### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"I am the Way and the Truth and the Life. No one comes to the Father except through Me."

#### **ROADS AND CELL PHONES**

I remember clearly when I first decided that I needed to get a cell phone. I was on my way to conduct a graveside memorial for one of our members. It was in Milwaukee, so I took the highway to the exit I had been told, then started driving east, looking for my next direction. I kept driving until I reached what I thought was the right road and rolled down my window to ask someone if I should, as the directions indicated, turn right. He told me "No, the cemetery you're looking for is to your left. Keep driving for several miles until you see it." I drove and drove and drove. No cemetery. Finally, frantic, I retraced my route and continued on the road where I had been told I should turn right. I found the cemetery, and the people waiting for me had been patient, but I was embarrassed and very apologetic. I knew that my secretary knew exactly where the cemetery was (this was before the days of GPS), and if I had been able to call her I wouldn't have made the mistake of driving so many miles in the wrong direction. I got a cell phone soon after.

I don't know whether the person who misdirected me did so intentionally or not. He seemed like a nice person; perhaps he just made a mistake, or maybe he was thinking of a different cemetery, or maybe he misheard me. There's a clear analogy with our spiritual lives here. There are more than a few people who are willing to give you life directions. Some would love to intentionally lead you astray, some view different things as more important than we do, and some can't really help you because they're lost themselves (that's true of most people). Besides that, the signs and mile markers are often wrong, too.

You need a phone. With a phone, you can call and speak directly to a person. With the Bible, you can hear and listen to the God whom we love. He knows exactly where everything is, and He knows exactly what happens and why, and He knows perfectly what path you should take to get to the right destination. In eternity terms, that destination is heaven, and because Jesus travelled death and hell road by himself, you don't have to go there. He alone can lead you, by faith, to the heaven that He's won for you.

I've often picture life like this: At the start of every day, Jesus sees us on the side of the road, somewhat dazed and confused. He stoops, leans over, extends His hand, and says "Let me help you up and brush you off. You've made mistakes, but don't worry, I've covered them. Now, walk with me today as we enjoy the day and keep hiking to heaven." Isn't that the way it is? Maybe we don't remember that often enough, and we end up struggling on our own, hoping to find our way by ourselves, heading off in wrong directions and trying troubles. In my observation of my own life, this doesn't happen infrequently; it happens every day in many ways, some small and some big.

But how wonderful the picture of Jesus waiting for us on the road today, and tomorrow, and forever! How wonderful that He will never get tired of walking with us, working with us, and leading us home! How wonderful that, though we are misled easily, we are blessed with this Lenten season to reflect on and confess our sinful unworthiness and watch Jesus go to the cross to wash away all the things that would lead us astray and captivate us forever.

Members of Trinity and all of our friends, every time you use your cell phone, remember our connection with God, Jesus, that is far better than 5G. Use that connection, and the journey will be far more pleasant, and the end will be heaven. By God's grace!

# NO EASY ANSWERS part 3

Before I retired, one of the most frequent questions I was asked was; "Do you believe God still blesses America?" Now that is a serious question, and there are many parts to the answer. My first response was, "I believe that God still blesses those who walk close to Him, and walk according to His ordinances and statutes." Beyond that I'm not so sure. Then I was asked the second question, "what about this country?" My response was always the same, "If you were God, would you bless this country?" Almost to a T, every individual walked away to think how to answer that question. I was left there standing alone. Please let me explain.

How does the last paragraph have anything to do with God blessing America? In the second chapter of John, we read that Jesus made a whip. In order to fully understand the story you must understand that Jesus gathered the reeds and braided the whip for the sole purpose of clearing the temple. There are those who say that Jesus never got angry. What He had was righteous indignation. For me, to deny the emotions of the man is to deny His humanity. If He was fully human and fully divine, he had emotions. As my son used to say, "He was fired up." I also believe that you could hear the emotion in His voice and see it in His eyes. They had defiled the house of God, or put another way, they defiled the temple of God.

Moving on to the eighth chapter of John, we find that a group of men are bringing a woman who was caught in the very act of adultery to Jesus. It is not the main desire of the men to have the woman stoned, but to use her to disqualify Jesus with His followers. What they have succeeded in doing is to make Jesus extremely angry. Why did Jesus get so angry? The answer is so simple. If He got angry over the abuse of the House of God, how do you think He feels when a Child of God was about to be abused. Better yet, we as His children are His temple. If He got hostile over a physical temple, how do you think He felt over the possible destruction of a spiritual temple, the woman?

I am a Right to Life individual, plain and simple. I have dealt with women who went to Planned Parenthood for counseling and were told the physical implications of an abortion, but not the psychological after effects. One statement I heard over and over was, "no one ever told me about the mental pain I would suffer." The only help I could offer was to let them talk through their pain and anger. Sometimes it helped, and at other times there was no relief. On the spiritual, I would tell them that there was nothing they could do to make God stop loving them. The hardest part would be to go to Him and confess and ask for forgiveness. I could guarantee that the forgiveness would be forth coming. However; once God has forgiven you, the hardest part will be to forgive yourself. Remember that God told the first couple to choose life. I believe God has not changed His mind. We are to choose life.

That is just one example of how the American society has rejected the Word of God in order for it to live as it wants. Another is that more pornographic material is produced in this country than any other in the world. I doubt seriously if God thinks it is an alternative art form as was decided by the Supreme Court. In addition, I believe that God intended, when possible, for the family unit to be a functional cohesive unit where the nurture and care of each member is maintained; not government.

Now consider 2020 and Covid-19. What happened to our freedom to congregate as a family of faith and worship our creator? What does it mean when keeping liquor stores open becomes more important than allowing churches to minister to the faithful, or allowing individuals to come and pray. I will not talk about the hatred that exists. What happened to love your neighbor and do unto others? God bless America? I prefer to spend my time praying for God to have mercy of America. He knows how much we need it. What is your prayer for America, and is it something we really need? I hope so.

Sometime in March we plan to take a field trip to the Christian Care to deliver them and take a tour.

- ♦ Dr. Col. Carl Carlan blessed an Army Veteran with a quilt sewn by Pam Bixler

We had many blessings in February. Blessing number one was that after couple of weeks of being unable to meet because of covid we could meet once again. Blessing number two is our new member. Marilyn De Tizio. We learned that in her former church she was a member of a choir that performed in senior care facilities. This choir blessed the residents not only with their voices but they sewed fidget quilts to give out when they visited memory care units. She has 17 of them ready to distribute when Senior care centers once again are open to visitors. At our first meeting she mentioned her friend Jan who was also a part of that group. I told her I hoped she would continue to come and bring her friend! The next meeting Jan was there and was very helpful! Blessing number three is the bountiful donations that came in that help to keep our ministry going.

### FROM THE BOARD OF STEWARDSHIP

Trinity's Stewardship Board has been watching the progress of the "Matching Debt" for closure of the remaining loan on our fellowship hall and would like to offer our thanks and gratitude to all of you that have been early supporters to this program. It's still early, steady progress has been made to meet this generous gift match of \$250k from our congregation. IT IS DOABLE!

Reviewing some tax planning options for members to consider, there are several items that the board of stewardship found particularly interesting.

- 1. The Cares Act has been extended into 2021. There is a provision offered that the tax deduction for charitable giving will be doubled for a household filing jointly of \$300 each for a total of \$600 per joint return. This is a above the line deduction, so this is offered with the preservation of the full standard deduction intact and not having to itemize which is a very standard practice by most taxpayers and church membership.
- 2. Again for 2021, If itemizing, the option to deduct 100% of a cash gift to a charity against income, vs the normal 60% of income has been extended. Again, a very generous gift deduction for larger gifts that extend beyond using the standard deduction. This gift deduction amount can be used against deferred gain which is likely what our debt benefactor is using as a prudent use of the tax code. Note: it is a great option to reduce built-up tax exposure in deferred accounts thereby converting an IRA to a Roth IRA, or to remove built up gain from non-qualified deferred annuities.
- **3.** An option to consider is gifting up to \$100k if 70 and older as a direct gift of one's IRA to your favorite charity so that it completely bypasses reporting this as an income source. No deduction, but no income to report. This removes taxes from future RMD's or from passing along IRA monies to family only to have them pay a tax at sometimes a much higher rate in the future.

These options offered here are not to be relied upon as being the complete source for information. You will want to look them up yourself to ensure that they can be useful for your own planning needs. Consult a tax planner should you need assistance.

Please keep in mind that our blessings are many within our congregation. We hope that you will be a "cheerful giver" of that what God bestows upon you and your responsibility of being a good steward.

### Trinity Lutheran Church Council Meeting Notes February 16, 2021

BUSINESS MANAGER: Jill Esposito has been contacted by Narcotics Anonymous. They would like to have an additional meeting at the church. Chuck Wilt made the following MOTION: Council shall allow the Narcotics Anonymous group currently meeting to hold an additional meeting on Monday nights at 7:30 PM in Room 1. Jerry Iseler seconded. Motion carried. Betty Jo Bock is retiring and her Veterans Support Group would like to have a pot luck dinner for her on May 4, 2021 at 11:30 AM in the Fellowship Hall. There may be up to 60 people. MOTION: Council shall approve a pot luck dinner for the Veterans Support Group in May. They have agreed to follow safety guidelines that have been established by the Church and the CDC. This dinner shall not exceed 100 guests. If COVID circumstances change, Council may require this dinner to be canceled. Gary Eckoff seconded. Motion carried. Jill has also received a request for a TOPS (support) group to meet here. They would like to meet every Thursday at 9:00 AM. They have 30 members, but average 15 per meeting. They will also require storage of scales, tubs/bins, and signage. Due to concerns regarding conflicts with our groups, COVID and the request for storage, Council directed Jill to decline to allow them to meet here.

Jill introduced Lou Rebeck to briefly outline his role in reviewing the TLC Personnel Manual. Copies of the Original wording and the Proposed Changes were previously provided to Council and are attached. Gary Horton moved: <u>MOTION</u>: Council shall accept the proposed changes to the Personnel Manual, as stated in the 2/16/2021 copy attached. Chuck Wilt seconded. After much discussion centered mostly on the vacation pay-out policy, the motion carried.

### <u>TREASURER'S REPORTS</u>:

Because of the pandemic situation, 2021's initial budget consisted of January-April. At this time, Gary requested that budget numbers for the next four months, May-August, 2021, be completed by March 15<sup>th</sup>. The new proposed budget will be e-mailed to Council by April 1<sup>st</sup>. Council will have to approve it by April 7<sup>th</sup>. The proposed budget will go to the Congregation for approval at a meeting on April 25<sup>th</sup>.

Jill filed for tax exemption for the Bushnell property. Several meetings have been held regarding what to do with it. At this time, it has been decided that we should not pursue renting the property.

Jim Moore made a presentation on Deaconess Sandra Rhein (see information attached.) Ms. Rhein translates Lutheran hymnals, music, and liturgies into a variety of languages. She is currently serving in Asia. Jim is asking permission to show a video at all three services which will describe her mission. Jeff Bixler moved: MOTION: Council shall approve showing the video from Sandra Rhein at all three services, at a date to be determined in conjunction with the Global Missions Committee, and make available to the Congregation various forms for donations. Gary Eckoff seconded. Motion carried. Gil Dahnke suggested that we make a contribution from the Missions Budget. The

Board of Evangelism will consider and bring back to Council.

#### **BOARD REPORTS:**

Elders: Chuck Wilt reported that they met in January and February and have organized as follows: Chuck will continue as Chair, Bryce Buuck as Secretary, Ron Lilley as Scheduler, Jim Keenan as Usher Relations, Bob Anderson as Traffic Control, and Jim Moore as New Member Orientation. The Lenten Schedule was approved.

**Evangelism:** (copy attached) Jerry Isler reported that they met In November and December 2020. They discussed having a 4<sup>th</sup> of July Celebration at the church, but will have to wait to see what COVID restrictions will be in place this summer.

*Fellowship:* (copy attached) Patti Paxton reported that they would like to have a church picnic on Monday, May 31 – Memorial Day. This event would be held outdoors, with only simple food being served. Details will be discussed at future meetings.

*Trustees*: (copy attached) Jeff Bixler has been named Chair of the Trustees, with Toney Kendrick serving as Co-Chair. Jeff discussed the formation of a "DIY" day every Wednesday at 9:00 AM to address issues that the Trustees can handle within the group. However, we may have to hire a handyman to assist the Trustees with small tasks that cannot be done by current volunteers. All of the chandelier bulbs in the Fellowship Hall have been replaced with LED bulbs, using the lift that was already at the church.

Gary Eckoff reported that there is some miscellaneous income from several Boards (i.e., funds from Fellowship free will offerings). This has been put against certain expenses for those Boards. Going forward, Gary would like to put those funds not being used toward debt retirement. Gary moved: **MOTION:** Council shall allow the Treasurer to use certain miscellaneous income generated from several boards to be handled as debt retirement. Patti Paxton seconded. Discussion was held. Five voted in favor, three against. Motion carried.
