A LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends:

Last weekend, as many of you have heard, I had a "head-on run-in" with a food allergy. The medication I was given to bring the swelling down left me feeling exhausted. However the allergic reaction itself caused a lot of swelling in my vocal cords and I was without my voice for the weekend. Over the years, on the few occasions in which I've lost my voice, I've always gained some interesting insights!

For about 48 hours speaking was just a little bit painful. For me, it is interesting to spend some time in a world in which every word I say cost me a little. I wonder how different our world would be if we were all sharing in that dynamic (at least for a while). With the advent of social media, there are people who have not had an unpublished thought in years! Anything that crosses our mind gets spoken aloud or typed out to someone. We have developed an incessant need to express every stray thought that wanders through our neural networks.

Sadly, it probably never occurs to us that the more constant our chatter, the less possibility there is that any one thing we say will be received with any true weight. I imagine I am not alone as I look back over my life and see how often my need to participate in a conversation does not necessarily come from a place of having anything to offer on the topic. It would be an interesting exercise for us, not always, but on occasion, to notice and experience what it means to participate through active listening instead of feeling the need to express.

Of course, today is Tuesday, and as expected, my voice has returned. I imagine that the past 48 hours will not, in the long term, radically change the way I interact in the world. But I hope that a small notion might linger and come into focus every once in a while. I am mindful of the words of Mahatma Gandhi, who said, "Speak only if it improves upon the silence." In our own gospel tradition, Jesus' call for an economy of speech is even stronger: "Let your "Yes" be "Yes" and your "No" be "No." Anything else is from the evil one." Matt. 5: 37

I truly believe self-expression is a wonderful thing. But self-expression should also be done mindfully. Otherwise it becomes a constant white noise over which the deeper faith, love, and grace that we might share may not be heard. While it is nice to have my voice back, it is also nice to have encountered, hopefully, a little insight within the silence.


Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Imagining a camel small enough to fit through the eye of a needle can make you stop and rub your eyes and say, "WHAAAT?" This hyperbole for things we could never possibly do was a common example in the world of Jesus, and he certainly meant the image to be taken seriously when he taught about what it takes to enter the kingdom of God.

I have been blessed in my life to be almost constantly in the presence of deeply wise people, people for whom the pursuit of and submission to wisdom has been far more important than any other crown. So when my lifelong friend Mary Frances Jaster answered the phone today I said, without preamble, "Talk to me about the rich young man." Without missing a beat, she referred me to lyrics from a song I didn't know, lyrics that tell of being touched by seeing a man with no clothes, no money, no plate.

There are blessed moments in life that shrink us. Seeing the Afghan refugees arriving with no clothes, no money, no plate is one of them. Standing in a dark field on a dark night and seeing the galaxy twinkling above is another. That same galaxy certainly inspired the psalmist to ask "Who are we, God, that you are mindful of us (8:4)?

There are other moments that shrink us too, like when we realize how wrong we've been, and how much God has forgiven our arrogance. I love finally seeing the world from God's perspective. Like John the Baptist, I want to decrease, so that Jesus in me may increase. Somehow, the more space he takes up, the less space I need.
