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c. In the "FIRST AID" section on page 1 you must also add the "If swallowed" and "If on skin or clothing" subsections, in that order and including all the text for each that is present in the "BOXED FORMAT EXAMPLE" on page 6 of Pesticide Registration Notice 2001-1, after the "If in eyes" subsection. This mandatory because the label of the "me-too" product has (and is required to have) these subsections. A copy of the most recent accepted label for the "me-too" product is attached, for your reference (ie. EPA Reg. Number 100-963).

d. The Signal Word on the label must be changed from "CAUTION" to "WARNING" on both the first page and in the "HAZARDS TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS" section on the second page. This is because the label of the "me-too" product has a Signal Word of "WARNING".

e. To conform to the hazard statements on the label of the "me-too" product the "HAZARDS TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS" section on the second page must be modified to read exactly as follows.

"May be fatal if inhaled. Causes moderate eye irritation. Do not breathe dust or mist. Avoid contact with eyes or clothing."

f. Near the top of page 2 change the title "PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENTS (PPE)" to "PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE)". In the sentence that immediately follows this title change "...other handles must wear:" to "...other handlers must wear:".

g. Near the middle of page 2 change the title "USER SAFETY RECOMMENDATION:" to "USER SAFETY RECOMMENDATIONS:".

h. Near the middle of page 2, in the first bulleted item after the current title "USER SAFETY RECOMMENDATION:" change "...chewing gum, tobacco, or using..." to "...chewing gum, using tobacco, or using...".

i. Near the middle of page 2, change the first sentence in the second bulleted item after the current title "USER SAFETY RECOMMENDATION:" from "User should remove clothing / PPE immediately if pesticides get inside." to "User should remove clothing / PPE immediately if pesticide gets inside."

j. In the "ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARD" section near the bottom of page 3 delete the sentence that reads "Do not apply directly to water." The reason for this is that the labeled use is an indoor use only. Therefore, users should not see a statement on the label implying that outdoor use is acceptable.

k. At the top of page 3, delete the entire section "<u>Fumigating applicators must wear:</u>". These PPE are already on page 2 and apply to mixers, loaders, applicators and other handlers.

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1. In "Application Rate" table make the following math corrections:

Change "3-gram" to "3.55-gram", "900-Kilograms" to "909-Kilograms"; "(135)" to "(158)"; "(675)" to "(797)"; "(1350)" to "(1594)"; "(2025)" to "(2392)"; and "(2700)" to "(3189)".

m. Page 3 at bottom, change "In combination with DECCO NO SCALD DPA AEROSOL" to "In combination with DECCO NO SCALD DPA AEROSOL (EPA Reg. No. 2792-73)".

n. Page 3 at bottom, after "In combination with DECCO NO SCALD DPA AEROSOL", add as the first bullet "Mixers, Loaders, Applicators, and other Handlers must use PPE from the most restrictive product (ie. either Deccozole A, or DECCO NO SCALD DPA AEROSOL).

o. Page 3 at bottom, last bullet change "Add the Deccozole slowly" to "Add the Deccozole A slowly", and change "to the molten DPA" to "to the molten DECCO NO SCALD DPA AEROSOL".

p. Page 4, change "combination with DPA AEROSOL" to "combination with DECCO NO SCALD DPA AEROSOL".

q. The "CONTAINER DISPOSAL:" subsection of the "STORAGE AND DISPOSAL" section at the top of page 5 does not conform to Pesticide Registration Notice 2007-4. By separate amendment or notification, as appropriate, submit a revised label that conforms to this PR Notice.

4. Submit one copy of the revised final printed label with the exact changes herein for the Agency's records before you release the product for shipment.

If these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation, in accordance with FIFRA section 6(e). Your release for shipment of the product constitutes acceptance of these conditions.

Preparation for DECCOZOLE A Treatment

In combination with DECCO NO SCALD DPA AEROSOL

- Following the label direction of DECCO NO SCALD DPA AEROSOL melt the DPA using an appropriate container. Cover and place the container on an electrical heater and melt the DPA at 180°F
- > Calculate the amount of DECCOZOLE A according to the application rate.
- Weigh the amount of DECCOZOLE A to the nearest gram into a clean and dry container.
- > Add the Deccozole slowly and under gentle mixing to the molten DPA

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Thermal Fogger Operation

- Place the thermal fogger machine horizontally outside the treatment room at a height of about 3 feet from the floor. Cover the door or window to the treatment room with a plastic sheet and insert the fogging pipe through a hole in the plastic. Seal the opening around the nozzle with duct tape.
- Adjust the pump and mount the nozzle to deliver up to120 mL per minute.
- Turn on the thermal fogger machine.
- Insert the insulated input pipe into the aerosol mixture. Start the pump. Keep the product temperature at 160-180°F.

Application Procedures

- Do not breathe fog.
- Turn off room cooling systems and humidifiers 12 hours prior to and during treatment.
- Turn off room circulation fans immediately prior to and during treatment.
- Turn on room circulation fans one hour after the treatment. Allow the fog totally to disappear (about 5 hours post-treatment) before restarting cooling systems.
- Fruit must have shipping cartons marked: "Treated with Thiabendazole to retard spoilage." If applied in combination with DPA AEROSOL fruit shipping cartons must be marked: "Treated with Thiabendazole and Diphenylamine to retard spoilage."

Re-Entry

Entry into the treatment area by another person other than properly trained and equipped handlers is prohibited from the start of application until the treated area is ventilated as follows:

- 8 hours with no ventilation followed by 1 hour of mechanical ventilation
- 24 hours with no ventilation

In case it is necessary to enter the treatment area during treatment or before ventilation requirements have been met, handlers must wear chemical resistant headgear and a self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA, MSHA/NIOSHA approval number prefix TC-13F) in addition to PPE listed under the PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage or disposal.

STORAGE: Store in a cool dry place.
