


NEWSFLASH: AMAZING WOMEN







The Spirit of Pentecost



Soon we will be celebrating Pentecost. Pentecost is one of the most important days in the story of the church. You can read about it in the second chapter of the book of Acts. Historically, Pentecost was a major Jewish holy day, the roots of which are described in the Old Testament. Jews from all over the world made a pilgrimage to Jerusalem at Pentecost.



In the New Testament version, the Pentecost story takes place 50 days after the resurrection of Jesus, and comes from the Greek word *pentekostos*, meaning fiftieth. The story is exciting . . . confusing . . . and miraculous all at the same time! It is sometimes referred to as "The Birthday of the Church," because the church in the modern Christian era began after the disciples and followers of Jesus received the power of the Holy Spirit on that first Pentecost.

According to Acts, "the disciples were gathered together in one place when the Spirit descended upon them like flames of fire." (Acts 2:1-3) Each one was empowered to speak and act in ways they could not have done on their own. Even the once cowardly Peter was able to preach with courage and conviction after he was filled with the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit that anointed the disciples now anoints you and me. We can embrace the same sense of adventure and faithfulness as the early disciples. How will we be different as a result of God's Holy Spirit poured out at Pentecost? I have been reading some books lately on Celtic Christianity. I feel a kindred spirit with my Irish ancestors. Part of what I have learned is that the Holy Spirit is pervasive in our lives and in the world. I connect most deeply with God's Spirit when I take walks in the woods and pray outside amidst the beauty of God's creation.

I feel the power, majesty and beauty of all that surrounds us. Sometimes God speaks to me in the whispering wind or the setting sun. Once I saw a cloud formation in the shape of a cross. The trees bend and bow down as if to worship their creator. The Holy Spirit embraces me and whispers, "You are my beloved."

The season of Pentecost reminds us in new and fresh ways that God wants us to be open to both His inspiration and revelation. Just before Jesus ascended to be with the Father, he said, "I have told you this while I'm still with you. However, the helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything. He will remind you of everything that I have ever told you." (John 14:25-26).

Today would be a good day to remember that promise of God's power acting in our lives. It is no longer us, but the Holy Spirit that guides and directs us. It is both a joy and a responsibility to receive His gift and live with mindfulness of His constant presence in our lives. I hope this season of Pentecost will be that for you and much more.
