LAMENT FOR A WOUNDED CREATION

We now turn from the joyful joining all creation in worship and blessing to lament our wounding of God's good creation.

We grieve at the devastation of floods and wildfires...

Our hearts break as we move more deeply into the Sixth Extinction...

We consider with concern the dwindling of vibrant habitats in which life can thrive in its awesome diversity...

We look with compassion at the increasing number of climate refugees.

How badly we want to turn our imaginations away from the wounded creation our children and grandchildren will inherit and the impact climate change will have on their lives.

And yet faithfulness requires that we listen to the cries of creation....

Time of silence for prayer and contemplation

Adding to the painful work of lamenting is the necessity of recognizing and confessing our own personal complicity in wounding creation.

We have participated in a culture that takes more than its share of earth's resources, is both prolificate and wasteful in its consumption of food and energy, foolishly ignores the consequences of extracting and burning fossil fuels and assumes that we are entitled to a more lavish lifestyle than most of our fellow humans.

In addition, we have often retreated beyond facades of ignorance, apathy and helplessness to excuse inaction and to escape the consequences of true repentance.

Forgive us, Creator God for the many ways we have wasted and abused the blessings you have poured over our lives.

Beloved of God, the one who was buried into the heart of the earth and then raised up to new life forgives you all your sin. Freed from your burdens, be led by the Spirit to do God's healing work in the world.





What's next for me in caring for the Earth?

You are encouraged to take something you learned today about caring for Creation and put it into action. Small, simple steps by many people will result in bigger changes than we can imagine. Here are some ideas to get you moving.

9	Pray for Creation and those people in power who can affect change.
9	Identify your God-given resources and opportunities that have equipped you for this work.
69	Begin where you are and make small changes in your world.
69	Write a brief statement as to why, as a Christian, this work is important.
9	Commit to prayers of gratitude and of finding joy in the wonder, beauty, and abundance of Creation.
69	Learn about climate change, its causes and impactwhat is being done and what needs to be done to reduce the pace of global warming to adapt to what is already happening.
9	Consider things that often link to climate change: racism, disinformation, inequity, refugees, voter suppression, campaign financing, etc.
69	Listen and talk to others about climate change to learn what you have in common.
9	Join and volunteer with organizations that affect environmental stewardship.
9	Donate in support of those organizations or political campaigns whose message and work in creation care you find worthy.
9	Advocate in your congregation, with public servants from local to national levels, businesses, and civic groups. Your voice may be the "tipping point" they need!
