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# Turkish Bazaar Quilt 

Introducing Andover Fabrics new collection: TURKISH BAZAAR by Lori Mason Quilt designed by Tiffany Hayes

## Quilt finishes 64" x 74"

13 Blocks: 9" x 11"
Decorative tile work and exotic woven textiles from this ancient land are honored in this new collection. The rectangular blocks are arranged to form a diamond medallion that draws the viewer's attention to the twin-size quilt.

## Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances. The mitered border includes extra length for insurance. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately $42^{\prime \prime}$ wide).

## Fabric A

Cut (12) rectangles $91 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 11^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}}$

## Fabric B

Cut (5) rectangles $91 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 11 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$

## Fabric C

Fussy-cut (2) side borders $61 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 761^{\prime \prime} 2^{\prime \prime}$, cut crosswise and pieced (read Step 6)
Fussy-cut (2) top/bottom borders $61 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 661 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, cut crosswise and pieced

## Fabric Requirements

Yardage Fabric
Fabric A setting $\quad 13 / 4$ yards $\quad 7796-\mathrm{K}$
Fabric B blocks $\quad 3 / 4$ yard $7797-\mathrm{K}$
Fabric C border $\quad 13 / 4$ yards $\quad 7799-\mathrm{K}$
Fabric D blocks $3 / 4$ yard $7800-\mathrm{K}$
*Fabric E border, blocks $13 / 4$ yards A-T-Magnum Backing $\quad 41 / 4$ yards $\quad 7798-\mathrm{K}$

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2. Make an acrylic pattern of the full-size corner template. Cut off the tips as shown. This will make alignment much easier in Step 3. Draw around the template on Fabric E with a sharp white pencil. Cut 14 triangles from Fabric E; turn the template over and cut 14 reversed triangles from Fabric E.
3. Position a triangle on the cut corner of a rectangle from Step 1, aligning edges. Sew in a scant $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance. Sew triangles to the corners where needed to make the number of blocks shown. The blocks should measure $912^{\prime \prime} \times 11 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$. If they are slightly different, trim all blocks and Fabric A rectangles to the same size.
4. Referring to the Quilt Diagram, arrange the blocks and Fabric A rectangles in 5 rows of 5 blocks each. Stand back to be certain that the blocks are turned in the correct orientation. Once you are satisfied with the design, sew the blocks in rows, and then join the rows.
5. Sew black borders to the sides, and then to the top and bottom.
6. Fussy-cut the Fabric C borders crosswise from the same part of the print. It doesn't matter where you cut as long as all strips are the same. Join strips to
