Admissions Requirements

International Undergraduate Requirements*

- A completed application (Common App or Coalition application)
- Official translated transcripts (when required)
- Official SAT (Code: 3918) or ACT (Code: 25240) – highest scores considered**
- Official TOEFL (IBT: 80+) or IELTS (6.5+)
- Letter of recommendation
- Application fee (\$65)

Auditions, portfolio submission and interviews may be required or requested for some majors within fine arts and performing arts.

International Graduate Requirements***

- Pre-application (strongly encouraged)
- A completed online application
- Official translated undergraduate/graduate transcripts
- Official standardized test scores
- Official TOEFL (IBT: 80+) or IELTS (6.5+)
- Recommendation letters
- Application fee (\$45)

UNH ESL Bridge and Pathway Programs

For international students interested in full admission to some University of New Hampshire (UNH) degree programs, who have not met UNH minimum English proficiency requirements, the UNH English as a Second Language (ESL) Program and Global Student Success Program offers a wide array of intensive English language courses at various levels of English instruction. Undergraduate students who do successfully gain admittance to the University of New Hampshire, can apply up to 16 credit hours from their work in the ESL Institute as University of New Hampshire credit.
