# **News about Alumni Projects**





### Alumni Project: A Bus to Unimaginable Achievement

A team of YES alumni, university students, and instructors visited four schools in Tekirdağ on October 24 and 25 to provide equal educational and training opportunities to socio-economically disadvantaged students. Students took part in different hands-on activities and discovered their potential in STEM fields. The activities included science experiments, mathematics applications, robotics, and verbal skill development workshops. As a result, students broadened their horizons and created a mentor-mentee relationship with the project's volunteers.

As news of their success spread, three more provinces officially invited the project for more outreach in April and May. The alumni team is busy making preparations to continue their success. YES Alumni in Turkey are preparing to conduct small-scaled version of this project in various schools.

### Alumni Project: Safe Internet Strategies for Students in Izmir

A project team consisting of a group of Fulbright Language Teaching Assistant (FLTA) alumni has been implementing the Safe Internet Strategies for Students project to train students, teachers, and parents in preventing cyberbullying and protecting children from online threats. To date, the project has reached 331 students in the seventh grade, 80 teachers, and 80 parents since last September. Trainings for all groups focused on the psychological aspects of cyberbullying, internet addiction, and problematic internet usage.



### Alumni Project: "Artık Top Sende"

Sports Ambassadors of the "Artık Top Sende" project came together in December to review the progress of their work. In this project, YES alumni mentor middle and high school students to come up with and implement their own proposals for future "Artik Top Sende" submissions. ATS aims to create social impact by using sports as a tool.

Jeffrey M. Hovenier began his assignment at the U.S. Embassy in Ankara, Turkey and assumed the duties of Chargé d'Affaires in August 2018. He came to Ankara after serving as Acting Deputy Chief of Mission and

Minister-Counselor for Political Affairs at the U.S. Embassy in Berlin, Germany. A career member of the Senior Foreign Service, he has also served at U.S. missions in Croatia, Greece, Panama, Paraguay, and Peru; at the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe (OSCE); and on the staff of the UN Special Envoy for Kosovo Status.

His Washington assignments include service as Director for Central and Southeastern European Affairs at the National Security Council, and in the State Department's European Bureau with responsibility for NATO and Central European Affairs.

Mr. Hovenier is a multiple recipient of State Department performance awards and holds government honors from the Republic of Kosovo. He grew up in Bellingham, Washington and holds a Master's degree from Georgetown University and a Bachelor's degree from Brigham Young University. He speaks German and Spanish and has studied Greek and Croatian. He is married to Laura Williams Hovenier. They have four adult children.
