

From the Pastor, to my partners, ...

We asked you to tell us what you think, and you did! A combined team from our Evangelism and Stewardship committees has met several times to review all the surveys that we received from our congregation. We asked first, "what do we hear?" Then we thought, "what are the main themes?" We can summarize our findings in four areas of concern.

We have adopted the theme "Growing Disciples, Deeper and Wider." Through all the input, we heard strongly that we see ourselves as loving, giving, caring people who:

- seek to grow deeper and wider;
- seek to interact and participate with others;
- seek to be nurtured and revitalized;
- seek to serve visibly in our community.

One set of verbs (action words!) listed on one survey summed up our group's feelings as well: "pray, learn, grow, dare, and laugh!"



We have just begun to ask, "what can we do now?" We spent one evening on just one of the concerns above and came up with three pages of newsprint, filled with practical action steps. We'll focus these thoughts into plans, mapped out with resources and time lines, and continue the process with each of the four areas.

The group has found excitement and energy, and has added members along the way, de-

spite the large amount of thoughts and feelings that we have dealt with. We meet again on Wednesday, November 3rd, at 7:00 p.m. in the church parlor. You're invited to join us!

We have also asked people throughout our community to offer their thoughts and visions about issues that we might address through our congregation's ministries, with some very interesting and varied responses. We'll add these surveys to our planning process, especially when we look at ways that reach out beyond our four walls.

We pray for God's inspiration in all this work, so that whatever the end product, we can say that we seek only to serve God, one another, and our world with the compassion and love we have experienced through our Lord and savior, Jesus Christ.



Founded in 1991, the Augustinian Lutheran Church of Guatemala (Iglesia Luterana Agustina de Guatemala -ILAG) is the youngest of the Lutheran churches in Central America. Since its inception, the ILAG has accompanied marginal communities on the periphery of Guatemala City and rural villages of indigenous peasants, many of whom lived as refugees in Mexico during the country's long civil war and returned to Guatemala after the signing of the 1996 peace accords.

The ILAG now has close to 2,000 members organized in 18 congregations and missions. Its committed team of pastors, teachers and evangelists work holistically to offer spiritual sustenance to people living in poverty and to improve overall living conditions in poor communities. Church programs include securing land titles for the landless, educating poor children (at two elementary schools in Guatemala City), enabling youth and adults to pursue secondary/higher education, community-based development projects and help for communities affected by natural disasters.

After the Haiti Earthquake -- Walking with Rural Communities

Cantave Jean-Baptiste remembers *exactly* where he was on January 12, when a massive earthquake struck his native Haiti. "I was in my car, on my way home. My wife and three children were in Montreal, Canada, but there were four other people living in my home at that time," he recalls.

Recently Cantave, Director of Partnership for Local Development (PLD), a Lutheran World Relief partner organization in Haiti, made it back to his house the day of the earthquake and found it heavily damaged by the 7.0 magnitude quake. He spent the next few nights as many other Haitians did: under the open sky until he procured first a plastic sheet, then a tent, to sleep under. "In some ways, I can say I know what it is to live in a tent," he says. "But it is very different from living in the camps."

Cantave headed to the countryside to see how rural communities were coping. "Most of the people living in Port-au-Prince are from the countryside," he explains. Many people chose to return to rural areas following the quake. He encountered many households, like that of Pierre Gilles Velienne, in desperate need of help. "My family hosted six earthquake survivors from Port-au-Prince," Pierre explained. She and her family were more than willing to help, but they were already struggling and the addition of more people put even further strain on their resources.



Through the LWR/PLD partnership, members of Pierre's household participated in a cash-for-work program where they earned money to help them survive while also repairing the future food supply through soil conservation work. This program gave displaced people a way to help their host families, while also providing funds to return to Port-au-Prince to begin rebuilding their own lives.

"Five of the six have returned to Port-au-Prince," says Pierre.

Right after the earthquake, many rural people exhausted their seed supplies to help feed the displaced. LWR and PLD helped replenish seed banks so people could grow a variety of food to eat and sell, such as beans, peanuts, corn and sweet potatoes.

Project participants Yolette Jean, Desilia Rene, Estany Bernard, Suza Aristide, Bluette St. Fleur and Pierre Gilles Velienne. All have hosted many displaced earthquake survivors in their homes and have benefited from LWR's cash-for-work program to help them support their families. While these projects are helping families cope and begin to move forward, Cantave says more help is needed to sustain the positive impact. That's why he came to the U.S. to urge the government to include rural communities in long-term reconstruction plans. "Lack of basic services, like education and health care, caused people to leave the countryside and go to the city. We need to improve conditions in rural areas to make it possible for people to really live there."

Families participating in the project are glad to have the opportunity to grow food and earn income. But more than that, they are happy to be active participants in their own recovery. "Other organizations are just giving things away, but PLD works with farmers and lets them participate," says Novert Bernadette, an LWR/PLD project participant.

Overall, Cantave stresses, the support of the people in the U.S., and particularly that of LWR supporters, is making a difference in Haiti. "I would like to tell the Lutheran World Relief donors that LWR is doing a good job in Haiti. I encourage them to continue to support LWR as they continue to impact lives," he says.

Spiritual Growth - What is it? Spiritual growth is detailed in 2 Peter 1:5-8:

"...make every effort to add to your faith goodness; and to goodness, knowledge; and to knowledge, self-control; and to self-control, perseverance; and to perseverance, godliness; and to godliness, brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness, love. For if you possess these qualities in increasing measure, they will keep you from being ineffective and unproductive in your knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ."

Four simple, but essential steps for spiritual growth:

Step 1 – Read your Bible daily. Find a Bible reading plan that's right for you. A plan will keep you from missing anything God has written. Furthermore, if you follow the plan, you'll be on your way to reading through the Bible once every year! The easiest way to truly grow in the faith is to make Bible reading a priority.

Step 2 – Attend church services regularly. The Bible encourages us to meet together regularly with other believers: "Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another..." Hebrews 10:25. This is also fundamental to spiritual growth. If you're having trouble finding a church, check out these resources on how to find a church that's right for you. How else will we grow spiritually unless we interact with other believers? We learn humility, gentleness and patience, developing the character of Christ as we relate within the body of Christ.

Step 3 – Get involved in a ministry group. Most churches offer small groups and ministry opportunities. A weekly Bible study group is a good place to begin. Pray and ask God where you should "plug in." Those who "get plugged in" find their purpose and soar in their walk with Christ. Sometimes this takes a little time, but most churches will help you find the place that's right for you. Don't get discouraged if the first thing you try doesn't seem to fit.

Step 4 – Pray daily. Prayer is simply talking to God. You don't have to use big fancy words. There are no right and wrong words. Just be yourself. Pray for others in need. Pray for direction. Pray for the Lord to fill you daily with the Holy Spirit. You can pray with your eyes closed or open, while sitting or standing, kneeling or lying on your bed, anywhere, anytime.

Other helpful Bible passages:

Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. Ephesians 4:2

Each one should use whatever gift he has received to serve others, faithfully administering God's grace in its various forms. 1 Peter 4:10

Therefore encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing. 1 Thessalonians 5:11
