# Ms. Shirley Ison-Newsome Steps Down

Dallas ISD Superintendent Miles has announced that Ms. Shirley Ison-Newsome has resigned as of Tuesday, October 30, 2012, but will be paid through August 31, 2013 in a settlement agreement.

Ms. Ison-Newsome has worked for the district for 37 years, starting on Sept. 2, 1975. The Dallas community praises Ms. Ison-Newsome for her dynamic, straightforwardness and devotion to the elevation of youth.

Tuesday afternoon, Ms. Ison-Newsome sent an e-mail to her staff, with a CC to Miles and others, with her final newsletter attached. In a section, titled "Deliberations From Former Division 4 Assistant Superintendent," she begins...

"This is a bittersweet day for me - more sweet than bitter - as I leave the place where I have labored for 37 years."

She goes on to say...

"While I recognize the timing of my departure is not ideal, it is time to depart. Friends who have retired previously have said to me, you will know when it is time, and thus I know it is time. I feel comfortable in leaving, as I know I am leaving the schools in Division 4 in excellent hands."

Dr. Alfred L. Roberts, Sr., retired DISD Educator and former President, National Alliance of Black School Educators, submitted the following:

Ms. Shirley Ison-Newsome came to Dallas as part of the Team assembled by Dr. Francis Chase, Consultant, DISD. She and Dr. Jerry Cummings, Dean, Education Department, Texas Southern University, Houston, Texas, were valuable members of Dr. Chase's team. Ms. Newsome and

Dr. Cummings became part of the DISD staff. Ms. Ison-Newsome was part of the East oak Cliff Sub-district. In her leadership role for schools in Area II and other schools, she has provided excellent instructional leadership and been a champion for the effective education of students, especially students of African descent. A large number of schools under Ms. Ison-Newsome's supervision received, annually, exemplary or recognized status from the Texas Education Agency. Principals and others received the professional development and leadership skills to insure that students achieved academically and acquired the social skills to be successful.

### NEWS YOU OUGHT TO KNOW

(AP) - The Rev. Danny Kirk Sr. was killed Monday, October 29, 2012, after a man drove his car into the church and then attacked the pastor with an electric guitar. Members of Kirk's Greater Sweethome Missionary Baptist Church have been left stunned by the entire ordeal.

According to Police Chief Dan Dennis, the assailant drove his car into a church wall, then began attacking Rev. Kirk in the church parking lot before following him inside. The church secretary called 911, but by the time authorities arrived, Kirk was dead, and they had to use a Taser gun in order to subdue the assailant.

The suspect later died at a hospital, leaving many more questions than answers in this case. Chief Dennis said that an autopsy would be performed in order to determine an exact cause of death and to see if drugs may have played a role in the attack.

The Rev. Kirk founded the Greater Sweethome Missionary Baptist Church in 1995 in a strip mall before building the church now used. Members have gathered to mourn the loss of their pastor as well as a friend and confidant. There's no word yet on when services will be held to honor Kirk.



On Saturday, October 27, 2012, Texas A&M University-Commerce held their annual Hall of Fame Ceremony, at the Sam Rayburn Student Center in Commerce, Texas. Those inducted were: former professional athlete Mr. Curtis Buckley; Olympian and human rights activist, Mr. John Carlos; former East Texas State/A&M - Commerce head basketball coach/administrator, Mr. Paul Peak; avid supporter, Mr. Robert Peek; and former volleyball and tennis coach, Mrs. Donna Tavener.

Mr. Curtis Buckley was a two-year letterwinner for East Texas State at defensive back, earning first team All-Lone Star Conference honors in 1991 and 1992. He led the Lions in tackles both seasons, notching 111 as a junior and 133 as a senior with five sacks during his career while helping East Texas State to the nation's second-ranked defense in 1992.

Buckley was a five-time LSC Defensive Player of the Week and was recognized as a two-time Don Hansen's Football Gazette All-American, named an honorable mention as a junior before being honored as a second team selection as a senior. Buckley went on to play seven years in the National Football League, suiting up for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, San Francisco 49ers, New York Giants and Washington

Redskins, being named a four-time honorable mention All-Madden Team selection.

Mr. John Carlos (Track and Field, 1967)- Carlos spent just one season at East Texas State, but made his presence felt immediately. He set five school records during the 1967 season, including the Lone Star Conference record for the 200 yard dash with a 20.4 mark. Carlos was a two-time conference champion, winning the 100 and 220 yard dashes at the LSC meet and was a member of the first-place 4x100 and 4x400 meter relay teams, helping the Lions to the 1967 Lone Star Conference title. After leaving East Texas State, Carlos gained worldwide fame by winning the bronze medal in the 200 meter dash at the 1968 Olympics, where his silent protest with gold medalist Tommie Smith on the medal stand has become one of the most iconic moments in Olympic history. Carlos remains an active voice for human rights across the world appearing as a popular motivational speaker.

Mr. Paul Peak (Basketball Coach/Administrator, 1991-2004) - Peak spent nine seasons as the head coach of the East Texas State/A&M-Commerce men's basketball team from 1991 to 2000, compiling an overall record of 134-118. His 134 career wins is tied for fourth all-time in program history while his .532 winning percentage sits in sole

possession of fourth all-time. Peak led the Lions to a share of the 1995-96 regular season Lone Star Conference title as A&M-Commerce advanced to the NCAA tournament three-consecutive seasons in 1996, 1997 and 1998, advancing to the NCAA Division II Elite Eight in 1997. Under Peak's tutelage, 17 players were named All-Lone Star Conference honorees, including a pair of LSC Most Valuable Players in Jason Hall (1996) and Darrell Waters (1998), who was also a third team All-American. Following his coaching days, Peak spent four years as the Lions Athletic Director.

Mr. Robert Peek (Meritorious Service)- Peek was a four year letterwinner on the East Texas State tennis team from 1959-63, helping the Lions to a pair of NAIA appearances and was a national semifinalist in doubles with Lion Hall of Famer Jerry Hirst. Following his graduation, Peek remained an avid supporter of the University by donating both his time and money to help improve the Lion athletic program. He served as a member of the Hall of Fame and Bobby Fox Alumni Coaching Award selection committees and was a member of the Athletic Association Board for over 20 years. He and his wife Janet contributed financially for years to the basketball and football programs and is a member of the Founders Circle and 1990 Society. Peek

also sponsored radio advertising for Lion athletics and assisted countless student-athletes through his actions up until his death in 2009.

Mrs. Donna Tavener (Volleyball and Tennis Coach, 1977-83) - Tavener established herself as one of the pioneers in women's athletics at East Texas State, serving as the Lions' head volleyball and women's tennis coach from 1977-83. Serving as one of the volleyball program's first coaches, Tavener compiled a 109-90 record, as her 109 victories and .548 winning percentage both rank third in program history. Tavener's teams won 20 or more matches in four of her five seasons, including winning 30 matches in 1982, which is tied for the third-most wins in a single season. On the tennis courts, Tavener's teams won a handful of AIAW Division II regional and national tournaments, including finishing second in the region in 1979. She coached a handful of top players, including 2011 Hall of Fame inductee Patti Bean, who spearheaded Tavener's 1979 team to become the first ETSU women's team to qualify for a national tournament. Tavener spent 20 years teaching high school students in Greenville and Commerce before returning to A&M-Commerce as the Director of Education Preparation in 2002, serving as a member of the Hall of Fame committee.

Dallas Independent School District Superintendent Mike Miles had a special visitor Monday, October 29, 2012, on his regular instructional tours of Dallas ISD schools: Texas Education Commissioner Michael Williams. Miles invited the newly-appointed commissioner to tour three Dallas ISD schools: Roosevelt High School, W.E. Greiner Exploratory Arts Academy, and Felix Botello Elementary. Both the Commissioner and Miles wanted to avoid a rehearsed visit that turns into a media event so the visits were unannounced. Several classrooms were visited and both the commissioner and superintendent had several opportunities to both observe and speak with students, teachers, and principals.

"I appreciate the challenges that Dallas ISD teachers and principals face," said Williams. "I also appreciate the sense of urgency that I was able to observe taking place in the three schools. There is a lot of hard work taking place in Dallas ISD schools." Instructional visits are a regular part of Miles' weekly schedule as he assesses the challenges schools face and the progress being made under the Destination 2020 initiatives. So far, the superintendent has been in 63 schools and is on track to visit all 223 schools by the end of the school year. During some of those visits, he has taken other community and education leaders for an up close look at the improvements and transformation taking place in Dallas ISD classrooms.

## "A SURVEY OF THE BOOK OF PSALMS"

### "The Psalmist's Source of Comfort" Psalm 27:1-14

In this instructive psalm, David is expressing his extreme confidence in the Lord despite his life being in peril as a result of threats from his enemies. David informs us in verses 1-3, that firm confidence in the Lord will drive out any fear one has even when one is viciously attacked by enemies - "The LORD is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? the LORD is the strength of my life; of whom shall I be afraid?" (v. 1). David placed his sole confidence and trust in God's provisions. Equipped with God's provision of Him being

one's light, salvation and strength - why should anyone fear? When one truly trusts God and the provisions of His care, again why should anyone fear? Knowing that the Lord is our light, salvation and strength, serves as a great source of comfort when one is experiencing troubles. Having expressed his confidence in the only One who supplies comfort, David longs to dwell in the Lord's house all his life - "One thing have I desired of the LORD, that will I seek after; that I may dwell in the house of the LORD all the days of my life, to behold the beauty of the LORD, and to enquire in his temple" (v. 4). David knew that dwelling in the Lord's presence is safety indeed and that in His

tabernacle He shall hide him (vs. 5-6). Praying earnestly for protection, David asked the Lord to help him in his time of anxiety (vs. 7-10). He did not want God to forsake him in time of his need - "When my father and my mother forsake me, then the LORD will take me up" (v. 10). Our God will never forsake us, even in time of danger. In our anxious moments in life, we need to recognize that God is right there with us; there to comfort us in our time of need - "So that we may boldly say, The Lord is my helper, and I will not fear what man shall do unto me" (Hebrews 13:6). Since David was aware that his enemies were waiting to harm him, David asked God to instruct him in the way

to go - "Teach me thy way, O LORD, and lead me in a plain path, because of mine enemies" (v. 11). This instruction psalm ends in verses 13-14 with David gaining assurance that the Lord would safeguard him as he waits on the Lord - "Wait on the LORD: be of good courage, and he shall strengthen thine heart: wait, I say, on the LORD" (v. 13). The psalmist testifies that even in the midst of extreme danger the Lord will come to our rescue, and we need not fear, for the song writer said - "Be not dismayed what-e'er betide, God will take care of you; Beneath His wings of love abide, God will take care of you." May God Bless!

## SIX ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING STATIONS BEING INSTALLED ACROSS UNT CAMPUS

The University of North Texas campus will soon receive six electronic vehicle, or EV, charging stations. Construction is underway for the six stations, which will be in three different locations: the Wooten Hall parking lot, the parking lot for the Radio, Television, Film and Performing Arts Building, and the parking lot for the Environmental Education, Science and Technology Building. All six stations should be installed and operational by the end of the 2012 fall semester, according to staff members at the UNT Office of Sustainability. The idea for the stations was proposed and submitted to the We Mean Green Fund by

UNT student Matthew McCallum and staff member Brad Holt, a senior videographer in the Division of University Relations, Communications and Marketing. "I'd been planning to buy an EV as my next car for a while, but I was waiting for the technology and infrastructure to grow a bit more," Holt said "I was curious if there were any plans in the works to install EV charging stations around campus. I learned that the idea had been tossed around, but no real plans were in the works. It was then that someone told me about the We Mean Green Fund." A project summary by the UNT Office of Sustainability, released

in April of this year, states that the objective of the project is to promote research and affect behavior change. Researchers will take the information from the current EV market and the infrastructure supporting the electric vehicles to identify models to improve the viability of electric vehicle purchase and use. The installation of EV charging stations at UNT helps fulfill the mission of the WMGF, "reducing the amount waste created on campus and encouraging sustainable behaviors" by encouraging the use of electric vehicles, and further positions UNT as a leader in sustainability. Holt said that supporting EVs by installing charging stations fits in

well with UNT's green efforts. During the past year, wind turbines have been installed at Apogee Stadium as a power source. In addition, UNT is home to several LEED-certified buildings. ECotality, the EV station manufacturer, will provide partial funding through a Department of Energy grant. The We Mean Green Fund also approved additional funding for the station's infrastructure of power lines and fiber optic cables. Information on EV charging costs can be found online. More information about the EV charging stations being installed can be found online.





ataque.  
El reverendo Kirk fundó la Gran Sweethome Missionary Baptist Church en 1995 en un centro comercial antes de la construcción de la iglesia ahora se utilizan. Los miembros se han reunido para llorar la pérdida de su pastor, así como un amigo y confidente. No hay palabra todavía sobre si los servicios se llevará a cabo en honor a Kirk.


