School's curriculum, describing what students should learn as they progress through their schooling. There are eight learning areas English, Maths, Science, HASS, The Arts, Technology, Languages and Health and PE. The Learning areas contain content descriptors that detail knowledge, understanding and skills to be taught and learned. These content descriptors are accompanied by achievement standards, which describe what students will know, do and apply as an outcome of teaching and learning. 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
HABITS OF MIND

Our school library, is not just confined to books. As you can see, it is immensely popular during





SCIENCE NEWS with Mrs Crowe

Over the first two weeks of school our Prep to Year Six Wynnum Warriors participated in 'Team-Building' and 'Habits of Mind' learning experiences with the specialist teachers.

Preps were introduced to Science by *Gathering Data through all Senses* and *Responding with Wonderment and Awe* as they actively investigated natural items from the local environment integrated with storytelling of Scribbly Gum Secrets (created by local author Danika Paterson and local illustrator Megan Forward).

For Years 1 - 6 Science the Elephant Toothpaste experiment was requested again for Science in 2021! The Wynnum Warriors all cheered a very big **WYNNUM WOW** as they observed and felt the heat in this exothermal chemical reaction! All year level house groups engaged in *Thinking Interdependently* and 'Questioning and Problem Posing' during each step of their experiment. Great work Wynnum Warriors!

We welcome you to the Parent Curriculum evening next Wednesday 17 February sessions where you can find out more about what your child is learning in Mathematics.


During the next two weeks, all our Prep students with their teachers and paraprofessionals will be involved in the **EARLY START Literacy** and **Numeracy** tasks.




Long before children start school they begin to

learn about literacy and numeracy. The experiences they have every day from birth help them to develop their literacy and numeracy skills.

Early Start



The Early Start literacy and numeracy materials support teachers to find out your child's early skills by using a series of tasks developed specifically for Queensland. It is important to remember that the Early Start literacy and numeracy tasks are designed to gather information about students' abilities, and their learning needs, so teachers can plan effective learning programs during the early years of school. Don't be concerned if your child can't answer all of these questions. These tasks are designed to gather information about what your child knows and what needs to be taught next for their learning.






