THE LATEST:

Last night, the Blue Jays had their four-game winning streak snapped as they lost the opener of their three-game set in Tampa Bay by a score of 8-4...Drop to 12-11 in series openers and 5-5 in June.

The Jays are now 5-3 in their last eight contests, following a 4-15 stretch... Have gone 13-22 since May 2 for a .351 win%, tied for 27th in MLB over that span...Have fallen below the Rays and back into 4th place in the AL East and are now 14.5 games back of the division-leading Yankees and Red Sox.

HERNADEZ HOMERS AGAIN:

- Teoscar Hernandez hit his 11th home run of the season last night, a two-run shot in the 3rd inning to give Toronto a 3-1 lead...Also singled in his final at-bat for his 100th career hit...Has homered in consecutive games for the 3rd time in his career, also doing so from Sept. 26-27, 2017 (2G) and Sept. 22-24, 2017 (3G)...Has a four-game RBI streak going (6 RBI), his longest of the season and the 2nd longest of his career (6G: Sept. 22-27, 2017)...Has recorded three HR and seven RBI over his last seven contests and has four HR and 10 RBI in his last 10 games.
- Hernandez has now had 31 of his 54 hits this season go for extra bases (15-2B, 5-3B, 11-HR)...His 57.4 XBH% is tied for 4th best in the Majors while his 31 XBH are tied for 10th in the AL...Since he was recalled on April 13, those 31 XBH are tied for 4th most in the Majors.

Toronto batters recorded three extra-base hits last night and have at least that many in five straight games, one shy of their longest such streak this year (April 26-May 1)...Have combined for 224 extra-base hits this season, 4th most in the Majors...Rank 20th in MLB with 525 hits...Their 42.7% XBH rate is 2nd highest among all 30 teams.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN:

- This evening marks the middle of a brief, three-game road trip for the Blue Jays...After this three-game set in Tampa Bay, will have an off-day on Thursday...Will then return home for a five-game homestand vs. a couple of NL opponents, taking on the Nationals (36-37) for three games, followed by another off day before two dates with the Braves (37-28).
- The Blue Jays went 3-6 on their last road trip and hold an overall road record of 14-17...Are within three games of .500 on the road, despite being out-scored by 25 runs and out-hit by 53 hits...Have averaged 4.55 runs/game on the road, 6th highest in the AL, while allowing 5.35 R/G (13th in the AL).

BLUE JAYS vs. THE RAYS:

- All-Time: 168-188...All-Time, On The Road: 73-107...2018: 1-3
 The Blue Jays won the 2017 season series with the Rays, 10-9, for their 2nd winning season vs. TB in the last decade (11-8 in 2014)...Lost two of three in their May 4-6 series in Tampa...Have a lost nine of their last 13 contests at Tropicana Field...Have an all-time record of 73-104 at the Trop (0-3 at Ballpark at Disney), their most losses at any venue (other than Rogers Centre) since 1998 the Rays' inaugural season.
- Curtis Granderson leads all current Jays with 46 RBI vs. Tampa Bay, and is tied for the lead with Josh Donaldson at 15 HR...Kendrys Morales has five 4+ RBI games as a Blue Jay, three of which have come against the Rays.
- Devon Travis is a career .283 (30-for-106) hitter vs. TB, including 8-2B, 1-3B, 2-HR and 13-RBI in 28 games...However, is 2-for-26 in Tampa Bay over the last two seasons (1-2B, 1BB, 4K).

KENDRYS CLICKING ALONG:

Kendrys Morales went 2-for-4 with a double and an RBI last night...Has extra-base hits in three consecutive contests for the first time since June 18-20, 2017...Last had a longer such streak in 2015, a four-gamer from Aug. 25-28...Has multi-hit efforts in three straight games and in five of his last six contests...Over his last 19 games, has gone 22-for-68 (.324) with 6-2B, 2-HR, 9-RBI and nine multi-hit performances.

A TALE OF TWO RANDALS:

Randal Grichuk singled in a run to put the Jays up, 4-3, in the 4th inning last night...Extended his season-long hitting streak to five games (9-for-20)...Has gone 11-for-27 (.407) with 3-2B, 3-HR and 9-RBI over his last 7G (1.300 OPS)...Since returning from the DL (right knee sprain) on June 1, has been a .344 hitter with 6-XBH (.106 AVG before DL, 4-XBH).

LEFT WANTING:

The Blue Jays are now 8-18 vs. LH starters...Have lost a franchiserecord 11 straight games vs. LH starters...The last team to lose 11 such games in a row was the White Sox, from June 26 - August 5, 2017...The last club to lose 12 consecutive was Milwaukee, who dropped 13 straight from May 5-28, 2013.

MOMENTUM SHIFTS:

The Jays scored in three different innings last night and on all three occasions, surrendered runs to the Rays in their very next at-bat... Toronto has allowed runs in the half-inning immediately after scoring 59 different times this season - four times more than any other team.

TONIGHTS'S START:

 Making his 12th start of the season...Coming off his 3rd quality start of the year (6/7 vs. BAL) when he allowed 1ER on 4H over 6.0 innings (3BB, 6K).

2018 HIGHLIGHTS:

- Opponents are hitting .098 (5-for-51) on his curve balls and sliders, best among MLB pitchers with at least 31.0 IP.
- Is 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA at home and 1-3 with an 8.20 ERA on the road.
- Pitched his shortest outing of the season on 6/1 at DET, logging 1.2 IP and allowing 4ER and 7H (0BB, 1K)...Tied for his 2nd shortest career outing as a starter (1.0IP vs CIN 9/26/16).
- Activated from the 10-day disabled list on 5/26 and threw his 2nd quality start of the season that afternoon at PHI...Marked his longest start of the season, logging 7.0 IP and allowing 1ER and 5H (0BB, 5K).
- Was placed on the 10-day disabled list on 5/16 with left shoulder inflammation.
- Allowed 6 hits over 3.2 innings on 5/15 vs. NYM and tied a season high with 6 ER allowed...Went 5.1 IP or less in each of his last 7 starts prior to this start.
- Allowed 2 runs (1 earned) vs. SEA on 5/9 with a season-low 3 hits over 5.0 innings...Walked 5 batters, his most since a 5-BB outing on 5/10/17 at HOU.
- Pitched in Game 1 of a doubleheader at CLE on 5/3, allowing a season-high 6 runs (all earned) on 7 hits (1 HR) in 3.1 innings (1BB, 4K)...Remains 0-2 with a 8.31 ERA (12ER/13.0IP) in three career starts against Cleveland.
- Struck out the first 4 batters of the game on 4/28 vs. TEX, his most to ever begin a contest... Also marked the 2nd time in his career to fan 4 consecutive batters within a game (4/14/16 vs. MIL)...Threw a career-high 3 wild pitches (2-WP, 6x, last: 9/3/16 at CIN).
- Pitched against his former team, the New York Yankees, for the 1st time on 4/22...Remains winless in 4 career starts in the Bronx after allowing 4ER over 5.1 innings (1HR, 3BB, 6K).
- In his 1st career start against the Rangers (4/8), recorded his 1st win of the season after allowing 3ER over 5.1 innings (2BB/5K).
- In his 1st start as a Blue Jay (4/2 vs. CWS), recorded his first 16 outs on strikeouts and ground balls while allowing just one run over 6.0 innings (2BB/7K).

2017 HIGHLIGHTS:

Made three consecutive starts for three different teams on July 21 (ATL), July 28 (MIN) and Aug. 4 (NYY), becoming the first pitcher to do so since Gus Weyhing in 1895 (*courtesy Elias*)...Became the first pitcher to start for three different teams in the same season since Byung-Hyun Kim in 2007 (FLA, ARI, COL).

VS. THE RAYS:

Has made only 1 career start against the Rays, on 9/13/17 in Tampa Bay as a member of the Yankees (4.2IP, 1ER, 1H, 1BB, 4K).
