

UNC GREEK LIFE SYSTEM

Apply.

The Office of Admissions reviews applications on a rolling basis, which means you will receive an admission decision two to three weeks after submitting your application and all supporting documents.

FIRST-YEAR STUDENTS

Apply early — application opens August 1. GOBEARS.UNCO.EDU

YOU'LL NEED TO SUBMIT:

- 1 Application, available online at GOBEARS.UNCO.EDU.
- **2** \$45 non-refundable processing fee, payable online by credit card.
- 3 Official high school transcript, sent directly from your high school to the Office of Admissions.
- 4 Your official ACT or SAT scores UNC will accept scores from high school transcripts or you can request them at ACT.ORG with ACT code 0502 or COLLEGEBOARD.ORG with SAT code 4074.

TRANSFER STUDENTS:

You're considered a transfer student if you have attended a post-secondary institution after graduating from high school. You're a strong candidate for admission as a transfer student if you have:

- 30 or more transferable credits
- 2.4 cumulative GPA from all schools attended

To graduate with a bachelor's degree from UNC, which requires 120 semester credit hours, you must complete a minimum of 30 credit hours through UNC.


YOU'LL NEED TO SUBMIT:

- 1 Application, available online at GOBEARS.UNCO.EDU.
- 2 \$45 non-refundable processing fee, payable online by credit card.
- 3 Submit all official college transcripts from all institutions attended.
- 4 If you are transferring fewer than 30 credit hours you are required to submit your official high school transcript and ACT/SAT scores, sent directly from your high school to the Office of Admissions.

ADMISSION

The primary factor in admissions decisions is the curriculum and grades earned in high school, considering your cumulative high school GPA and your best combination of ACT and/or SAT test scores, UNC will accept current and redesigned SAT scores for the purpose of admission and scholarships. Applicants may submit scores from either the current or the redesigned SAT, which is being offered in Spring 2016.
