From Our Pastor, Fr. Fausto ...

My Dear Friends,

Today's readings are a treasure of teachings about our evil ways and how to cope with and eliminate them. One of our tendencies is to pass the buck, and, in a tight situation, we blame others for our own sin. Think of Adam's answer to God in the first reading, "The woman whom YOU PUT HERE with me, SHE GAVE me the fruit..." So the woman is at fault, and so is God! Once when I was young, an Italian won at "Totocalcio", then he bought a Fiat 1100 and crashed (after a huge dinner, showered with Chianti wine) breaking both legs. He was screaming, "God why did you make me crash?"

A second tendency is to demonize people that do not agree with us; are you following our U.S.A. political fights? "He is possessed by Beelzebul..."

A third tendency, which is innate in our beings, is definitely our preference for our family and relatives, to the point of being blind to other peoples' needs (blood is thicker than water, even holy water). Jesus points out to us the reality of a family which is founded on baptism is greater than any blood tie! If you stop and think a minute, ask yourselves the question, "Who has disappointed or betrayed me the most?" Spouses, children, parents, siblings, blood relatives or acquired relatives usually get the first spot!

A fourth tendency is to become a power of division among our brothers and sisters in Christ, blinded by sheer pride. "A kingdom divided against itself, cannot stand!" Are we not in such peril in this our good ol' U.S.A. "Blessed are the peacemakers," Jesus said. Let us meditate and change our faulty mentality!

Last Sunday I had the great joy to shake hands with our Holy Father Francis, and to concelebrate Mass with him. Please pray for the Pope's good health.

Activities and vacations can make getting to Mass each week seem like a juggling act. Harder still is finding the time to dress properly and prepare as we would like. But approaching all aspects of the Eucharist carefully can deepen our Communion with Christ. What we wear can help.

Make it feel special. If you were invited to a friend's house for an evening wouldn't you wear something nice and appropriate? Sunday Mass is a special time for you and God. Wearing good clothes makes it feel special.

Send a message. Mass is also a communal celebration. When you look nice in church, you send a message to your Catholic brothers and sisters that you value your time together in God's house. Just because it's "in style" doesn't make it "in style" for God.

Use this guideline. When deciding what to wear in Church, think about this: If it's something you would wear to a picnic, to play a sport, or to clean out the garage or the house, don't wear it to church - even when on vacation.

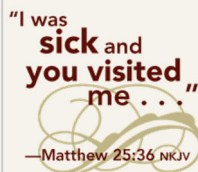

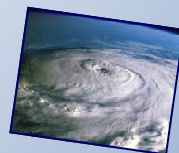
PROMESAS
